CLAIMS TO LEASES OF CROWN LANDS,

BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.
DARLING DOWNS DISTRICT.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified for the information of all persons interested, that in pursuance of Her Majesty's Order in Council, of 9th March, 1847, the under-mentioned persons have demanded Leases of the several Runs of Crown Land, particularised in connexion with their respective names.

Persons who object to any of these claims, either wholly or in part, should lodge caveats at this Office within two months from the present date, specifying the Lands to which their objections extend, and the grounds on which their objections are based.

It is to be distinctly understood, that the Government does not pledge itself to the issue of a Lease in any case until due enquiry has been made into the validity of the claim, and whether or not it may be necessary to reserve any portion of the Land claimed, for any of the public purposes contemplated in the Order in Council.

No. 1.

Bell Thomas.
Name of Run—Jimbour.
Estimated Area—200,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—20,000 Sheep.

Commencing at a marked tree on the Condamine River, marking the boundary between M'Kenzie's and Jimbour Runs; thence bounded on the northward by a line easterly to the dividing range eastward of the Condamine River, being the southern boundary of M'Kenzie's and Bowerman's stations; on the eastward by that range running southerly about 12 miles; on the southward by the range dividing the waters of Myal and Jimbour Creeks, running westerly to the Condamine River, being the northern boundary of Mocatta's, Stephens' and Ross' stations, and further 3 miles southerly across the Condamine River, along Ross' northern boundary to Wilky's eastern boundary; on the westward by Wilky's eastern boundary for about 12 miles to M'Kenzie's southern boundary aforesaid; and again on the northward by that boundary running easterly to the marked tree at the commencing point on the Condamine River.

No. 2.

Cameron Ewen Wallace.
Name of Run—Coorangah.
Estimated Area—96,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—12,000 Sheep.
Bounded on the north by the dividing range of eastern and western waters called "Craig Range," running the creek down about S. W. to within 3 miles of the River Condamine.

No. 3.

Campbell Colin.
Name of Run—Glengallan.
Estimated Area—60,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,800 Cattle,
18,000 Sheep.

Glengallan is situated on the Gap Creek, Condamine River, and Freestone Creek; it is bounded on the north by the top of the range or division of the fall of the water between it and Mr. P. Leslie's station, and Mr. G. Gammie's station; on the south by the top of a range running east and west from Mount Sturt to the Condamine River, which range is the boundary with Messrs. W. and C. Leslie; on the east by a tree marked, shewing the boundary with Mr. N. Ross's station on the north side of the Gap Creek and by a marked tree shewing the boundary with Mr. James Hay on the south side of the Gap Creek; on the west it is bounded by the Aberdeen Company's station and Messrs. Fairholme and Hayes' stations at the boundaries with which there is also a marked tree.

No. 4.

Campbell and Andrew.

Name of Run—Jondaryan.

Estimated Area—65,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—12,000 Sheep.

Comprises all the country throwing waters into the Oakey Creek, from a line dividing Messrs. Hughes' and Isaacs' run down to a line dividing the Aberdeen Company, having Irvingdale to the north, the large Condamine Plain to the south, Westbrook to the east, and St. Ruth's to the west.

No. 5.

Campbell and Andrew.

Name of Run—Irvingdale.

Estimated Area—45,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—6,000 Sheep.

This Run commences at a line intersecting the S. branch of Myall Creek, dividing it from Rosalie Plains, and continues down to a line intersecting the Creek, at the junction of the north branch thereof, including the throw of waters into the same, and has for its boundaries Mr. Stevens' Run to the north; Jondaryan to the south, Rosalie Plains to the east, and St. Ruth's to the west, and comprehends both sides of Myall Creek.

No. 6.

Collins Thomas.

Name of Run—Coolmunda or Cobramatta.

Estimated Area—60,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2,000 Cattle or 12,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north partly by Captain Moffitt's Run, and partly by Colin M'Leod's Run, being a line about 15 miles in length, running in an easterly and westerly direction; on the west by Leslie's marked line of road to Darling Downs; on the south by unoccupied scrubby land and ranges; and on the east partly by Triverton's Run, being a line running southerly about 17 miles in length to Triverton's Creek, and partly by Ross' Run, being a line continued southerly from the above point on Triverton's Creek about 14 miles south of Triverton's Creek, and comprehends "Look-out" Mountain and Creek, and also the Chain of Ponds and Sandy Creek, and also comprehends the Canal Ponds, part of Triverton's Creek, and the MacIntyre Creek.

