No. 13.—*An Act to amend an Act, intituled, 'An Act for the better preservation of the Ports, Harbours, Havens, Roadsteads, Channels, Navigable Creeks, and Rivers, in New South Wales, and the better Regulation of Shipping in the same.'*"
