CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

(TRANSFER OF RUNS.)

WITH reference to the Notice of 1st January, 1848, headed "Transfer of Runs," in which it is provided, that, "in consideration of the delay that must necessarily take place in the issue of Leases of Runs, demanded under the 11th section of chapter II of her Majesty's Order in Council, of the 9th March, 1847, any licensed occupant who, after having demanded his Lease, may desire to part with his interest in the same, will be allowed to have the Lease made out in favour of any person recommended by the Commissioner of the District, on making written application, in the manner in the said Notice prescribed, but that, in this case, the original applicant will be debarred from all further claim to the Lease, the right of which will be thenceforth held to be vested in the person in whose favour he requested that it should issue." His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified, that, in all cases in which Claimants of Leases of Runs shall have alienated their right thereto, under the provisions of the Notice above cited, the Licenses for such Runs for the ensuing year will be issued, not to the persons who previously held them, but to the proposed transferees.

**CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE
SETTLED DISTRICTS.**

(RENEWAL OF PASTURAGE LICENSES.)

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified for general information, that the state of the Survey not yet admitting of the issue of Leases for Runs beyond the Settled Districts, all existing licenses for the occupation of Crown Lands so situated, will be renewed for the ensuing year, commencing on the 1st July next, on the same terms as Licenses have been granted for the now current year, subject of course, to the adjustment of the License Fee according to the quantity of Stock returned by the Commissioner as depastured on every such Run.

2. Adverting to the 5th section of chapter II. of Her Majesty's Order in Council, dated 9th March, 1847, which declares that Leases of Runs issued thereunder will be absolutely and indefeasibly forfeited if the stipulated Rent be not paid within the time therein prescribed, his Excellency the Governor desires it to be distinctly understood, that claims to Leases will, in like manner, be held to have become forfeited and void, if the licenses for the continued occupation, for the ensuing year, of the Lands for which Leases are sought, shall not have been taken out within the time fixed by the present Notice, namely, between the 1st day of July, and the 30th day of September next.

3. If, within the year commencing the 1st July next, the Government shall be in a position to grant Leases of Runs under Her Majesty's Order in Council, any Licensee under this Notice who may obtain a Lease, will receive credit in the payment of his first year's rent, for so much of the amount paid for his License as may be proportionate to the unexpired part of the term for which the license was granted.

4. The present Regulation does not, however, extend to lands which have been brought by the Order in Council within the settled class, but which have hitherto been held under Squatting Licenses for pastoral purposes. The occupants of such lands will be enabled to obtain leases for the same, on the terms prescribed in sections 22, 23, and 24 of the Notice of 29th March last.

22. Lands which have been brought by the Order in Council within the settled class, but which have been hitherto held under Squatting Licenses for pastoral purposes, will be let to the present licensed occupants thereof, on yearly lease, at the fixed rent of One Pound per Section, so long as they shall not be required for sale or for any public purpose, or be applied for on lease by any holder of purchased land in the immediate neighbourhood. But whenever any holder of purchased land in the immediate neighbourhood shall either put forward his claim to the number of sections which he may be entitled to rent under the pre-emptive right conferred by clause 16 of these Regulations, or shall make

application for a Lease of any additional sections to be offered for sale by auction, such sections will not be relet to the previous occupant, but will be withdrawn from his holding, in order that they may be demised to the person claiming the exercise of his pre-emptive right respecting them, or be let by auction, as the case may be. In respect, however, to any sections thus taken out of the previous occupant's holding, in order that the leases of them may be offered for sale, such previous occupant will be allowed to continue to use them for pastoral purposes until the day of sale, and in the event of their not being then purchased, to renew his lease for the current year at the rate above mentioned.

23. Any lot of land within the meaning of the preceding clause, which may not have been chartered in sections in the Surveyor General's Office, will be let, until so chartered, to the present licensed occupant thereof in one block, the amount of rent being determined by the computed number of sections therein contained, according to an estimate to be submitted by the occupant, and approved by the Surveyor General, or the Surveyor in charge at Melbourne, accordingly as the lands may be situated in the Sydney or the Port Phillip District.

