WITH reference to the Government Notice dated 19th March last, relative to the opening and making certain Parish Roads in the Hunter River Districts, Notice is hereby given, in conformity with the Act of Council, 4 William IV, No. 11, intituled, "*An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the streets in the Towns thereof,*" that after due consideration of all objections to the proposed line of Road from Muswellbrook to Merton, commencing at the centre of the Bridge crossing Muswellbrook, which have been transmitted in pursuance of the said Notice, and in conformity with the said Act, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to confirm the same; and it is therefore hereby declared expedient to open and make the said Road, according to the Map or Plan to be seen at the Office of the Surveyor General, and all persons intending to claim compensation in respect of the said line are hereby reminded that Notice must be served upon the Colonial Secretary *within forty days* from the date hereof, in such manner and forms as are provided by the sixth and thirty-second sections of the Act above referred to, or they will be for ever foreclosed from such claim.
