TENDERS REQUIRED FOR THE SUPPLY OF FIREWOOD AND CHARCOAL TO THE GOVERN- MENT OFFICES AT MELBOURNE.

THE present contractor for furnishing firewood and charcoal for the establishments of the Colonial Government in Melbourne, Port Phillip, having according to agreement, giving one month's notice, that his contract will cease on the 30th June, 1847. Notice is hereby given, that tenders will be received at this Office until twelve o'clock (noon,) of Thursday the 17th day of June next, for furnishing the required supplies for the period from the 1st July to the 31st December, both days inclusive—under the following conditions:—

1st. The wood is to be supplied by the contractor, without delay, in such quantities as may be required from time to time, and to be delivered by him, and stacked ready for measurement in such places as will be pointed out, at the Office or Establishment for which the supply is required.

2nd. The wood is to be delivered in billets, not to exceed two feet six inches in length, each supply to be in equal proportions, if green and dry wood, and not to exceed two loads measurement.

3rd. Either party may limit the duration of the Contract, by giving the opposite party two calendar months notice, in writing, of such intention.

4th. The tender to state the price per load of stacked wood of forty-eight feet, cube measurement. Also the price of charcoal at per imperial bushel.

The Contractor will have to prepare his own account quarterly, on the prescribed forms.

A security of Fifty pounds sterling, will be required for the due fulfilment of the contract, and no Tender will be attended to, unless accompanied by a cer-

tificate from the party or parties proposed as security, stating that they are willing to be bound as securities for the Contractor.

The tender to contain the names of the tenderers, and their sureties and places of residence.

The tenders to be deposited in the box at the west entrance of the Government Offices, sealed and endorsed "Tenders for supply of Firewood, &c."

NOTICE is hereby given, that in pursuance of the Act of the Governor and Council, 10th Victoria, No. 10—A Court of Petty Sessions, for the recovery of small debts, will be holden at the Police office, Belfast, on the first Saturday of each and every month, except when the same may fall on Christmas-day; then to be held on Saturday next following.

In each and every case when the defendant shall reside in the town of Belfast, or within 25 miles thereof, the plaint shall be filed at least 5 clear days, and the summons shall be served at least 3 days prior to the day named in the summons for the hearing of such case, and in each and every case, where the defendant shall reside at a greater distance than 25 miles, the plaint shall be filed at least seven days, and the summons shall be served at least five days prior to the day of hearing named in the summons.

In all cases the plea of defence or set-off, shall be filed at least one day prior to the setting of the Court.

Where it becomes necessary under this Act to tender to persons subpoenaed, a reasonable amount of expenses, six pence a mile shall be considered in all cases, for each mile from the residence of the person subpoenaed to the Court, and not to include the return distance, to be a good and sufficient tender; all other allowances for witnesses to be decided according to circumstances by the Bench of Magistrates or Magistrate, acting singly at the hearing of the case.
