## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs the publication, for general information, of the following letter from Mr. Joseph Wilson, master of the "Prince of Wales," reporting the existence of a dangerous sunken rock, in the channel between Entrance and Little Woody Islands, leading from Cape York towards Endeavour Straits.

SIR,

I beg to inform you that a very dangerous sunken rock lies in a fair way in the channel between Entrance and Little Woody Islands, leading from Cape York towards Endeavour Straits. A vessel in company with me, passing close to the tide ripplings on it, struck, but came off again. It may be seen by a look-out from aloft by the ripple. I passed about half a cable's length inside, and shoaled from nine fathoms to five and a half, and deepened immediately to eight and nine fathoms. Not knowing my companion had struck, I took no notice of the bearings to depend on, and they were in such confusion on board the other vessel, as not to notice them. I shall feel obliged by your making this known, as many masters prefer that passage, it being laid down clear in Captain Blackwood's chart.

# CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

(RENEWAL OF PASTURAGE LICENSES.)

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified, for general information, that the state of the Survey not yet admitting of the issue of Leases for Runs beyond the Settled Districts, all existing Licenses for the occupation of Crown Lands so situated, will be renewed for the ensuing year, commencing on the 1st July next, on the same terms as Licenses have been granted for the now current year, subject of course to the adjustment of the License fee according to the quantity of Stock returned by the Commissioner as pastured on every such Run:

2. The Licenses must be taken out on or before the 30th day of September next.

3. If within the year commencing the 1st July next, the Governor shall be in a position to grant Leases of Runs under Her Majesty's Order in Council, any Licensee under this notice who may obtain a Lease will receive credit in the payment of his first year's rent, for so much of the amount paid for his License as may be proportionate to the unexpired part of the term for which the License was granted.

4. The present regulation does not extend to lands which have been brought by the Order in Council within the Settled Class, and which cannot now be held otherwise than under the Regulations of the 29th March, 1848.

# FERRY OVER THE HUME RIVER, AT ALBURY.

**T**HE Dues arising from the Ferry over the Hume River, at Albury, will be put up to auction, by the Clerk of Petty Sessions, of Albury, at the Police Office, Albury, on Wednesday, the 17th day of October next, at 12 o'clock, for twelve months, commencing 1st day of January, 1850.

The lessee will be required to provide a sufficient Ferry Boat and Punt, to convey at all times, passengers, horses, carriages, carts, &c., across the river, and keep the same in suitable repair at his own expense.

A bond (in double the amount of the rent,) with two responsible sureties, will be required for the due observance of the conditions of the lease, and the regular payment of the rent, by equal monthly instalments, before the expiration of seven days after the termination of each month, together with a warrant of attorney.

It is to be understood that the Mails are to be dispatched on the days and hours to be fixed by the Postmaster-General, either according to the present arrangement, or as he may afterwards determine for the public convenience.

It will be optional with parties to offer for one or more of the above lines of stages, and to propose the mode of conveyance; but on all roads where wheel vehicles can travel, a preference will be given to carriage conveyance, and the Contractors will be held strictly bound to use the conveyance they propose, and to travel at the rate agreed upon. The rate of travelling is not to be less than six miles per hour, including all stoppages. The Contractors are to carry all bags and letters which may be delivered to them under authority of the Postmaster-General, or any of the Postmasters, and to provide secure lockers for the Mails in carriages, and dry coverings for the bags on horseback.

Contractors will be bound to prevent the conveyance of any letter or packet, by any of their servants or passengers, or otherwise to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue, under penalty of £5 for each and every offence.

Contractors will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after the specified time of starting; and to a like penalty for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival, except for the first five or ten minutes respectively.

Contractors will be strictly bound not to assign any portion of their Contract without consent of the Postmaster-General.

A Mail Cart or Carriage, drawn only by one horse, must not carry more than one passenger; by two horses not more than three passengers, and by three or more horses, not more than six passengers, exclusive of the driver, under a penalty of £3 for each offence.

All vehicles and horses employed in the conveyance of Mails are to be at all times subject to the inspection and approval, or rejection of the Postmaster-General, or person appointed by him for that purpose.

The drivers and postmen are to be free men, and of certified good character.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement are to be deducted by the Postmaster-General, from the next quarterly instalment falling due to the Contractor, and to be considered as over and above any penalties provided by any Act of Council.