No. 7.

Crawford and Hodgson.

Name of Run—Eton Vale.

Estimated number of Acres—65,000.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—700 Cattle, 16,000 Sheep.

Bounded from south-east to north-west by the main range dividing the eastern and western waters; bounded on the north-west by a ridge dividing the

waters flowing into the Eton Vale Creek from those flowing into the licensed station of Messrs. Hughes' and Isaac; bounded on the west by ridges dividing the waters flowing into the Eton Vale Creek from those passing through the unwatered ridges, the licensed station of Mr. Joshua Whitting; bounded on the south-west by a grasstree gully on the west side of the Eton Vale Creek, and by a point of a ridge on the east side, thence running in a straight line, and intersecting the ridge dividing the waters of the Eton Vale Creek from those falling into the licensed station of Messrs. Forbes and Pinnock, which boundary as described divides the Eton Vale Run from that of Captain Mallard's; bounded on the south-east from that to south-west by ridges dividing the waters of the Emu Creek from the waters flowing into the Haldon and Clifton Stations and including a small patch of table land at the head of Emu Creek, watered by springs, and by 3 miles of a creek running into the Tent Hill Waters.

No. 8.

Crowder John and Alfred.

Name of Run—Braemar Forest.

Estimated Area—12,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—4,000 Sheep.

Braemar Forest is bounded on the north by a line running parallel with, and two miles distant from the Condamine River; commencing at a point on the main range of hills between the Braemar Creek and Cogan Creek, which line, taking a north-easterly direction, cuts the Braemar and Little Branch Creeks, and follows on to the main range of hills to the eastern side of the said Little Branch Creek; thence follows that main range which divides the run from that of Mr. Wilkie in a south and westerly direction round the head of the above two creeks; and thence in a northerly direction along the main range of hills between the Braemar and Cogan Creeks to that point at which the boundary on the north side commences.

No. 9.

Dennis Henry, Estate of (now Colin M'Kenzie.)

Name of Run—Warra Warra.

Estimated Area—35,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—10,000 Sheep.

Situated on the Lower Condamine; bounded on the north by a marked line, dividing it from Coorangah Run; on the south by a line 3 miles from the river, dividing it from Messrs. Wilkie and King's Runs; east by a marked tree, dividing it from Messrs. Bell's Run; on the west by a marked tree, dividing it from Mr. Goggs' Run.

N. B.—This Run has been transferred, with the sanction of the Government, to Mr. Colin MacKenzie, in whose name the Lease will accordingly be prepared.

No. 10.

Dumaresq Elizabeth Sophia.

Name of Run—Swithland.

Estimated Area—70,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—3,000 Cattle.

Four miles on each side of the River (Macintyre Brook called I think) from Leslie's Road to William Dumaresq's Station (Whetstone) to the westward; commences at a line intersecting the MacIntyre Brook (Leslie's Road), dividing Run No. 6, (Collins) and continues down to a line drawn across said creek, dividing Run No. 12, (Mr. Dumaresq) having for its boundaries the ridges shedding the waters into the creek.

No. 11.

Dumaresq William.

Name of Run—Whetstone.

Estimated Area—50,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2,500 Cattle.

Bounded on the east by Mrs. H. Dumaresq's Station, "Swithland;" on the west and south by Mr. Abercrombie's Station; on the north by scrub and vacant land, the dividing ranges being a sufficiently recognised (boundary?) between the respective parties. It is the valley of the M'Intyre Brook where it falls into the Severn.

No. 12.

Forbes David (now Forbes and Pinnock.)

Name of Run—Clifton.

Estimated Area—85,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—16,000 Sheep.

The Run is bounded on the north by a line of ridges dividing Haldon Creek from Emu and Eton Vale Creeks; on the east 1st by a line from a marked tree (P) where the road from Haldon to Eton Vale enters the forest to a marked grass tree on the bank of Haldon Creek about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles above the main road crossing place to a hill called Saddle Hill bearing about S.E.; on the south by a line of ridges dividing Haldon Creek from Dalrymple Creek; and on the (west?) by a line parallel to the River Condamine through a tree marked SK, on the bank of Haldon Creek about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the river; the Run extending on both sides of Haldon Creek and including all tributaries falling into it between its upper and lower boundary line.

