ACT OF COUNCIL.

IS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, has intimated in his Despatch, under date the 8th September last, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to approve and confirm the undermentioned Act, passed by the Governor and Legislative Council, in the ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, viz.:—

No. 13.—An Act to amend an Act, intituled, 'An Act for the better preservation of the Ports, Harbours, Havens, Roadsteds, Channels, Navigable Creeks, and Rivers, in New South Wales, and the better Regulation of Shipping in the same." (27th October. 1845)
