THIRTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A CON-
DITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the night of Tuesday, the 9th instant, Mr. Seymour and Mr. John Easton were attacked near the Homebush Race Course by six armed men, (three of whom appear to have been subsequently apprehended) who fired at them and robbed Mr. Easton of twenty-five pounds, in one pound notes, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a reward of ten pounds, will be given for the apprehension of each of the parties concerned in this robbery who are now at large, to any free person or persons, who may capture and lodge them in safe custody, or in

the event of any one of such parties being apprehended by a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to him of a conditional pardon.

FORFEITED RUN.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that application having been made for the purchase of the Lease of the Run of Crown Lands hereunder described, which, after having been occupied, has become vacant by forfeiture, sealed Tenders in the prescribed printed form, to be marked "*Tender for Cocomingla Run,*" will be received at this Office, till noon, of Monday, the first day of May next, from the applicant, and from any other persons desirous to enter into competition with him, for the purchase of the Lease of the said Run, for a term not exceeding fourteen years.