N. B.—This Run has been transferred with the sanction of the Government to Messrs. Forbes and Pinnock, in whose names the Lease will accordingly be prepared.

No. 13.

Forbes Francis.

Name of Run—Ellangowan.

Estimated Area—44,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—12,000 Sheep.

Twelve miles on one side of the River Condamine, north side—from an S. K. tree bounding Mr. Forbes Run; and to the old sheep station on the north branch of the Condamine, bounding Mr. Coxen's Run, on the south side of the Condamine, 8 miles from a Waterhole bounding Mr. Gammie's Run, to a road known as Leslie's marked tree line, on Thane's Creek; 2 miles to a tree marked as Mr. Gammie's boundary. Note.—Half a mile of the Condamine with the back Run as usual, where Leslie's marked tree line comes in on the north side, and on the east side of the said line belongs to Captain Mallard.

No. 14.

Gammie George.

Name of Run—Talgai.

Estimated Area—60,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—16,000 Sheep.

On Dalrymple Creek, bounded by Messrs. Leslie Forbes, and Campbell; on Condamine River by Messrs. Hay and Fairholme, and Mr. Francis Forbes; on Thane's Creek by the Aberdeen Company and Mr. Francis Forbes.

No. 15.

Goggs Matthew.

Name of Run—Chinchilla.

Estimated Area—36,800 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2,500 Cattle.

Bounded on the south-east by Mr. Dennis' boundary, Koranga Creek; on the west by two trees marked G both sides the Condamine River; on the south-west by scrubs $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile back from the River; on the north-east by scrubs $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile back from the river, the lower 5 miles on the north-east of the river, by marked trees 8 miles up Charley's Creek; from a point of scrub coming in close to the river as per Leichardt's Chart.

No. 16.

Gore & Co. Messrs.

Name of Run—Yandilla.

Estimated Area—65,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2,000 Cattle, or 10,000 Sheep.

This run occupies in length 16 miles of the Condamine River, of which $9\frac{1}{2}$ miles is a dry bed; it commands an average extent of back run of $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles, including the right to 4 chains of waterholes, of which the water is permanent in none; the right of depasturing stock on 6 miles of the north branch of the Condamine belongs also to this run; this country being perfectly level cannot be indicated by other geographical features; this run begins from the lower boundary of the Licensed Run of Tummiaville, and at the lower extremity is bounded (by?) the Licensed Run in occupation of Henry Russell, Esq.

No. 17.

Gore St. John T.

Name of Run—Tummiaville.

Estimated Area—48,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2,500 Cattle.

This run extends along the River Condamine a distance of 15 miles, beginning at the crossing place of that river known as, "Mr. Leslie's old line," and ending at the upper boundary of the Yandilla Run, the Licensed station of the Messrs. Gore; it is bounded on the north-east by the north branch of the Condamine; the back run on the south-western bank of the river averages about 5 miles, comprising the creeks known as Anne's Creek, and Trelawney Creek, with 6 miles of Canal Creek, measured from its junction with the lagoon known as the Broadwater.

No. 18.

Gore St. George Richard.

Name of Run—Bodumba.

Estimated Area.—Not stated.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—8,000 Sheep.

Northern boundary, the ridge dividing Canal Creek, the run of J. P. Robinson, Esq., from Musquito Creek, Bodumba Creek, and the chain of Ponds; length 8 miles. Eastern boundary:—The ridge dividing chain of Ponds from the M'Intyre Brook, the run of Colin M'Leod, Esq., length 9 miles. Southern boundary:—A line running north-east from Mr. M'Leod's lower marked tree on the M'Intyre Brook, intersecting eastern boundary thence continued to the top of the ridge dividing Bodumba Creek from the Chain of Ponds and thence along that ridge until it intersects a line down at right angles with Musquito Creek through a point three miles below its junction with Bodumba Creek to the top of the ridge dividing Canning Creek (Captain Moffit's run) from Musquito Creek; length of southern boundary about 12 miles, western boundary the last mentioned ridge, length 15 miles.

No. 19.

Hay James.

