## CLAIMS TO LEASES OF CROWN LANDS,

BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

### WELLINGTON DISTRICT.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, for the information of all persons interested, that in pursuance of Her Majesty's Order in Council, of 9th March, 1847, the under-mentioned persons have demanded Leases of the several Runs of Crown Land, particularised in connexion with their respective names.

Persons who object to any of these claims, either wholly or in part, should lodge caveats at this Office within two months from the present date, specifying the Lands to which their objections extend, and the grounds on which their objections are based.

It is to be distinctly understood, that the Government does not pledge itself to the issue of a Lease in any case until due enquiry has been made into the validity of the claim, and whether or not it may be necessary to reserve any portion of the Land claimed, for any of the public purposes contemplated in the Order in Council.

### No. 1.

Arkell Thomas.  
Name of Run—Drowbalgie.  
Estimated Area—25,000 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,200 Cattle.

Bounded on the south by the Lachlan River, having 8 miles frontage in a direct line to that river, commencing at a lagoon 1 mile east from the stockyard, and extending to an old hut and yard, formerly a dairy station of Mr. G. Ranken's, computed at 7 miles west from the above-named stockyard of Drowbalgie, bounded on the east by a line running north from the beforementioned lagoon; on the north, boundary not defined; and on the west by a line running north from Mr. Ranken's old station.

### No. 2.

Alexander S. and J.  
Name of Run—Molong Nyrang.  
Estimated Area—5,760 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,400 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by the Molong Creek, 3 miles frontage; on the west running in a line from a tree marked P on the said creek to the nearest point on the crest of the adjacent ridge, thence along the crest of that ridge to a road over it leading to Warraguari, and by that road to a tree marked P, which is the boundary between Alexander and Boulton.

## No. 3.

Atkins Heyward.

Name of Run—Nanima.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Commencing at the south-east corner of Mr. Rodd's station of Trejarre, and running in an easterly direction for 3 miles along the north side of the Lachlan River, bounded on the south by the Lachlan River aforesaid; on the east commencing at the west corner of Michael Walsh's run at that part where the mountain range and creek meet the Lachlan River) by a north-easterly line to the Narang Creek; on the north by the Narang Creek to where it meets the main road, thence by a line to the Gum Creek and along that creek to its source; and on the west by mountain ranges. Estimated extent 25 square miles, the frontage on the river containing only 3 miles, the quantity is made up by back run.

## No. 4.

Barton and Darvall.

Name of Run—Boree Nyrang.

Estimated Area—60,000 acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—800 Cattle, 11,500 Sheep.

Commencing on the Oakey Creek, half-way between Barton and Darvall's Malachis Hill station and Lawson's Head station, at Davy's Plains, thence following a line east  $\frac{1}{2}$  south to the boundary line of location, then from the commencing point by a line north-west to a point half-way between Hood's Boree Creek and Oakey Creek, thence by a line north-east to a point half-way between Hood's Boree Cabawn and Lagoon stations and Barton and Darvall's Malachi Hill and Oakey creek stations, thence by a line nearly south-east to a point half-way between Barton and Darvall's Gap station and Hood's Oakey Creek station, thence by a line north north-east to a point half-way between Barton and Darvall's Sisters' station and Hood's Oakey Creek station, thence by a line nearly north to a point half-way between Barton and Darvall's Sister station and Hood's Mousehole Hill station, thence by a line to a point where the Canobolas and Bora Roads meet a line nearly east from a point on the Boree Creek, half-way between Boree Cabawn and Boree Nyrang, from that point by a line about west north-west to the Head of Sandy Creek, thence by a line nearly north to ridge dividing Boree Nyrang from Brymedura, thence following that boundary to a point where the Brymedura boundary is met by a line nearly west from a point half-way between Ryan's Flat station and Boree Nyrang, thence by a line about east south-east to a point half-way between Barton and Darvall's Spring station and Smith's Reeds station, thence by a line about south south-east to a conical hill on north side of Boree Creek above Barton's Swamp station, thence by the Boree Creek to its Head, and thence by a line nearly east to the boundary of the limits of location, Barton and Darvall's Tucker Alley station commencing on the Boree Creek at a point half-way between Tucker Alley and Toogong, thence by a line nearly south to meet the Togong and Bellabula Road, thence by a line east  $2\frac{1}{4}$  miles, thence by a line nearly north to a point on the Bowen Creek, half-way

between Lawson's Bowen station and Tucker Alley, thence crossing the creek by a line north half east to the Boree Creek to the waterhole close to Busby and Miller's station on that creek, thence by the Boree Creek downwards to where the Bowen Creek joins it.

