CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

(RENEWAL OF PASTURAGE LICENSES.)

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified, for general information, that the state of the Survey not yet admitting of the issue of Leases for Runs beyond the Settled Districts, all existing Licenses for the occupation of Crown Lands so situated, will be renewed for the ensuing year, commencing on the 1st July next, on the same terms as Licenses have been granted for the now current year, subject of course to the adjustment of the License fee according to the quantity of Stock returned by the Commissioner as pastured on every such Run.

2. The Licenses must be taken out on or before the 30th day of September next.

3. If within the year commencing the 1st July next, the Governor shall be in a position to grant Leases of Runs under Her Majesty's Order in Council, any Licensee under this notice who may obtain a Lease will receive credit in the payment of his first year's rent, for so much of the amount paid for his License as may be proportionate to the unexpired part of the term for which the License was granted.

4. The present regulation does not extend to lands which have been brought by the Order in Council within the Settled Class, and which cannot now be held otherwise than under the Regulations of the 29th March, 1848.