Each party tendering or an agent for him, must attend at this Office on the day appointed for opening the Tenders; and each Tender must bear the signature of two respectable and solvent persons, engaging to enter into a bond with the Contractor for the safety of the Mails, and the due performance of the Contract, and every stipulation therein.

The hours of starting from each Post Office or stage and other particulars, may be ascertained at the General Post Office, where parties proposing to Tender are invited to seek information.

Printed forms of Tender may be had on application at the General and all other Post Offices throughout the Colony.

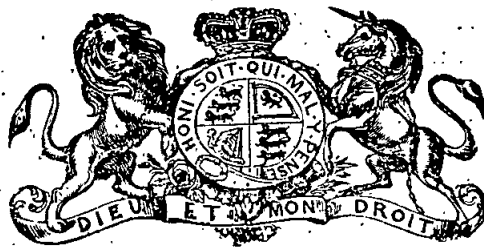

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that Tenders will be received at this Office, until 12 o'clock, of *Monday the 12th November next*, for furnishing, for the Colonial Service, in the several Districts, the supplies undermentioned, in such quantities as may be required, during Twelve Calendar Months, commencing 1st January, 1850, upon the conditions hereafter specified.

**PROVISIONS, AND OTHER ARTICLES.**

1. The Ration for Immigrants:—*For Male and Female Adults, of the age of 14 years and upwards daily*—16oz. wheat bread, 16oz. fresh meat, 16oz. potatoes or other vegetables, or when these are not obtainable, 8oz. wheat bread in lieu thereof,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap,  $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. oatmeal in lieu of meat if required. One half of the above quantities to Children of Immigrants, under 14 years of age.

2. The Ration for Prisoners of the Crown, and others in the employment of Colonial Departments, when authorised to receive it, with the exceptions specified in No. 3—20oz. wheat bread, 8oz. maize meal, 16oz. fresh meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, 1oz. sugar,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap.

3. The Ration to Officers in charge of Surveying parties, when in the field, and men composing such parties, and for Officers and Soldiers of the Mounted Police, and other Mounted parties, when required—24oz. flour, 16oz. fresh meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea,  $2\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tobacco,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap.

4. The Ration for wives of Soldiers of the Mounted Police—8oz. bread, 8oz. meat.

5. The Rations for children of soldiers of Mounted Police above seven years— $5\frac{1}{2}$ oz. of bread,  $5\frac{1}{2}$ oz. meat; under seven years, 4oz. of bread and 4oz. of meat.

6. To Prisoners confined in Gaol—12oz. wheat bread, 12oz. maize meal, 4oz. fresh meat, 8oz. vegetables,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap—(Ration No. 2 is issued to Gaol attendants, and to Witnesses and others awaiting bail; and if confined in solitary cells, Ration No. 8.)

7. To Children of Female Prisoners confined in Gaol—8oz. best wheat bread, 4oz. fresh meat, 1 pint milk,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. yellow soap.

8. Prisoners confined in Lock-up or Watch-houses—24oz. wheat bread or 20oz. flour—(Ration No. 2, is occasionally issued at Watch-houses to Prisoners of the Crown, when travelling from one station to another, and in other cases when sanctioned by a Magistrate.)

9. Forage for Horses and Oxen: 8lbs. maize or barley, or 10lbs. of oats, 4lbs. bran, 12lbs. oat or cultivated grass hay, and 4lbs. wheat straw, for each horse daily, and half that quantity for each bullock.

10. For the Light-house, South Head, and Floating-light, Sydney Harbour:—Best clarified sperm oil, per imperial gallon; patent wicks each.

11. Flour, bread, meat, tea, sugar, and tobacco, in such quantities as may be required, for deserving Mechanics and others in Colonial Establishments when authorised.

12. Fuel and Light:—Firewood per 100lbs.; Coals per ton, where they can be supplied at a cheaper rate than firewood; sperm oil, common oil, per imperial gallon; mould candles, dipt candles, cotton wick per lb.

13. To be delivered in Sydney, as required for the Public Service, when ordered:—Fresh beef, salt beef, salt pork; fresh mutton, maize meal, bread 1st, 2nd, and 3rd quality, ship biscuit, flour 1st, 2nd, and 3rd quality; arrowroot, sago, rice, tea, sugar, oatmeal, salt, yellow soap; pearl barley, tobacco, lard, candles mould and dipt, salt butter, gelatine; vegetables per lb.; milk, yeast, lime-juice, per quart; port wine, per dozen; rum, vinegar, per imperial gallon; roach lime, per bushel; straw for bedding, per 100lbs.

