**OCCUPATION OF CROWN LANDS WITHIN
THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.**

WITH reference to the Regulations published on the 29th March last, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed it to be notified, that any person now in actual *licensed* occupation of Crown Lands within the Settled Districts, who before the 31st December next, may make application to purchase any portion not less than 30 acres thereof, will be permitted to occupy on the same terms and at the same rent as at present, the section of which the land applied for forms part, until such portion of land shall have been measured and offered for sale, and an opportunity shall have thus been afforded to him of acquiring the fee simple.

Sections of land of which any portion may be required for sale under the terms of this notice, will not be let under the pre-emptive right conferred by clause 16 of the Regulations of the 29th March last; nor will they be again obtainable on lease, even though no part of them be actually sold. In all such cases those portions of sections which may have been put up for sale and not bid for, or on which the deposit shall have been forfeited, will be kept open to selection for purchase without competition under the provisions of the Land Sales Act, 5 and 6 Vic., cap. 36, and the regulations, thereon founded, of the 1st March, 1843. The remaining portions of the sections will be reserved, until required for sale, for the use of the adjoining holders of Land in fee simple, as a Common.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of public monies, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each, may be credited in the Accounts of the year within which it was received.

The Heads of Departments and other Officers, who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendance, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before

the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury, the unexpended balance of such advances that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to 31st proximo.

They will also, as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.

REWARD.