Name of Run—Strath Millar.

Estimated Area—12,800 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—3,500 Sheep.

The south branch of Cunningham's Gap Creek from its source to its junction with the main creek with all its waters.

No. 20.

Hay William Leith, James Leith, and G. K. E. Fairholme.

Name of Run—Tulburra.

Estimated Area—60,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 Cattle, and 15,000 Sheep.

The Tulburra Run comprises the Country on the north side of the Condamine River, from a gully about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile below the Sheep Station known as "Campbell's Paling Yards," to a marked tree about $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles above the Head Station of Mr. George Gammie; also, the country on both sides of the Gap Creek from the junction of said Creek with the Condamine River up to a point known as "Point Look Out;" also, the country on the south side of the Condamine River from junction of said river with Sandy Creek, to a marked tree about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles above Mr. Gammie's Head Station, together with about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles of the S. W. side of Sandy Creek, from a marked tree to the junction of said Creek with Condamine River, and all tributaries of the Condamine between the said junction, and the before mentioned marked tree about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles above Mr. Gammie's Station. To the eastward the Tulburra Run is bounded by the Run occupied by Mr. Colin Campbell, to the northward and westward by the Run of Mr. George Gammie, and to the southward by the range of hills dividing the waters of the Condamine from those of Thane's Creek in the occupation of John Taylor, Esq.

No. 21.

Hughes & Isaac.

Name of Run—Gowrie.

Estimated Area—50,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—800 Cattle, and 8,000 Sheep.

Comprises the Gowrie Creek from its source to within one mile of its junction with Westbrook Creek; also, a small creek at the south from its rise to within one mile of its junction with Westbrook Creek and Oaky Creek, from two miles above the junction of Westbrook Creek to a line about seven miles up the Oaky Creek dividing it from Mr. C. W. Pitt's Station; also, the Boat Waterhole a tributary of the Oaky Creek; it is bounded on the east by the main dividing range; on the south and west by the Westbrook Station; and on the north by Mr. Pitt's Station.

No. 22.

Hughes and Isaac.

Name of Run—Westbrook.

Estimated Area—50,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—14,000 Sheep.

Comprises the shed of waters, forming the Westbrook Creek; from a stony gully about 1 mile from Drayton, and excepting one small creek on the northern side which is included in the Gowrie Run, to within 1 mile of its junction, to the junction with Oaky Creek; also that portion of Oaky Creek; from 2 miles above the junction of Westbrook; to a line 5 miles below the said junction dividing it from Messrs. Campbell and Andrews Station,

which forms the western boundary; on the south it is bounded by Mr. Whitting's Station, the unwatered ridges; on the east by Messrs. Crawford and Hodgson, Eton Vale; and on the north by Gowrie Station.

No. 23.

Innes Archibald Clunes.

Name of Run—Haldon.

Estimated Area—30,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—8,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the N.E. by the main range dividing the eastern from the western waters; bounded on the N.W. by a range dividing the Haldon waters from those running into the Eton Vale waters, the licensed Station of Campbell and Hodgson; bounded from N.W. to S.W. by a line drawn from some grass trees situated on the banks of the creek about 2 miles below the Head Station, which line divides the Haldon Run from the licensed Station of Messrs. Forbes and Pinnock; and bounded from S.W. to S.E. by the Haldon Creek, which is the boundary line between the Haldon Station and the late licensed Station of Mr. Joseph King, now Pinnock's called Pitton.

No. 24.

King Joseph, (now J. E. Barney.)

Name of Run—Kogan Creek.

Estimated Area—60,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—12,000 Sheep.

The Run comprises all the country shedding the waters into the Kogan Creek from their source to a line intersecting the creek about 3 miles from its junction with the "Condamine;" and is bounded on the west by the Run of Mr. James G. Ewer; on the east by the Run of Messrs. John and Alfred Crowder; and on the north by a line running parallel with the "Condamine," at a distance of 3 miles from the south-western banks of that river.

N. B.—This Run has been transferred with the sanction of the Government to Mr. J. E. Barney, in whose name the Lease will accordingly be prepared.

25.

Leslie Walter and George.

Name of Run—Canning Downs.

Estimated Area—96,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2,500 Cattle, 25,000 Sheep.