14. For the Lunatic Asylums at Tarban Creek, and Parramatta:—Fresh beef, fresh mutton, suet, wheat bread, bread of the 1st quality, flour, 1st quality, raisins, rice, tea, sugar, salt, pepper, per lb.; milk per quart; tobacco, soap, vegetables, per lb.; port wine per dozen; vinegar per gallon; sago, oatmeal, arrowroot, treacle, dipt candles, per lb.; common oil, per gallon; cotton wick, per lb.; forage, per ration, roach lime, per bushel; straw, firewood per 100lbs.; Coals per ton.

**PROTESTANT ORPHAN SCHOOL, PARRAMATTA.—**

**Daily Ration.**

1. To the Schoolmaster, and men employed as servants or laborers:—22 oz. flour, 16 oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{3}{4}$  oz. tea, 2 oz. sugar,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. soap.

2. To the Matron and female servants, entitled to Rations:—16 oz. flour, 12 oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. tea,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  oz. sugar,  $\frac{3}{4}$  oz. soap.

3. To the Male Children above 6 years of age:—On Holidays, 20 oz. flour, 12 oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{4}$  oz. tea,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. sugar,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. raisins or currants,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. suet,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. soap. On Thursdays, 16 oz. flour,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{4}$  oz. tea,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. sugar,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. raisins or currants,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. suet,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. soap. On other days, 16 oz. flour, 12 oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{4}$  oz. tea, 1 oz. sugar,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. soap.

4. To the Male Children, under 6 years of age:—On Holidays, 16 oz. flour, 4 oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{4}$  oz. tea,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. sugar; 1 oz. raisins or currants, 1 oz. suet,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. soap. On Thursdays, 12 oz. flour,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{4}$  oz. tea, 1 oz. sugar, 1 oz. raisins or currants, 1 oz. suet,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. soap. On other days, 12 oz. flour, 4 oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{4}$  oz. tea, 1 oz. of sugar,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. soap.

5. To the Female Children.—On Holidays, 16 oz. flour, 8 oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{4}$  oz. tea,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. sugar,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. raisins or currants,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. suet,  $\frac{3}{4}$  oz. soap. On Sundays and other days:—12 oz. flour, 8 oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{4}$  oz. tea, 1 oz. sugar,  $\frac{3}{4}$  oz. soap.

For Children under 7 years of age, best wheat bread is to be substituted, if required, in the proportion of 8 oz. of bread, for 12 oz. flour.

6. For the use of the Establishment:—4 pints of oil, 3 pints of vinegar.

7. Forage:—The same as No. 9 of the General Supplies.

Best wheat bread, flour, tea, sugar, salt, pearl barley, sago, rice, oatmeal, arrowroot, yeast, lard, candles, soap, vinegar, straw and firewood as required.

The Holidays are—New Year's day, Easter day, Christmas day, and the Queen's Birthday.

**INSTITUTION FOR DESTITUTE ROMAN CATHOLIC**

**CHILDREN, PARRAMATTA.—Daily Ration.**

1. To the Master, Schoolmaster, Storekeeper, and men employed as servants:—22oz. flour, 16oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt,  $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. tea, 2oz. sugar,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap.

2. To the Matron and female servants:—16oz. flour, 12oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea,  $2\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar,  $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. soap.

3. To the Male Children above 6 years of age:—On Holidays, 20oz. flour, 12oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea,  $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar,  $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. raisins or currants;  $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. suet,  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap. 4. To the Male Children under 6 years of age:—On Holidays, 16 oz. flour, 4 oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. tea,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. sugar, 1 oz. raisins or currants, 1 oz. suet,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. soap. On Thursdays, 12 oz. flour,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. tea, 1 oz. sugar, 1 oz. raisins or currants, 1 oz. suet,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. soap. On other days, 12 oz. flour, 4 oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. tea, 1 oz. sugar,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. soap.

5. To the Female Children:—On holidays, 16 oz. flour, 8 oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. tea,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. sugar,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. raisins or currants,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz. suet,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. soap. On Sundays and other days, 12 oz. flour, 8 oz. meat,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. salt,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. tea, 1 oz. sugar,  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. soap.

6. For the use of the Establishment:— $1\frac{1}{2}$  pint oil,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  pint of vinegar.

