**FORFEITED RUN.**

**H**IS EXCELLENCY the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that application having been made for the purchase of the Lease of the Run of Crown Lands hereunder described, which, after having been occupied, has become vacant by forfeiture, sealed Tenders in the prescribed printed form, to be marked "*Tender for Cocomingla Run*," will be received at this Office, till noon, of Monday, the first day of May next, from the applicant, and from any other persons desirous to enter into competition with him, for the purchase of the Lease of the said Run, for a term not exceeding fourteen years.

5.—It is also to be distinctly understood, that the Government reserves to itself the right of excluding from the Lease of this Run, any portion of it which it may be deemed proper to reserve for any of the purposes referred to in the 9th section of chapter II, of Her Majesty's Order in Council.