The Condamine River from its source to Mr. Colin Campbell's boundary, with all its waters from these sources to their junction, with the exception of the Rosenthal Creek, on which the boundary line is about $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile from its junction, denoted by a marked tree line; on the east side from the Creek to the top of the ridge dividing the Rosenthal Creek and Condamine waters; and on the west side by a marked tree line, down a gully which runs from the German's Scrub to the creek opposite the marked tree line on the east side; Mr. Colin Campbell's boundary above referred to, is on the south side of the Condamine, from the junction of a deep gully with the river, about 100 yards above what is called the Old Blacksmith's Hut to the nearest point of scrub, which line is also denoted by marked trees; on the north side, from the junction of a large gully at the point of the bight which forms what is called the Lower Paddock to the south-west point of scrub on Mount Sturt, the line being denoted by the said gully or watercourse, which commences on the head of what is called "Campbell's Little Plain," near Mount Sturt; and by a line drawn from the head of the watercourse to the point of scrub on the south-west shoulder of Mount Sturt.

No. 26.

Logan Robert.

Name of Run—Dunmore.

Estimated Area—53,760 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—10,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by the range dividing the waters of the Condamine, and the Moony Creek; on the south by the range dividing the waters of the western creek, from the Mooney; on the east by the ranges, the sources of the Mooney Creek; on the west by the unlocated land 14 miles down the Mooney.

No. 27.

Laidley James.

Name of Run—"Western Creek."

Estimated Area—40,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—Not given.

Comprises the heads of the said Creek and Country watered by them, down to a line dividing it from the run of J. Mackay.

No. 28.

M'Kenzie William.

Name of Run—Nundubpermere, (Monday Creek.)

Estimated Area—40,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—10,000 Sheep.

To the north-east, east, south-east, and south, the River Severn; to the north-west, the range dividing the eastern waters, from the western, falling into Pike's Creek; to the south-west the broken un-available country towards Mr. Wm. Morgan's Run, District of New England; to the north a range (four miles below the junction of Quart Pot Creek with the Severn,) running from the river on to the table land north-north-west.

No. 29.

Mallard Charles.

Name of Run—Peel's Plains, (Felton.)

Estimated Area—35,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—400 Cattle, and 8,000 Sheep.

A plain intersected by a creek bounded by the ridges on both sides turning the waters into the said creek, the Run commences at a grass tree gully (above a sheep station called "The Drummers") which divides it from the Run of Messrs. Crawford and Hodgson; the boundary line in this direction (the northern) between the two Stations consisting of the said grasstree gully and from where it cuts the creek, a line drawn eastward to a remarkable conical hill in the timber; the Run extends in a southerly and south-westerly direction to the River Condamine, being bounded on the western side by the Run of Mr. J. J. Whitting, called the "Back Ridges;" and on the eastern and south-eastern sides by the Runs of Messrs. David and Francis Forbes; the N. W. boundary on the Condamine River is at "Taylor's Crossing;" and the south-eastern boundary on the "Condamine" is at a point where the ridges dividing my Run from Mr. Francis Forbes join the river.

No. 30.

Marsh Matthew Henry.

Name of Run—Maryland.

Estimated Area—200,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—25,000 Sheep.

On the north being a line agreed on between myself and Mr. Bracker, by about 3 miles north of the great dividing range of the eastern and western

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waters; on the east by a spur of the said range between myself and Mr. Leslie, and by the impenetrable mountains of the Clarence Coast Range; on the south by a sandy desert Country between myself and Mr. Nicols' and Mr. Mackenzies Runs; and on the W. by the same description of sandy desert Country, between myself and Captain Pike's Run.

No. 31.

Moffatt Robert G., (per T. D. L. Moffatt.)

Name of Run—Canning Creek.

Estimated Area—80,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 Cattle, and 15,000 Sheep.

This Run comprises the waters of Canning Creek and its tributaries, to a line intersecting, forming the boundaries of Captains Collins and Dumaresq's Runs, within 5 miles of the M'Intyre Brook.

No. 32.

Pike John.

Name of Run—Pikedale.

Estimated Area—100,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—24,000 Sheep.

On Pike's Creek and its tributaries from their source, down to a line intersecting the Creek, at the boundary of Adolphus Trevathan's Run; being bounded on the north by the waters of Sandy Creek; on the east by the Folkstone Waters; on the west by the ridges of the M'Intyre Brook.