7. Milk and vegetables, for the Children, best wheat bread, flour, tea, sugar, salt, pearl barley, rice, oatmeal, arrowroot, sago, yeast, lard, common dipt candles, soap, vinegar, straw, and firewood, as required.

For children under 7 years of age:—Best wheat bread is to be substituted, if required, in the proportion of 8oz. of bread for 12oz. of flour.

The Districts numbered 1 to 17, and 19 to 32, are the Police Districts described in the Notices from this office, dated 15th, September, 1841, 9th August, 1842, and 25th March, 1845. Further particulars may be obtained from the several Police Magistrates and Benchmen.

Separate Tenders will be required for the forage in the District of Sydney, but the other supplies for that District are to be tendered for together.

The supplies for each of the other Districts, with the exception of those for the Protestant Orphan School, the Institution for Destitute Roman Catholic Children, and the Lunatic Asylums, are intended to be included in one Contract, and therefore no Tenders can be received, unless for supplying the whole that may be required in the entire of a District, and for each District there must be a separate Tender, excepting Hartley and Blackheath, and Yass, Gunning, and Narrawa, and Bathurst and Orange, for each of which places Tenders may be sent in separately.

#### CONDITIONS.

1. All the articles required by this Notice are to be of the best quality of their several kinds.

2. The Flour and Bread must be the produce of clean sound Colonial wheat, from which, when forming part of the Ration to Prisoners of the Crown; 10 per cent., and in all other cases, 20 per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Beef and Mutton to be issued in such proportions as may be required for the Ration to Immigrants, and when the quantity admits of it, this, as well as the Convict Ration of Beef, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately.

4. Beef to be issued to the Protestant Orphan School on five days, and Mutton on two days of the week, for the Boys; and for the Girls, Beef to be issued three days, and Mutton four days of the week.

5. The Maize Meal to be similar in quality to the Wheat Meal, and to be twice ground.

6. The Tobacco to be Colonial.

7. When it may be necessary to substitute one article for another, the following proportions are to be observed, viz:—1lb. wheat flour or 1lb. biscuit equal to  $1\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of bread; 1lb. salt Beef or 1lb. Mutton, or 10oz. salt Pork, equal to 1lb. of fresh Beef; 1lb. of Coal equal to 3lbs. of Firewood.

8. These substitutions are to be made only when required by the Officers authorised to draw the several Rations.

9. Hospital Bread is to be supplied to the Children of the Orphan School, and to the Institution for Destitute Roman Catholic Children, when required by the Surgeon, in lieu of the ordinary Ration.

10. Vegetables to be supplied in reasonable proportions of potatoes, greens, pumpkins, onions, &c., &c.

11. In case the whole Ration of Forage be not required or delivered, the several articles composing it are to be reckoned in the following proportions, and paid for accordingly, viz:—

The Maize or Barley, as 4-12; the Hay, as 5-12; the Bran, as 2-12; and the Straw, as 1-12 of the whole Ration respectively.

12. The Supplies for Immigrants in the Sydney District are to be delivered at such places in the City as may be required by the Agent for Immigration.

13. The supplies of Provisions, Fuel, and Light for the Penal Establishment at Cockatoo Island are to be delivered on the Island by the Contractors.

14. In respect of supplies for other services they are to be delivered at the nearest station, on the requisition of the Officer in charge.

15. The Tenders for Provisions and Forage, when required by Rations, according to the scale under their respective heads, are to express the price per Ration only.

16. The Tenders for Forage are not required to state the price of the Ration for Oxen, as when the latter is required, one-half of the allowance fixed for Horses will be drawn, and one-half the price allowed to the Contractor, whose engagement will be to provide for both Horses and Oxen.

17. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the party receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey, composed

by persons named by the Government, according to the practice of the service. But in country districts, where such a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, the party objecting will name one person as arbitrator, the Contractor or his agent another, and these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part,) concur in naming a third as umpire, who, in the event of the arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final.

18. If the board, arbitrators, or umpire shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing of which, it will be procured by the Department requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

19. In the event of any unnecessary delay, or failure of the Contractor to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured, and charged in like manner.

20. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from some other cause injury would be sustained, either by the parties to whom the Rations are due, or to the Contractor, by waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the Department, or Officer in charge of the party or parties for whom the Rations are to be received, shall have power to reject, at the place of delivery, such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality; it being distinctly understood, that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and that the Contractor will have a right to appeal to the Governor, although, in the meantime, he must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing of which it will be obtained by the Officer or party requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

21. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies or of any delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will also subject the Contractor, upon the Report of the Officer in charge of the parties or establishment, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account, as the Governor may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor, upon such repetition, to terminate the Contract forthwith.

