WHEREAS the Legislative Council of New South Wales now stands prorogued to the eighth day of February next: Now I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the twenty-first day of March next; and I do hereby further announce and proclaim, that the said Council shall assemble for the despatch of business on the aforesaid twenty-first day of March next, at Twelve o'clock at noon, in the Council Chamber, situate in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney, and the Members of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

VACCINATION.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has directed the republication of the Notice of 11th January, 1847, with the view of again drawing the attention of parents and guardians to the importance of Vaccination.

VACCINATION.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that a Vaccine Institution has been established in Sydney, and that Dr. Savage, the Health Officer, has been appointed to carry out the objects of the Institution.

His Excellency further directs it to be notified, that Dr. Savage will be in attendance at the Immigration Barracks, Bent-street, between the hours of 10 and 12 o'clock on every Tuesday and Saturday to Vaccinate, free of charge, such children as may be taken to him for the purpose. But as the operation itself, without any proof of its having taken effect, would be insufficient security to the public mind, His Excellency has been pleased to direct, that the sum of one shilling shall be deposited for every child vaccinated, which sum will be returned on the presentation of the child on the next vaccination day.

His Excellency very strongly recommends parents and guardians to avail themselves of the means thus afforded to them of taking this necessary and proper precaution with respect to all children not already vaccinated.

In order that a constant supply may be kept up throughout the Colony, the Health Officer will furnish lymph to any Medical Practitioners in the Country Districts who may apply for the same.

All communications with that Officer on the subject of Vaccination, sent through the Post Office, must be enclosed under cover to the Colonial Secretary, with the word "Vaccination" on the lower left hand corner of the envelope.

**FIVE POUNDS REWARD, OR A
CONDITIONAL PARDON.**

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the night of the 7th instant a valuable horse, the property of Mr. L. Nesbitt, was removed from a paddock in Victoria-street, Woolloomooloo, and subsequently found dead at Waverly, with his legs tied and throat cut, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that a reward of five pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may within six months from this date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the guilty party; and if the person giving such information be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon, (available everywhere except in the country in which the prisoner was originally convicted,) to such prisoner of the Crown.
