PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth and sixth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, " An Act " for the Government of New South Wales and "Van Diemen's Land," it was, amongst other things enacted, that there should be within the said Colony of New South Wales a Legislative Council, to be constituted in the manner and for the purposes in the said Act mentioned, and that the said Council should consist of thirty-six Members, and that twelve of the Members of the said Council should, from time to time in the manner therein mentioned, be appointed by Her Majesty, and that twenty-four of the Members of the said Council should, from time to time, in the manner therein mentioned, be elected by the inhabitants of the said Colony: And whereas by the said recited Act of Parliament, it was further enacted and provided that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, by any Warrant or Warrants, to be from time to time issued by Her

Majesty, under Her Sign Manual, and countersigned by one of Her Principal Secretaries of State, to nominate such part of the said Council as according to the said Act, is to be appointed by Her Majesty, and to designate such non-elective Members of the said Council, either by their proper names, or as holders for the time being, of any public Offices in the said Colony; and that it should also be lawful for Her Majesty, by any such Warrant or Warrants, from time to time, to delegate to the Governor of the said Colony, the power of nominating and designating such non-elective Members of the said Council, either by their proper names, or as holders, for the time being, of any such public Offices as aforesaid, such delegated power being exercised by any such Governor provisionally only, and until Her Majesty's pleasure should be known, but not until the return of the Writs for the election of all the elective Members; and provided always, that not more than half the number of such non-elective Members, should hold any office of emolument under the Crown within the said Colony: And whereas, in pursuance of the said recited Act, Her Majesty has by a Warrant, under Her Sign Manual, and countersigned by one of Her Principal Secretaries of State, delegated to me, as such Governor as aforesaid, the power of nominating and designating the non-elective Members of the said Legislative Council, subject to the provisions of the said Act, as hereinbefore recited: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, as such Governor as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim, that I have accordingly in pursuance of the authority so vested in me, appointed the following gentlemen to be the non-elective Members of the

said Legislative Council, until Her Majesty's further pleasure shall be known, viz. :---

CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

CAUTION AGAINST UNAUTHORISED OCCUPATION.

THE recent Proclamation of three new Commissioners' Districts, namely, the Burnett, the Maranoa, and Wide Bay, having rendered a large extent of country available for occupation on the terms prescribed in Her Majesty's Order in Council of 9th March, 1847, and the local regulations founded thereon,-His Excellency the Governor deems the present a fitting opportunity for cautioning all persons who may take unauthorised possession of Runs of Crown Land, that although the Government may not find it practicable or expedient to take immediate measures for the removal of persons who may form Stations beyond the limits assigned to existing Commissioners' Districts, and consequently beyond the range of authorised occupation, the holding of the Lands upon which such Stations may be formed will not be regarded as in any degree permissive; or as conferring on the occupants the slightest preferential claim to Leases of the Lands whenever they may be placed under the superintendence of a Commissioner. On the contrary, any improvements effected by such Occupants, will be entirely at their own risk, and they will be liable at any moment to be summarily removed under the provisions of the Act of Parliament, 9 and 10 Victoria, cap. 104.

2. His Excellency the Governor is prohibited by Law from disposing of Leases of Lands in the unsettled and intermediate Districts, in any other manner than by public Tender. Whenever therefore a new Commissioner's District may be formed, the Lands therein comprised will be let to the persons making the highest Tender for them without any reference to the persons previously in occupation of them, or to the improvements effected by them.

3. It is also to be distinctly understood that any persons found in unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands, within any District to which a Commissioner has been appointed, will be immediately proceeded against under the provisions of the Act of Parliament

above referred to.

A LL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of public monies, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each, may be credited in the Accounts of the year within which it was received.

The Heads of Departments and other Officers, who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury, the unexpended balance of such advances that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to 31st proximo.

They will also, as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.
