PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governorin-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the second year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for "repealing so much of an Act, intituled, "An Act " to continue until further provisions shall be " made, certain Duties, Tolls, Rates, Fees, or "tother sums of money imposed by the Governor " of New South Wales, and for other purposes, as relates to the levying of Tolls in New South " Wales, and for raising a fund towards making, cerepairing, and upholding Public Roads, Bridges, "and Ferries, and for regulating the collection of tolls thereon," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony for the time being, by any Proclamation or Proclamations under his hand, from time to time to appoint places at which Tolls shall be collected, and to cause the same to be collected upon any line of road which has been, or shall be wholly or partly made, and which is repaired at the public expense; and to cause Toll to be collected at any Bridge built, purchased, or repaired at the public expense, and at any Ferry, constructed or upheld at the same, and to cause such Gates, Bars, Chains, Rails, and Fences, to be built and set up, as shall be deemed necessary for preventing passengers, beasts, and carriages from passing, unless there

shall be then paid such Toll as shall be due or demandable under the authority of the said recited Act; and whereas it has become necessary to appoint places on the road from Sydney to Bathurst for the purposes of the said recited Act: Now, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited Law or Ordinance, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby appoint that from and after the first day of January next ensuing, Turnpike Gates shall be established at the following places, and that Tolls shall be collected thereat to the amount and under the Regulations, restrictions, and provisions of the said recited Act or Ordinance; that is to say: -On the Bathurst Road between Penrith and Mount Victoria, at a spot one hundred yards east of the fifteen mile stone, known as the old seventeen Mile Hollow Stockade, and on the Bathurst Road between Penrith and Mount Victoria, at the thirty-five mile stone at a spot known as Broughton's waterhole.-

Of which Turnpike Gates all persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice.

HEREAS by an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the second year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for " repealing so much of an Act, intituled, ' An Act " to continue until further provision shall be made, certain Duties, Tolls, Rates, Fees, or other sums " of money imposed by the Governor of New South Wales, and for other purposes, as relates to the a levying of Tolls in New South Wales, and for " raising a fund towards making, repairing, and www.upholding Public Roads, Bridges, and Ferries, and " for regulating the collection of Tolls thereon," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony for the time being, by any Proclamation or Proclamations under his hand, from time to time to appoint places at which Tolls shall be collected, and to cause the same to be collected upon any line of Road which has been, or shall be, wholly or partly, made, and which is repaired, at the public expense; and to cause Toll to be collected at any Bridge built, purchased, or repaired at the public expense, and at any Ferry constructed or upheld at the same ; and to cause such Gates, Bars, Chains, Rails, and Fences, to be built and set up, as shall be deemed necessary for preventing Passengers, Beasts, and Carriages, from passing, unless there shall be then paid such Toll as shall be due or demandable under the authority of the said recited Act; and whereas it has become necessary to appoint a place on the Road from Braidwood towards Twofold Bay across the Moruya River, near Pergoga, at the landing place at the Plough Inn, on the Estate of Mr. Flannagan, for the purposes of the said recited Act : Now, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited Law or Ordinance, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby appoint the said crossing on the Moruya River, near Pergoga, to be a place at which a Ferry shall be established, and at which Tolls shall be collected, to the amount, and under the regulations, restrictions, and provisions of the said recited Law or Ordinance, of which Ferry all persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice.