24. Of the class of Lands referred to in clause 22, no sections containing valuable improvements, nor any of the sections contiguous thereto, will, for the present, be open to Lease under these Regulations, to any other person than the present licensed occupants thereof.

OFFICIAL NOTICE.

Superintendent's Office,
July 10, 1848.

THE attention of the Superintendent has been called by the officers of Government in this division of the Colony to the recent revival of statements and insinuations, both anonymously and publicly set forth, most injurious to the character of the individuals pointed at, whoever they may be, and to that of the service to which they are attached.

The charge is that of habitual corruption in the discharge of official duty, and the reception of bribes.

Were it of a different character, the undisguised purpose of the promulgation of this charge at the present time, and the authority upon which it still rests, might perhaps justify its being allowed to pass without official notice.

Yet the Superintendent concurs with the gentlemen who have brought it directly under attention, that an opportunity should be taken, without delay, to make publicly known that unqualified contradiction of the truth of such statements and insinuations which has been at once offered to him by the entire body of principal Government Officers in the Port Phillip District, at this time within reach.

In doing this the Superintendent takes occasion to observe, however, that the community which intrusts the guardianship of its interests, and the repression of such abuse, whether real or supposed, to anonymous writers or the inuendoes of a newspaper paragraph, wrongs both itself and the Government; for that however jealous the Government may feel upon the point, mere anonymous attacks and statements affecting the character and conduct of its officers, cannot and will not be noticed.

That further serious investigation into official conduct, carrying with it, as it generally must, assumptions derogatory to character, and a certain degree of obloquy, cannot legitimately be founded upon the mere chit chat or the whispered scandal of the community.

The principles and regulations laid down by Government to prevent abuse of the character adverted to, are in every respect as stringent as can well be devised; in fact, far more so than many would consider either necessary, just, or reasonable towards the individuals in its employ.

Any infraction of these, or any indiscreet act, giving ground for misconstruction, or for a charge of mixing up private interests with the performance of official duty, must be committed at the peril of the individual implicated, be he who he may.

Lastly, it is as contrary to the principles and interests of Government to smother or deny investigation into the conduct of its officers, either when open charge of misconduct is adduced, or plain ground for its institution afforded; as it is certain that in no one instance whatsoever has such charge been brought forward in this District without immediate

steps being taken to investigate the truth.

Sir—We, the undersigned, Heads of Departments under the Government of Port Phillip, beg most respectfully to call your Honor's attention to a statement openly expressed at a public meeting recently held near the Court House, which we consider it our duty to rebut forthwith, deeply affecting as it does the character of every one of us as gentlemen and government officers, and disgracing us in the eyes of the whole people of the District, and of the neighboring Colonies.

The statement of which we complain is extracted as follows from the columns of the Port Phillip Gazette of Wednesday, the 5th ult.

(Here follows extract from the Port Phillip Gazette.)

General statements of this kind, pointing directly to none, and involving all, following, as it does, repeated accusations of a similar nature, in some of the public prints, which, from their anonymous character, we have been unable to notice, we feel called upon most emphatically to pronounce false and slanderous in the highest degree.

And we hereby most solemnly declare, upon our honor as gentlemen, that we have neither by ourselves, or through the medium of any one connected with us, or on our behalf; and, in fine, neither directly or indirectly, in any way, shape, or fashion, received, or allowed to be received, any bribe, present, or consideration whatever, for any thing done, or expected to be done, in our respective capacities as government officers, save only such fees as are duly authorised by law.

We have further to state, that whenever the slightest suspicion has existed of any mal-practises among the subordinates of our respective offices, the matter has been immediately reported, and as promptly most strictly investigated by your Honor.

We respectfully request your Honor to give the utmost publicity to this our refutation of slanders herein alluded to, and our anxiety to court the most rigid and public investigation of any charge that may be brought against us by any person who may drop his anonymous character.
