CHURCH OF ENGLAND GRANT— PORT PHILLIP DISTRICT.

THE description of the following Grant of Land which has been appropriated to the purposes of the Church of England, as hereunder more particularly mentioned, is published for general information, in order that the parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

At the expiration of one month from this date, if no caveat be lodged or other cause of uncertainty appear, the Deed of Grant thereof will be executed in favour of the approved Trustees, viz. :—

112. GEELONG, 2, Two acres, county of Grant, Parish of Corio, near Geelong; commencing at the south-west corner; and bounded on the west by a line bearing north 5 chains; on the north by the Wesleyan Burial Ground, containing 2 acres, being a line bearing east 4 chains; on the east by the Presbyterian Burial Ground, containing 2 acres, being a line bearing south 5 chains; and on the south by a line bearing west 4 chains.

ROADS.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, having deemed it expedient to open and make certain Parish Roads in the district of Port Phillip; viz:—

- 1.—From North Geelong to the bridge over the Moorabool River at Bates' Ford, being part of the Great Western Road.
- 2.—From Fyans' Ford at the Moorabool River, passing through the reserve for Police, and portions 1 and 2 of sections No. 14, in the parish of Moorparryal, in the County of Grant.
- 3.—Through sections 19 and 20 in the County of Grant, parish of Barrabool.

Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 4 William the 4th, No. 11, intituled, "An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the streets in the towns thereof," surveys and tracings shewing the intended lines of the said roads are now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General in Sydney, and that of the Surveyor in charge at Melbourne. All persons interested therein are requested to transmit in writing, addressed to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well grounded objection which may appear to them to exist to the formation of the said roads.

CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

CAUTION AGAINST UNAUTHORISED OCCUPATION.

THE recent Proclamation of three new Commissioners' Districts, namely the Burnett, the Maranba, and Wide Bay, having rendered a large extent of country available for occupation on the terms prescribed in Her Majesty's Order in Council of 9th March, 1847, and the local regulations founded thereon,—His Excellency the Governor deems the present a fitting opportunity for cautioning all persons who may take unauthorised possession of Ruas of Crown Land, that

although the Government may not find it practicable or expedient, to take immediate measures for the removal of persons who may form Stations beyond the limits assigned to existing Commissioners' Districts, and consequently beyond the range of authorised occupation, the holding of the Lands upon which such Stations may be formed will not be regarded as in any degree permissive; or as conferring on the occupants the slightest preferential claim to Leases of the Lands whenever they may be placed under the superintendence of a Commissioner. On the contrary, any improvements effected by such occupants, will be entirely at their own risk, and they will be liable at any moment to be summarily removed under the provisions of the Act of Parliament, 9 and 10 Victoria, cap. 104.

2. His Excellency the Governor is prohibited by Law from disposing of Lands in the unsettled and intermediate Districts, in any other manner than by public Tender. Whenever therefore a new Commissioner's District may be formed, the Lands therein comprised will be let to the persons making the highest Tender for them without any reference to the persons previously in occupation of them, or to the improvements effected by them.

3. It is also to be distinctly understood that any persons found in unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands, within any District to which a Commissioner has been appointed, will be immediately proceeded against under the provisions of the Act of Parliament above referred to.

CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

RUNS OF INSOLVENTS.

REFERRING to that portion of the Regulation of 1st January, 1848, headed "Transfer of Runs," in which it is stated that if a person who had a right to demand a Lease of a Run of Crown Lands in his occupation, under the terms of the 11th section of Chapter II. of Her Majesty's Order in Council of 9th March, 1847, shall have died or become insolvent without having exercised such right, the demand for the Lease will be received by the Government from his representative, or from any one coming forward on his representative's behalf. His Excellency the Governor deems it proper to caution the Assignees of Insolvent Estates that, in order to secure the rights of their constituents, they must in each case report without delay the sequestration of the Licensee's Estate, and prefer the necessary claims to the Leases of the Runs in his licensed occupation. 2.—Should the claim be admitted to be valid the Assignee can, at any time, subject to the approval of the Government, transfer his interest in the lease to the person who may become the purchaser of the run from the Insolvent Estate, by observing the formalities prescribed in the first paragraph of the notice of 1st January last, above referred to.
