CLAIMS TO LEASES OF CROWN LAND

BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS. LOWER DARLING DISTRICT,

(formerly included in the District of Wellington.)

TIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, for the information of all persons interested, that in pursuance of Her Majesty's Order in Council, of 9th March, 1847, the undermentioned persons have demanded Leases of the several runs of Crown Land, particularized in connexion with their respective names.

Persons who object to any of these claims, either wholly or in part, should lodge caveats at this Office within two months from the present date, specifying the Lands to which their objections extend, and the grounds on which their objections are based

It is to be distinctly understood, that the Government does not pledge itself to the issue of a Lease in any case until due enquiry has been made into the validity of the claim, and whether or not it may be necessary to reserve any portion of the Land claimed, for any of the public purposes contemplated in the Order in Council.

Arkell Thomas.

Name of Run—Cain.

Estimated Area—45,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—800 Cattle.

Bounded on the south by the Lachlan River, having 8 miles river frontage; on the east by a small dry creek running from a sugarloaf mountain; on the north by a dense scrub, 1 mile from the river, extending at the back of the run 4 miles; bounded on the west by a line running north half a mile above Mr. Suttor's hut. The back of this run is very scrubby.

No. 2.

Bell Robert.
Name of Run—Wheabah.
Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—650 Cattle.

Five miles frontage to the Lachlan River, and adjoining Dr. Ramsay's lower station; unlocated lands below, viz.:—"Tawanga," tendered for by me, adjoins this station. There being no back creeks, no water for cattle but the river, no hills, nor nothing for boundaries, being all low soft plains of immense extent, and in many cases very void of herbage, being only a make shift.

Daniels Sylvanus Brown.
Name of Run—Eribindery.
Estimated Area—34,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—800 Cattle,

or 6,000 Sheep.

Frontage low sand hills covered with scrubby plains and white oak, at the back thick dimosa scrub; the back country is void of water, and consequently of little value, except in wet seasons when the Lachlan River overflows and inundates the whole country for miles, then is the only place to drive the stock for safety; bounded on the east by a line commencing about one mile east of the hut from the Lachlan River; north 38 degrees west by an old stockyard, (crossing the back of Billybung Creek, about 12 miles, thence a line parallel with the River Lachlan about 10 miles, thence a line south 22 degrees east to the Lachlan River, to the Pipeclay Hole or Dera;) thence on the south by the north bank of the Lachlan River to the starting point; the eastern boundary of this run constitutes J. Moulder's western boundary; and western boundary constitutes Isaac Shepherd's eastern boundary, as confirmed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, W. II. Wright, Esq.

No. 4.

Flanagan John.
Name of Run—Guagong.
Estimated Area—25,600 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle, 4,000
Sheep.

Bounded on the west by the Booberi station, part of the Coran Creek, and part of the Woomberam Plain, which it respectively intersects, and commencing from the corner of the Booberi station, runs direct north 5 miles; on the east by part of the Karangatoo station, (Lanc,) part of the Bradgery Plain, and some barren ridges which it respectively intersects, and runs direct north 5 miles; on the north by lands unlocated, and being in extent from west to east 7 miles; on the south by the Lachlan River direct to the corner of the barren ridges aforesaid, being in extent 8 miles.

No. 5.

Long Alexander.
Name of Run—Hyandra.
Estimated Area—32,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 Cattle.

Commencing on the Lachlan River, at a point about half a mile above the hut, and bounded by that river downwards to a point 10 miles below the starting point, and running back 5 miles at right-angles to the course of the river.

No. 6.

Moulder Joseph.
Name of Run—Eneboleng.
Estimated Area—19,200 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—650 Cattle.

By Mr. Shopherd on the east; by Mr. Daniels, on the west; by the Lachlan River.

No. 7.

Ramsay David.
Name of Run—Bellingeramble, (Duckama.)
Estimated Area—28,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,200 Cattle.

Bellingeramble—commencing at a point on the River Lachlan, a little above the present hut; then by a line north 5 miles; thence by a line west 8 miles; thence by a line south to the river.

No. 8.

Shepherd Isaac.
Name of Run—Boberoy.
Estimated Area—25,600 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—900 Cattle.

Commencing at a cluster of pines about 2½ miles east of the present hut on the bank of the Lachlan River; on the south by the Lachlan River 8 miles to a lagoon 1 mile east of J. Moulder's cattle station; on the west by J. Moulder's station 5 miles; on the north by high ranges 8 miles; on the east by M. Flanagan's cattle station to the cluster of pines on the bank of the Lachlan River 5 miles.

No. 9.

Shepherd Isaac.
Name of Run—Whoey.
Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 Cattle.

Commencing at a waterhole known, and called the Pipeclay Waterhole, 1 mile east of the present hut; bounded on the south by the Lachlan River 5 miles; on the west by A. Long's cattle station 5 miles; on the north by high ranges 5 miles; and on the east by Daniels' cattle station 5 miles to the pipeclay hole on the Lachlan River.

No. 10.

Suttor William Henry.
Name of Run—Walandra.
Estimated Area—32,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,300 Cattle, or 7,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the south 20 miles by the Lachlan River, commencing at my stockmen's hut on that river; running from thence nearly west by the river 20 miles, and extending back $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the scrub.

No. 11.

Walsh Michael.
Name of Run—Huaba.
Estimated Area—20,480 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 Cattle.

The station Huaba, on the Lachlan River, in the District of Lower Darling. Bounded on the south by the Lachlan River 8 miles; on the west by Arkell's station 4 miles; on the north by unlocated land 8 miles; and on the east by stations 4 miles.
