#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act for regulating "the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, "Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns "respectively, and for the removing and prevent-"ing nuisances and obstructions, and for the "better alignment of streets therein," it was amongst other things enacted, that whenever the Governor or Acting Governor for the time being, should deem it expedient to extend the said Act to any other Towns in the said Colony, it should and might be lawful for the said Governor or Acting Governor for the time being, to declare the same by Proclamation; Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby direct that the provisions of the said Act be extended to the Town of Goulburn, in the County of Argyle.
