CONVEYANCE OF MAILS, IN 1848.

TENDERS being required for conveyance of Post Office Mails, from and to the undermentioned places, as from 1st July to 31st December next; persons disposed to contract for providing the same, are invited to transmit their offers in writing to this office, by or before twelve o'clock of Friday the 16th day of June, endorsed "Tender for conveyance of Mails," viz:—

From and to Geelong and Lake Colac (south), by the Barwon Bridge, once a week.

From and to Bunneyong and Horsham, by way of Burn Bank or the Pyrenees police station, once a week.

From and to Kilmore and Maiden's Inn, at the junction of the Campaspie and Murray Rivers, once a week. The Banks of the Campaspie river to be entered upon as early as possible on way from Kilmore, and to be followed down to the Murray.

From and to Mount Macedon and Johnson's Inn on the Loddon River, by way of Mount Alexander and Hawkins' Inn, once a week.

From and to Melbourne and the Dandenong Bridge, by way of Brighton, once a week.

From and to Dandenong bridge and Aliberton, by way of the Forest Road (Tyer's cut) in Gipps Land to the Flooding Creek Police station, once a fortnight.

It is to be understood that the mails are to be dispatched on the days and hours to be fixed by the Chief Postmaster, as he may determine for the public convenience.

It will be optional with parties to offer for one or more of the above lines of stages and to propose the mode of conveyance; but on all roads where wheel vehicles can travel, a preference will be given to carriage conveyance, and the contractors will be held strictly bound to use the conveyance they propose, and to travel at the

rate agreed upon. The rate of travelling is not to be less than six miles per hour, including all stoppages. The contractors are to carry all bags and letters which may be delivered to them under authority of the Chief Postmaster, or any of the Postmasters, and to provide secure lockers for the mails in carriages, and dry coverings for the bags on horseback.

Contractors will be bound to prevent the conveyance of any letter or packet by any of their servants or passengers, or otherwise, to the prejudice of the Post-office Revenue, but all loose letters collected on the road are to be delivered up to the Postmaster at the first Post-office arrived at, under penalty of £5 for each and every offence.

Contractors will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after the specified time of starting; and to a like penalty for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival, except for the first five or ten minutes respectively.

Contractors will be strictly bound not to assign any portion of their contract without consent of the Chief Postmaster.

A mail cart or carriage, drawn only by one horse, must not carry more than one passenger; by two horses, not more than three passengers; and by three or more horses not more than six passengers, exclusive of the driver, under the penalty of £3 for each offence.

All vehicles and horses employed in the conveyance of mails are to be at all times subject to the inspection and approval, or rejection of the Chief Postmaster or other person appointed by him for that purpose.

The drivers and postmen are to be free men, and of certified good character.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement are to be deducted by the Chief Postmaster from the next quarterly instalment falling due to the contractor, and to be considered as over and above any penalties provided by any Act of Council.

Each party tendering, or an agent for him, must attend at this office on the day appointed for opening the tenders, and each tender must bear the signature of two respectable and solvent persons—engaging to enter into a bond with the contractor for the safety of the mails and the due performance of the contract and every stipulation therein.

The hours of starting from each Post-office, or stage, and other particulars may be ascertained at the Post Office, Melbourne, where parties proposing to tender are invited to seek information.

Printed forms of tender may be had on application at any Post Office.

ROADS.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, having deemed it expedient to open and make certain Parish Roads, in the District of Port Phillip, viz:—

1. New line of road from North Melbourne to the Village of Bulla, known as the Mount Macedon Road.
2. Proposed Keila, or Portland Road, from the Mount Macedon Road, to Keila Bridge.
3. Occupation Road, leading from the Mount Macedon Road to Taylor and Green's purchases in Bulla Bulla Parish.
4. The old Sydney or Pascoeville Road, leading from the Mount Macedon Road to the New Sydney Road.

Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of Governor and Council, 4th William IV., No. 11, intituled, "An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof," surveyings and tracings shewing the intended lines of the said Roads, are now deposited in the office of the Surveyor-General in Sydney, and of the Surveyor in charge at Melbourne. All persons interested therein are requested to transmit, in writing, addressed to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well grounded objection which may appear to them to exist to the formation of the said Roads

CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

(RENEWAL OF PASTURAGE LICENSES.)

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified for general information, that the state of the Survey not yet admitting of the issue of Leases for Runs beyond the Settled Districts, all existing licenses for the occupation of Crown Lands so situated, will be renewed for the ensuing year, commencing on the

1st July next, on the same terms as Licenses have been granted for the now current year, subject of course, to the adjustment of the License Fee according to the quantity of Stock returned by the Commissioner as depastured on every such Run.

2. Adverting to the 5th section of chapter II. of Her Majesty's Order in Council, dated 9th March, 1847, which declares that Leases of Runs issued thereunder will be absolutely and indefeasibly forfeited if the stipulated Rent be not paid within the time therein prescribed, his Excellency the Governor desires it to be distinctly understood, that claims to Leases will, in like manner, be held to have become forfeited and void, if the licenses for the continued occupation, for the ensuing year, of the Lands for which Leases are sought, shall not have been taken out within the time fixed by the present Notice, namely, between the 1st day of July, and the 30th day of September next.

3. If, within the year commencing the 1st July next, the Government shall be in a position to grant Leases of Runs under Her Majesty's Order in Council, any Licensee under this Notice who may obtain a Lease, will receive credit in the payment of his first year's rent, for so much of the amount paid for his License as may be proportionate to the unexpired part of the term for which the license was granted.

4. The present Regulation does not, however, extend to lands which have been brought by the Order in Council within the settled class, but which have hitherto been held under Squatting Licenses for pastoral purposes. The occupants of such lands will be enabled to obtain leases for the same, on the terms prescribed in sections 22, 23, and 24 of the Notice of 29th March last.
