PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

I HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, " An Act to con-"solidate and amend the laws relating to Courts " of Requests, and to extend the jurisdiction of such " Courts, in the County of Cumberland," it was amongst other things enacted, That from and after the first day of January, 1843, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for such Counties and Districts, or other portions of this Colony and its Dependencies, and at such places respectively, as the Governor should by Proclamation for that purpose from time to time appoint: And whereas by another Act passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her said Majesty, intituled, "An Act to " amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests in " the City of Sydney, and County of Cumberland, " and in the Town of Melbourne, and County of " Bourke respectively," it was enacted, that all Courts of Requests established, or to be established within the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, and in the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, should respectively have power and authority to hear and determine, in a summary way, all actions whatsoever, for the recovery of any debt, demand, or damage, whether liquidated or unliquidated, to an amount not exceeding thirty pounds: Now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said first recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint that Courts of Requests, in and for the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, shall be holden, during the year

1849, at the Town of Melbourne, at the times hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

The "Ordinary Sittings" of the Court of Requests, for the trial of all cases not exceeding ten pounds, for the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, shall he holden at the Court House, Collinsstreet, Melbourne, on the following days, and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day as may be found necessary, namely:—Monday, 1st January; Monday, 5th February; Monday, 1st January; Monday, 2nd April; Monday, 7th May; Monday, 4th June; Monday, 2nd July; Monday, 6th August; Monday, 3rd September; Monday, 1st October; Monday, 5th November; Monday, 3rd December; Monday, 17th December.

The "New Sittings" of the Court of Requests for the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, for the trial of all cases from ten to thirty pounds, shall commence and be holden at the Court House, Collins-street, Melbourne, on the following days, and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day, as may be found necessary, viz.:—Thursday, 1st February; Thursday, 5th April; Thursday, 7th June; Thursday, 2nd August; Thursday, 4th October; Thursday, 6th December.

CHURCH OF ENGLAND GRANT .-- PORT PHILLIP DISTRICT.

GEELONG, 2, Two acres, county of Grant, parish of Corio, near Geelong; commencing at the south-west corner; and bounded on the west by a line bearing north 5 chains; on the north by the Wesleyan Burial Ground, containing 2 acres, being a line bearing east 4 chains; on the east by the Presbyterian Burial Ground, containing 2 acres, being a line bearing south 5 chains; and on the south by a line bearing west 4 chains.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

A LL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of public monies, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each, may be credited in the Accounts of the year within which it was received.

The Heads of Departments and other Officers, who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury, the unexpended balance of such advances that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to 31st proximo.

They will also, as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.
