WHEREAS it has been represented to me, that for the convenience of certain of the Electors in the Electoral District of the County of Bathurst, another place for taking the poll, at the ensuing Election of a Member to serve in the Legislative Council for the said District, will be necessary in addition to the several polling places mentioned in the Proclamation published in the *New South Wales Government Gazette*, of the fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three; Now, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the power in me vested, by a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the sixth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the division of the Colony of New South Wales into Electoral Districts, and for the election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council,*" do hereby proclaim that CANOWINDRA, in the County of Bathurst, shall be a polling place for the Electoral District of the County of Bathurst.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this tenth day of July, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and in the twelfth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