## No. 5.

Betts and Panton, per John Panton.

Name of Run—Goimbla.

Estimated Area—20 Square Miles.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2,400 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by Meadgery Creek, joining Mr. Sreet's or Miller's station at Long's corner on the east; Pye's station on the west; and ours on the south.

## No. 6.

Boulton Brothers.

Name of Run—Cardington.

Estimated Area—22,400 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Commencing at the junction of the Two Mile Creek with the Bell River, and bounded by that river upwards to a point where the point of a main ridge closes in on the river, thence by a line crossing the road at a point half-way between the stations of Thurangall and Reedy Creek to a point half-way between Thurangall and Gagundry stations, thence by a line to the southern point of Cotumble Mountains, thence by the Cotumble Mountains to a point 2 miles below an old sheep station, thence by a line to the crest of the Baker's Swamp Hill, thence by the Old Wellington Road to where it crosses the Two Mile Creek, and thence by that creek to its junction with the Bell River.

## No. 7.

Boulton Brothers.

Name of Run—Billabong.

Estimated Area—190,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—7,500 Sheep.

Commencing at the point of the ridge where two creeks join, half-way between Boulton's station at Lambert's Springs, and Betts and Panton's station, Gilwally, by a line running to the western extreme of Miller's south boundary, thence following Miller's western and northern boundary to the Mundugiry Mountains half-way, between Boyd's station, called Cotes, and by those mountains to the Corumbinah Mountains; north by the Corumbinah Mountains to where the Lachlan Road crosses the Coobong Creek, (about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles from Boulton's Cookamaden station); west by a line following the Limestone Range, 5 miles back from the Billabong Creek to where the Lachlan Road crosses the Billabong Creek, and by a line south to a point about  $2\frac{1}{4}$  miles from the crossing place; south by a line from the point of the Euro Mountains to the starting point.

## No. 8.

Boulton Brothers.

Name of Run—Weiraguari.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—3,500 Sheep.

Commencing at the eastern extremity of a ridge half way between Boyd's Kallimbuttah and Boul-

on's Redbank station; thence by a line to a point half way between Garra and Redbank, from that point by a line north of east to crest of main ridge; thence following crest of main ridge to a rocky pinnacle opposite Wallaby Gap; thence following south side of Redbank road to where the Norah road crosses it; thence by a line northerly to a point half way between Doboy station and Norah and the Gap; thence by a line north of west touching the Buckinbar road to a point on Burgoon Creek, half way between Burgoon and Burrawang; thence by a line to a point half way between Burgoon and Ramsay's Craal station; thence by a line to a point on the creek half way between Burgoon and Boyd's Wollongolong station; thence by a line to foot of ridge, and following its crest to eastern extreme, the starting point.

## No. 9.

Boyd Benjamin & Co.  
Name of Run—Brymadura and Memildra.  
Estimated Area—150,000 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—15,000 Sheep.

Commencing at a point half way between Mr. Bolton's station Bunbury and Dulla-dulladey, a line running thence through the Mendagery mountains about north-west to the top of the dividing range behind Wallaba, and thence north-east to Bray's Mount; thence crossing Bulderodgery road northerly half way betwixt Mr. F. Lord and my station, to a point half way between Wallagalong and Burgoon; thence a line south-east to the top of the dividing range half way between Killenbutta and Redbank; thence southerly by the high ridge above Bruin to the creek; thence by the creek to its junction with Bruin Creek, then Bruin Creek to the old Boree road, and that road as far as the Limestone ridge; thence a line to Molong road, extending 3 miles beyond Lord's Gap, following this road; thence crossing the pine ridge half way between Bryan's Flat and Bockhobble station; thence east to the top of the dividing range between Mr. Barton's and my station; thence southerly to the head of the Sandy Creek; thence westerly by the Boree cross roads to the Black Springs; thence westerly crossing the pine ridge to the angle of the creek half way between Menildra and Rogan's Flat; thence still westerly to the top of the dividing range between Bald Hill and Middle station; thence about south-south-west to Mackay's Creek; thence to the top of the dividing range of Mackay's mountains, between Mr. Forester's and my station; and thence west to the point between Bunburey and Dulla-dulladey station.

## No. 10.

Boyd Benjamin & Co.  
Name of Run—Condabulan.  
Estimated Area—60,000 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—800 Cattle.

Low quartz ridges, with stunted iron bark intermixed with impassable barren pine and yarring scrubs; no plains whatever. Boundary—south by the River Lachlan; east by a line running northerly from my yard (erected on a sand hill on the banks of the river); west by a line running northerly from Gulgo hut 20 miles.

