Rules and Regulations for the maintenance of good order on the wharf at Green Hills, Maitland, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 5th William 4, No. 13.

No. 1. No cart, dray, or other wheeled vehicle of any kind, (hand carts and wheelbarrows used for loading and unloading vessels, and unloaded vehicles in the act of being shipped or landed excepted,) shall be placed or enter on or pass over any part of the planked platform of this wharf, under a penalty of twenty shillings for each offence.

CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED
DISTRICTS.

CAUTION AGAINST UNAUTHORISED OCCUPATION.

THE recent Proclamation of three new Commissioners' Districts, namely, the Burnett, the Maranoa, and Wide Bay, having rendered a large extent of country available for occupation on the terms prescribed in Her Majesty's Order in Council of 9th March, 1847, and the local regulations founded thereon,—His Excellency the Governor deems the present a fitting opportunity for cautioning all persons who may take unauthorised possession of Runs of Crown Land, that although the Government may not find it practicable or expedient to take immediate measures for the removal of persons who may form Stations beyond the limits assigned to existing Commissioners' Districts, and consequently beyond the range of authorised occupation, the holding of the Lands upon which such Stations may be formed will not be regarded as in any degree permissive; or as conferring on the occupants the slightest preferential claim to Leases of the Lands whenever they may be placed under the superintendence of a Commissioner. On the contrary, any improvements effected by such Occupants, will be entirely at their own risk, and they will be liable at any moment to be summarily removed under the provisions of the Act of Parliament, 9 and 10 Victoria, cap. 104.

SYDNEY STREETS.

2. His Excellency the Governor is prohibited by Law from disposing of Leases of Lands in the unsettled and intermediate Districts, in any other manner than by public Tender. Whenever therefore a new Commissioner's District may be formed, the Lands therein comprised will be let to the persons making the highest Tender for them without any reference to the persons previously in occupation of them, or to the improvements effected by them.

3. It is also to be distinctly understood that any persons found in unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands, within any District to which a Commissioner has been appointed, will be immediately proceeded against under the provisions of the Act of Parliament above referred to.

SYDNEY STREETS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed it to be notified, in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council, 5th William 4, No. 20, that the breadth of the footways in each of the undermentioned streets shall be twelve feet each, and consequently that it will not be lawful for any person to erect any building within twelve feet of the curbstone, or exterior edge of the said footways, as delineated on the plan submitted to His Excellency and the Executive Council, in conformity with the said Act, which said plan lies at the Office of the Surveyor General, for the inspection of the Public.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of public monies, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each, may be credited in the Accounts of the year within which it was received.

The Heads of Departments and other Officers, who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury, the unexpended balance of such advances that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to 31st proximo.

They will also, as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.
