ADMISSION OF INSANE PERSONS INTO THE LUNATIC ASYLUM.

IN re-publishing the Notice from this Office, dated 16th December, 1848, respecting the admission into the Lunatic Asylum of persons of unsound mind, under the 11th section of the Act 7 Vict., No. 14, His Excellency the GOVERNOR desires to invite public attention to the provision contained in the recent Act 13 Vict., No. 3, to the effect, that in cases where the insane person has no relative or guardian in the Colony, or none accessible without inconvenient delay, any person or society under whose protection and care such insane person shall actually be, shall be deemed the guardian of such insane person for the purposes of the first mentioned enactment.

ADMISSION OF INSANE PERSONS INTO LUNATIC ASYLUM.

REFERRING to the notice from this Office, dated 1st January, 1844, respecting the course to be pursued by parties desirous of procuring the admission into the Lunatic Asylum of persons who are insane, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that under the 11th section of the Act of Council, 7 Victoria, No. 14, all applications of the above description must be accompanied by the following documents, viz. :—

(1).— A certificate in the form hereto annexed (A.) signed by two legally qualified Medical Practitioners, stating that they have examined the person and found him or her to be of unsound mind, and that they consider that such person will be benefitted by treatment in the Lunatic Asylum.

(2).— An application from one or more of the relatives or guardians of the insane person, in the form annexed (B.) which must be sanctioned by one of the Judges of the Supreme Court. For this purpose the application must be taken to the Prothonotary or Registrar of the Court or one of the Judges' Clerks.

2nd. In all applications of this nature the relationship in which the applicants stand to the insane persons must be distinctly stated; but in cases where the insane person has no relatives or guardians, the application may proceed from a Justice of the Peace, or from the Directors or Principal Officer of any public Charity.

3rd. The applications when sanctioned by one of the Judges, are to be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary.

4th. The charge for the maintenance in the Lunatic Asylum, of an insane person, male or female, is one shilling and four-pence per diem; and unless in the case of a pauper, the person seeking the admission of the insane person, will be required to furnish to the Visiting Justice of the Lunatic Asylum, an engagement from two responsible persons for the regular payment of this sum.

5th. If the application be for the admission of the insane person as a pauper, a certificate will be required, from some respectable person, known to the Government, to the effect, not only that such insane person is without funds for his or her maintenance, but that he or she is also without friends, who can reasonably be expected to maintain him or her.

CROWN LANDS

(IN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD OF SYDNEY.)

HIS Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct it to be notified that Mr. Simeon Henry Pearce has been appointed Bailiff for protecting the undermentioned Crown Lands, in the neighbourhood of Sydney, from the cutting of wood thereon, namely:—