## No. 11.

Boyd Benjamin & Co.  
Name of Run—Gulgo.  
Estimated Area—60,000 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 Cattle.

Description—a plain, running parallel with Lachlan River, about 4 miles long and half a mile wide; the remainder impassable scrub of yarring and mugger. Boundary—south by the Lachlan River; east by a line running north from Gulgo hut and waterhole; west by a line running north from Muckibel waterhole, in the river, 20 miles

## No. 12.

Boyd Benjamin & Co.  
Name of Run—Gonoo.  
Estimated Area—60,000 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,000 Cattle.

Is bounded northerly by top of the range commencing at the Little River, about 2 miles above \_\_\_\_\_ station; easterly by Little River; southerly by a line commencing at the Little river at a point known as the Wash-pen, and running southerly to the western boundary; westerly by a line running parallel to the Little River, at a distance of 5 miles back from it.

## No. 13.

Boyd Benjamin & Co.  
Name of Run—Wambangalang.  
Estimated Area—32,400 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—800 Cattle.

Is bounded northerly by a ridge lying half-way between the Wambangalang and Wilbertree Creeks; westerly by the Meadows Creek; southerly by a line commencing on the Meadows Creek and running parallel to the northern boundary, at a distance of about 5 miles from it; easterly by a line from the northern to the southern boundary about 7 miles above the station.

## No. 14.

Boyd Benjamin & Co.  
Name of Run—Minore.  
Estimated Area—30,000 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 Cattle.

Is bounded northerly by the Macquarie River; easterly by the Woolandara Creek; westerly by a line commencing on the Macquarie River, about  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles below the station; southerly by a line 20 miles back from, and running parallel to, the Macquarie River.

## No. 15.

Boyd Benjamin & Co.  
Name of Run—Coolee.  
Estimated Area—30,000 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 Cattle.

Is bounded northerly by the Macquarie River, from a point about half a mile above Beadelin Waterhole, extending 5 miles along the river; southerly by a line parallel to the Macquarie, at a distance of 5 miles back from it.

## No. 16.

Boyd Benjamin & Co.  
Name of Run—Timnee or Gorothory Run.  
Estimated Area—60,000 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—6,000 Sheep.

Timnee consists of six stations, viz.,—Paling Yards, Gundy, Caddumbles, Currogh Creek, and Chain Ponds, and in a good season will carry 5,000

sheep; the two last-named stations are very uncertain, and having no water except for a short time after thunder showers. Timnee run commences on the Buckenbah Creek, half-way between Gonoo station and Timnee, and extends along the south side of the creek to a creek about a mile below Buckenbah station; on the north side it extends to the ridge about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile below Toombang (Mr. Callaghan's station) with a back run of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles, the distance from point to point is about 9 miles. The Caddumbles run lies on the north side of the Caddumble Creek, and commences at the point of the Caddumble Mountains, extending along the creek to the ridge about a mile above Toombang station, distance about 4 miles, with 4 miles back run. Gundy station run commences on the north side of the Little River, at the ridge which separates it from Gonoo station run, and extends along the run to the point of Bushrangers Hill, about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles with 4 miles back run. The Chain of Ponds station run is situated in the Oberlee Mountains, embracing a circle about 4 miles, taking the Chain of Ponds as the centre.

## No. 17.

Balfour John O.

Name of Run—Mulgathary.

Estimated Area—25,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—800 Cattle.

Bounded on the south by the River Lachlan, commencing at Mr. Kite's boundary, the Bubbuccan Waterhole, 7 miles frontage to that river; on the east by a line 5 miles back to Kite's Barrawong station; on the north by a line 7 miles back to the Burrabegenbong Lagoon; and on the west by a line to the River Lachlan, including portion of the above lagoon to Dr. Ramsay's boundary.

## No. 18.

Bowler John.

Name of Run—Meadows.

Estimated Area—12,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Molong Creek station  $3\frac{1}{4}$  miles west from junction of Back Creek with Molong Creek, a line north to meet John Smith's south boundary to Molong Creek; westerly from western extremity of south boundary to top of ridge between Gardner and Livingstone's, thence following top of ridge to John Smith's southerly boundary. Meadows from junction of Back Gully with Molong Creek westerly to Back Creek; on the west by Back Creek to the Canobolus; on the south by the Old Man Canobolus to the head of Molong Creek; on the east by Molong Creek to junction of Back Gully with that creek.

