ACTS OF COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, has intimated in his Despatch, under date the 29th February last, No. 36, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to approve and confirm the undermentioned Acts, passed by the Governor and Legislative Council in the 11th year of Her Majesty's reign, viz. :—

No. 41—"An Act to enable the Governor of the Colony to cancel appointments of places for holding Courts of Petty Sessions." (15th June, 1848.)
