**FIVE POUNDS REWARD, OR A CON-
DITIONAL PARDON.**

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government that a horse belonging to Thomas Holt, junior, Esquire, of Sophienburg, near Liverpool, was recently stolen, and was, on the 9th instant, found dead with the head severed from the body and the skull much fractured, apparently by an axe; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that a reward of Five Pounds will be paid to any Free person or persons who may within six months from the present date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the party or parties guilty of the above malicious proceeding; and if the person giving such information be a Prisoner of the Crown application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to such Prisoner of the Crown of a Conditional Pardon.

**FERRIES AT THE RIVER PATERSON, ON
THE ROAD LEADING TO HINTON
FROM PATERSON, AND AT HINTON
ACROSS THE RIVER HUNTER.**

THE dues arising from the Ferries as under, will be put up to auction, by the Police Magistrate of Maitland, at Maitland, on Wednesday, the 26th day of July next, at 12 o'clock, for twelve months, commencing the 1st day of August, 1848.

GROSE FARM.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that the Paddocks at Grose Farm, will be put up separately to Auction, for Sale on Lease or Licence for one year, commencing 1st August next, at the Colonial Treasury, Sydney, at Eleven o'clock, on Thursday, the 20th day of July, namely:—

Lot 1.—Is estimated to contain eighteen acres, and comprises two paddocks, fenced, with the old Stockade and the garden and yard attached thereto, and is situate on the north-western end of Grose Farm, but excludes the Police Station at the western extremity. Upset price £30.

WHARVES.

CONSIDERABLE injury having been done to the navigation of the Harbour of Port Jackson, and other navigable waters of the Colony, by parties who have been allowed to erect Wharves, having extended them beyond the authorised limit by throwing rubbish into the water, His Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct that in future no permission to form a Wharf, or extend one already made will be given without a stipulation, rendering it imperative that such wharf be fenced with stone, or in such other manner as will effectually prevent the injury complained of, to be accompanied by a bond, with two sureties for the due observance of all the conditions upon which such permission is granted.

All applications for this purpose must be accompanied by a tracing, showing the nature and extent of the proposed Wharf, and must contain the names of two solvent persons willing to become sureties for the due observance of the conditions above referred to.

And in order that the neighbouring landholders whose interests may possibly be affected by such Wharves, may have an opportunity of stating their objections, all applications for permission to erect them will be duly notified in the *Government Gazette* at least one month before being granted.