## No. 19.

Busby G. and Miller K.

Name of Run—Toogong.

Estimated Area—57,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,200 Cattle, 10,000 Sheep.

On the west for 3 miles by Nangar mountain and a range of mountains running northerly from its western end to a point on the Mandagery Creek  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile below Margar hut, thence for  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile by a range of mountains running northerly,

thence 3 miles by a line north-east crossing the Bilabong road, 2 miles above Margar hut to the Mandagery mountains, thence for 5 miles by the Mandagery mountains to a point known as Kelly's station; on the north from northern extremity of western boundary for 3 miles by a line about east south-east to a point on the Mandagery Creek half way between Hood's Bald Hill station and Green Grove station, thence for 5 miles by a line east south-east to a point on the Boree Creek, half way between Lawson's Boree Creek station and Toogong Boree Creek station; on the east from eastern extremity of northern boundary for  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles by the Boree Creek to its junction with the Oaky Creek, thence for half a mile by the Toogong Creek to a point on it known as the rocky corner, thence for 2 miles by a line bearing about south-east, crossing a point half way between Baragan and Tuckrilly to a point half way between Baragan and Bowen, thence for  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles by a line south south-east to a point above Baragan, known as the Limestones, thence for 3 miles by a line south south-west to a point on the Belubula road known as the rocks, 7 miles from Toogong; on the south from the southern extremity of eastern boundary  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles by a line north of west to a point on Clements road, 4 miles from Long's corner, thence for 4 miles by a line north of west to southern extremity of western boundary.—Adjoining runs—on west, Messrs. North, Wills and Forester, and Boyd; on north, Messrs. Hood and Lawson; on the east, Messrs. Lawson and Barton; on the south, Messrs. Lawson and Clements.

## No. 20.

Busby George and Miller Kenneth.

Name of Run—Waterholes.

Estimated Area—7,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2,000 Sheep.

On the west for 3 miles by the mountains west of the waterholes hut and a line from their northern end to the junction of the waterholes and Bilabong road, distant 2 miles from the waterholes hut; on the north for 2 miles by a line bearing about east north-east from northern extremity of western boundary to a point 1 mile north of where the old Bilabong road crosses the waterhole creek, thence for 2 miles by a line crossing the road leading from waterholes to Guambing at a point 2 miles distant from waterholes hut; on the east from eastern extremity of northern boundary for 4 miles by a line bearing about south-west, crossing a point half way between waterholes hut and the old Ewelandabill station, being about 1 mile distant from waterholes hut to a point on the waterhole creek 2 miles below the waterholes hut; on the south from the southern extremity of east boundary for 2 miles by a line bearing about north-west to the mountain forming the western boundary.—Adjoining runs—on the south and west, Messrs. Boulton Brothers; on the north and east, Messrs. Wills and Forester.

## No. 21.

Busby George and Miller Kenneth.

Name of Run—Bilabung.

Estimated Area—7,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2,000 Sheep.

On the west by a line 3 miles north from a point on Bilabung Creek  $1\frac{1}{4}$  mile below Busby

and Miller's Bilabung station hut; on the north from northern extremity of western boundary by a line east 3 miles to a point on Bilabung Creek 2 miles above Busby and Miller's Bilabung station hut; on the east from eastern extremity of northern boundary by a line east of south  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles to a point on Bilabung road 4 miles above the aforesaid hut; on the south from southern extremity of eastern boundary by a line west  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles to southern extremity of western boundary. Adjoining runs, on the west, east, and south, Messrs. Boulton, Brothers; and on the north Mr. Thos. Kite.

## No. 22.

Bull J. E. N.

Name of Run—Ban Ban, or Gannalgang.

Estimated Area—23,688 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—800 Cattle.

Commencing at a marked tree on the bank of the Macquarie River, 2 miles 4 chains above the Gannalgang hut, and bounded on the south-east by Mr. Dullhenty, being a line bearing south 41 degrees 30 minutes west 5 miles; on the south-west unlocated land, being a line bearing west 25 degrees north 6 miles 28 chains; on the north-west by Mr. Lawson, junr.'s, a line bearing west 41 degrees 30 minutes east 5 miles to the Macquarie River; and on the north-east by the River Macquarie, 6 miles 28 chains.

## No. 23.

Bull J. E. N.

Name of Run—Gunningbar.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 Cattle.

On the Gunningbar Creek, commencing from Mr. Samuel's lower boundary near the junction of the Belinmijar with the Gunningbar, 5 miles down the Gunningbar, and 5 miles back on the Macquarie River.

## No. 24.

Boyd John C. C.