No. 33.

Pinnock Philip, (now John Gammie.)

Name of Run—Pilton.

Estimated Area—30,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—10,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by Major Innes' Station; on the east by the Main Range; on the south by Aberdeen Company's Station; and on the west by Messrs. Forbes and Pinnock.

N. B.—This Run has been transferred, with the sanction of the Government, to Mr. John Gammie, in whose name the Lease will accordingly be prepared.

No. 34.

Pitts Charles William.

Name of Run—Gonbunga, (Oakly Creek.)

Estimated Area—40,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—10,000 Sheep.

Situate on the heads of the Oakly Creek bounded on the east by the Main Range; west, by Messrs. Hughe's and Isaacs' boundary; south by Messrs. Hughe's and Isaacs' boundary; north by Main Range and Myall Creek.

No. 35.

Ramsay Robert.

Name of Run—Rosalie Plains.

Estimated Area—60,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—12,000 Sheep.

Situate on the Myall Creek; bounded on the north and south by dense scrub; on the east by the Main Range; and on the west by the Station occupied by Messrs. Campbell and Andrews, from which it is divided by a marked tree.

No. 36.

Richardson William.

Name of Run—Glencg.

Estimated Area—36,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 Cattle and 10,000 Sheep.

The boundaries are viz.:—On the north, a range dividing M'Intyre Brook from St. George Gore's

chain of Ponds, and extending between M'Intyre Brook and Canal Creek the run of (J. P. Robinson); on the east a range dividing the M'Intyre Brook from Thaness' Creek, and Sandy Creek the runs of J. Taylor, and part of Pike's Creek, the run of Capt. Pike; south a range dividing Glenelg run, from Trevestone's run which is on another branch of the M'Intyre Brook, south of Glenelg; on the west a line crossing M'Intyre Brook, in a N. W. and S. E. direction by compass, (at a marked tree near the Brook,) dividing Glenelg from Captain Collin's run. The country is hilly, very broken, and a great part not available for want of water.

Name of Run—Canal Creek.
Estimated Area—70,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—12,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by a line separating from Mr. Coxens' Run; on the east by a ridge dividing the waters of Thaness' Creek and Canal Creek; on the south by the range dividing the eastern from the western waters; and on the west by the stony ridges and the black swamp, running into Canal Creek, forming Mr. Gore's boundary; The entire of this Run with the exception of the upper part is intersected by belts of brush and scrub.

Name of Run—Greenbank.
Estimated Area—18,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—600 Cattle, and 4,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the east by Myall Creek; on the south by Mr. Wilkie's Run; on the west by Mr. Bell's Run; and on the north by Mr. Steven's Run, the only marks of the boundaries excepting the creek on the east being certain marked trees, which divide it from the other Runs.

Name of Run—Gladfield.
Estimated Area—14,400 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,500 Cattle.

Bounded on the north by a dividing range between the Goombuna and these waters; south by the main creek; east by the main dividing range; west by the boundary line of Colin Campbell.

Name of Run—Wanoo.
Estimated Area—30,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—8,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the north by Mr. Trevethan's Run; south by the main range between the Severn and M'Intyre Brook waters; east by Capt. Pike's; west by Capt. Collins.

No. 41.

Russell Henry Stuart.
Name of Run—Cecil Plains.
Estimated Area—61,440 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2500 Cattle, 10,000 Sheep.

Plain, level and unsheltered; for upwards of 20 miles without water; to the eastward sandy, dog wood, scantily watered ridges to the west and very scrubby; Messrs. Gore's station Yandilla, to the southward by a boundary line running E. and W.; the Aberdeen Company Station to the north by a

line running east and west; estimated extent of Run 12 miles frontage and 8 in breadth, which comprise some watercourses that hold no permanent water.

Name of Run—Myall Creek.
Estimated Area—32,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—640 Cattle.

Watered by Myall Creek, and extending 10 miles on the east and west on both sides of said creek; commencing at, and extending from the boundaries of the Aberdeen Company's and Ross' Stations, the southern boundary Aberdeen Company's boundary crossing place, Myall Creek, and a range of mountains unnamed the northern boundary.

Taylor John.
Name of Run—Rosenthal.
Estimated Area—80,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—25,000 Sheep.

