RULES and REGULATIONS for the maintenance of good order on the Jetty at Corio, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 5th William IV., No. 13.

1.—No vessel to remain alongside the Jetty, unless actually discharging or taking in cargo.

2.—Masters of vessels at the Jetty to keep a watch on board during the night, and are not to allow any disorder on board.

3.—No nuisance to be committed, nor rubbish or filth landed on the Jetty.

4.—No stone or sand ballast to be taken in at the Jetty.

5.—Boats are not to be permanently stationed at the Jetty, and only to be there for temporary purposes.

6.—Goods or Timber landed at the Jetty to be removed within twenty-four hours.

7.—No Dray, either waiting for loading or hire, to block up or impede a free passage along the centre of the Jetty, for passengers, horses, or vehicles.

8.—Drays to keep the left side of the Jetty in going, and to return along the opposite side.

9.—The Western side of the stone part of the Jetty to be kept clear for the use of the Steamers.

Any person committing a violation of any of the above regulations, shall forfeit, for every such offence, any sum not exceeding Twenty Shillings, at the discretion of the presiding Justice or Justices.
