FERRIES ON THE NEW LINE OF ROAD  
FROM SYDNEY TO MAITLAND, BY  
WAY OF BRISBANE WATER.

**T**HE undermentioned Ferries having been established on the new line of Road from Sydney to Maitland, by way of Brisbane Water, the dues arising from the same will be put up to auction, by the Colonial Treasurer, at the Colonial Treasury, Bent-street, Sydney, at twelve o'clock of Tuesday, the 8th day of March, 1848, for twelve months, commencing the 1st day of April, 1848.