Name of Run—Garra.

Estimated Area—15,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—5,000 Sheep.

Bounded by Mr. Benjamin Boyd's run of Brymedura, (Killing Butter), to the north; west, Cajejol; south, Buckobblo; east, rocky mountains, extending some distance through Lord's Gap towards Molong; on the north-east, Mr. Bolton's station, Redbank, comes in; the blue on the accompanying chart is the stations as far as possible without the assistance of surveyor. There is another station at the other side of Mr. Bolton's Gogothera.

## No. 26.

Clements Isaac.

Name of Run—Mogong.

Estimated Area—12,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 Cattle.

Bounded on the west by the Nangar Mountains; on the east by the Toogong Road; on the north by the boundary line between applicant and Busby and Miller; and on the south a marked tree line between Thomas Duffy and applicant.

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## No. 27.

Corse John, junior, (per J. and H. Corse.)

Name of Run—Gradell.

Estimated Area—31,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,000 Cattle.

Gradell on the Bogan River, bounded on the north by the Bogan River in a line west 8 miles, commencing from the centre of the Little Plain waterhole being the north-west corner of John Dargin's run on the said river called Mungeree, to the north-east corner of Samuel Phillip's run on the said river, below the Dragie hole called Wullambalong; bounded on the west by Phillip's said run in a line south 6 miles crossing the back creek at the lower Wamera hole to the outer forest; bounded on the south by Government land in a line running east 8 miles to the upper end of Origell Plain; and bounded on the east by Dargin's said run in a line north 6 miles crossing the said back creek at the black gin's grave to the north-west corner of Dargin's run as aforesaid.

## No. 28.

Cornwall Elizabeth.

Name of Run—Mullingudgerry.

Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 Cattle.

Commencing at a marked tree on the Gunningbar Creek 1 mile and 20 chains above the Mullingudgerry waterhole, and bounded on the south-east by Mr. Neil being a line bearing south 45 degrees, west 5 miles; on the south-west being a line bearing north 45 degrees, west 5 miles, over partly scrubby country; on the north-west by unlocated land being a line bearing north 45 degrees east, 5 miles over open forest country to the junction of the Billaringa Creek with the Gunningbar, and on the north-east by Mr. Samuel's and the Gunningbar Creek 5 miles to the point of commencement aforesaid.

## No. 29.

Campbell Archibald.

Name of Run—Wandoo Wandering.

Estimated Area—35,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,200 Cattle, or 8,000 Sheep.

Wandoo Wandering is bounded on the north by a line bearing east for about 6 miles from the head of the Wandoo Wandering Creek along a range dividing the waters of the Deyrowie and Chain of Pond Creeks to a marked tree on that dividing range, being the boundary between the Wandoo Wandering run and that of the late John Ireland on the north, and that of Benjamin Boyd on the north-east; on the east by a line bearing a little south-east from the marked tree before mentioned for about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles and crossing the Degrowie Creek to another marked tree on a range of hills dividing the waters of the Cookumuble and Redbank Creeks and from that marked tree following the crest of those hills for about 2 miles in a south-westerly direction to Campbell's Road crossing Campbell's Road and following the western bank of the Redbank Creek for about 6 miles in a direction nearly north and south to a marked tree about 6 miles east of Harvey's Range being the boundary between the Wandoo Wandering run and that of the late John Ireland on the east, and that of David

Ramsay on the south-east; on the south by a line bearing west 5 miles from the southern extremity of the eastern boundary to a marked tree one half mile west of my station of Gudgeebagamble, being the boundary between the Wandoo Wandering run, and that of David Ramsay on the south, on the west by a line running nearly north and south for miles about 12 from the last mentioned marked tree to the head of the Wandoo Wandering Creek, along the base of a chain of mountains before mentioned as Harvey's Range.

## No. 30.

Campbell Archibald.  
Name of Run—Barrabadeen.  
Estimated Area—9,600 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—150 Cattle, or 1,000 Sheep.

Barrabadeen is bounded on the north by a line 1 mile north of the shepherd's hut running east and west for about 5 miles; on the east by a line bearing south from the eastern extremity of the northern boundary 3 miles; on the south by a line bearing west from the southern extremity of the eastern boundary 5 miles, and on the west by a line bearing north from the western extremity of the southern boundary 3 miles. Barrabadeen is surrounded on all sides by unoccupied land, and is not distinguished by any leading geographical features.

## No. 30.

Caley, Templar and Co.  
Name of Run—Genaniji.  
Estimated Area—76,800 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2,000 Cattle.