Bounded on the east by the main road from Maryland running north, until that road crosses a gully about 2 miles from the crossing-place of the Bald Mountain Creek, where there is a marked tree line in a northerly direction, which strikes the Bald Mountain Creek about a mile above the junction of that creek with the Condamine River; on the north and west by a line, which commencing where the eastern boundary strikes the Bald Mountain Creek, and running westerly about $1\frac{1}{2}$ or 2 miles distant from the average course of the River Condamine, and striking the Sandy Creek at a marked tree about 5 miles from the junction of that creek with the river, crosses Sandy Creek, and takes a south-westerly course along the main range on the west side of the Sandy Creek, following that range for about 5 miles; then bears to the west, cutting Roger's Creek and Grey Mare's Creek at right angles, at a marked tree about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles distant from the Condamine River until it reaches a marked tree on the main range to the west of Grey Mare's Creek; then bears south, cutting Thaness' Creek at right angles, at a marked tree about 12 miles from its source, and following up the main range on the south-east side of Thaness' Creek; on the south by the range of mountains heading Thaness' Sandy Glen and Bald Mountain Creeks.

Name of Run—Goomburra.
Estimated Area—45,000 Acres.
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—300 Cattle, 10,000 Sheep.

The Goomburra Run comprises the two heads of Dalrymple Creek from their sources to the boundary line between Goomburra Run and the licensed Station of Mr. George Gammie, about 1 mile below the main line of road leading from Warwick to Camboya; the southern boundary of Goomburra Run is the ridge of hills between Dalrymple and Cunningham's Gap Creek, occupied by Mr. Neil Ross; the northern boundary is the ridge of hills between Dalrymple Creek, and Spring Creek, and Haldon Creek, the former occupied by Messrs. Forbe's and Pinnoek, the latter by Mr. John Gammie; the eastern boundary is the main range dividing the Districts of Moreton Bay and Darling Downs; the western boundary a line running north and south, or nearly so, from a marked tree on Dal-

rymple Creek, (about a mile below the road leading from Warwick to Camboya,) dividing the Goomburra Run from the Station occupied by Mr. George Gammie.

Name of Run—St. Ruth.

Estimated Area—80,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,800 Cattle.

St. Ruth is bounded on the south by a line commencing at a marked tree, on the west side of the Condamine River, about a $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile above the old St. Ruth Hut, and running west from that tree 4 miles thence by a line running south 13 miles to a point 4 miles due west from the junction of the Myall Creek with the Condamine; thence to a marked tree at the said junction, by an easterly line which crossing the Condamine follows up the Myall Creek to the crossing place of the road over that creek, and thence by a line running rather to the westward of south, cutting the Oaky Creek about 4 miles from the river and thence to a point lying 4 miles due east from the first mentioned marked tree, and from that point by a line running west to that tree. The above boundaries are supposed to include a sheet of water called "Broad Water," which belongs to the run and which lies on the western side of the "Condamine" about 4 miles to the west of the old St. Ruth Hut.

Commences at the lower boundary line of Captain Moffatt's Run on the said creek, and extends down to the boundary of the New England District, having on either side the fall of water into the aforesaid Creek.

Whitting Joshua John, (now D. Perrier.)

Name of Run—Beauraraba.

Estimated Area—50,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—10,000 Sheep.

Unwatered ridges, bounded on the north by Messrs. Campbell & Andrews; on the south by Messrs. Hodgson, Charles Mallard and Forbes; on the east by Messrs. Hughes and Isaac; on the west by Charles Coxens' Run.

N. B.—This Run has been transferred with the sanction of the Government to Mr. David Perrier, in whose name the Lease will accordingly be prepared.

No. 49.

Wilkie John P.

Name of Run—Monahan Creek, or Wilkie's Creek.

Estimated Area—60,000 Acres.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,300 Cattle.

Sixteen miles of Monahan's Creek, commencing on the west side at Mr. Colin M'Kenzie's east side line of Warra Warra Station, and bounded on the north by the south line of the Warra Warra and Jimbour Station, and also by the south of a Station occupied by Finlay Ross on the Condamine River, bounded on the east by a dense Brickalow Scrub, and the south by the ridges shedding the water to the northward into Monahan Creek or any part of it.