22. Great inconvenience having been experienced in former years from the discontinuance of Contracts, under the option given after three months notice on either side, parties tendering will observe that no such power will be reserved in respect to the Contracts for 1850, but that the same will be for the full period of the year, whatever may be the fluctuations in the prices of provisions or otherwise.

23. The Contractor will be required to prepare his own cash account, monthly or quarterly, in the prescribed form; and on the production thereof, with the requisite vouchers, in a complete state to the Officer receiving the supplies, the same will be forwarded by the latter to the Auditor General, in order that a warrant may be prepared and payment made from the Colonial Treasury.

24. The value of all packages to be included in the prices demanded.

25. Printed forms of Tender may be obtained at this Office, or from the Police Magistrates or Benches of the several Districts; and at the foot

of every Tender, there must be a Memorandum, signed by the party tendering, and two responsible persons as sureties, agreeing to be responsible for the due performance of the Contract, in the event of the Tender being accepted, and undertaking in that event, that they will severally execute and deliver, within one month from the usual notification of acceptance, a bond to Her Majesty, for securing such performance, otherwise such Tender will not be taken into consideration.

26. The Tenders to contain the names of the Tenderers and their Sureties, and places of residence at length.

27. Each Tender must be in the form referred to in paragraph 25, and enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "*Tender for Provisions, &c.*"

28. Further particulars and information may be obtained on application at this Office, or to the Auditor General.

29. The Party tendering, or an Agent authorised in writing to act for him, is requested to attend at this Office, at the time appointed for receiving the Tenders, to afford such explanation or information as may be required.

These substitutions are to be made only when required by the Officers authorised to draw the several Rations.

6. The supplies are to be delivered at the nearest fixed Stations to the places where the party may be employed, on the requisition of the Officer in charge, and in case the whole ration of forage be not required or delivered the several articles composing it are to be reckoned in the following proportions, and paid for accordingly, viz. :—

The maize or barley as 4-12, the hay as 5-12, the bran as 2-12, and straw as 1-12 of the whole ration respectively.

7. The Tenders are to express the price per Ration only.

8. The Tenders for Forage are not required to state the price of the Ration for Oxen, as when the latter is required, one-half of the allowance fixed for Horses will be drawn, and one-half the price allowed to the Contractor, whose engagement will be to provide for both Horses and Oxen.

9. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the party receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided in the following way: the party objecting, will name one person as arbitrator, the Contractor or his Agent another, and these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part,) concur in naming a third as umpire, who, in the event of the arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final.

10. If the arbitrators or umpire, shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing of which, it will be procured by the party requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

11. In the event of any unnecessary delay, or failure of the Contractor to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured, and charged in like manner.

12. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from any other cause, injury would be sustained either by the parties to whom the Rations are due, or by the Contractor, by waiting for the decision of the arbitrators, the Officer in charge of the party or parties for whom the Rations are to be received, shall have power to reject at the place of delivery, such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality—it being distinctly understood, that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the Contractor will have a right to appeal to the Governor, although, in the mean time, he must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing of which, it will be obtained by the Officer or party requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of any delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will also subject the Contractor, upon the report of the Officer in charge of the parties, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account,

as the Governor may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor, upon such repetition, to terminate the Contract forthwith.

14. Great inconvenience having been experienced in former years from the discontinuance of Contracts, under the option given after three months' notice on either side, parties tendering, will observe that no such power will be reserved in respect to the Contracts for 1850, but that the same will be for the full period of the year, whatever may be the fluctuation in the prices of provisions or otherwise.

15. The Contractor will be required to prepare his own cash account, monthly or quarterly, in the prescribed form; and on the production thereof, with the requisite vouchers, in a complete state to the officer receiving the supplies, the same will be forwarded by the latter to the Auditor General, in order that a warrant may be prepared and payment made from the Colonial Treasury.

16. Printed forms of Tender may be obtained at this Office, from the Commandant of the Mounted Police, from the Commissioners of Crown Lands, and from the Benches of the several Districts; and at the foot of every Tender there must be a memorandum signed by the party tendering, and two responsible persons as sureties, agreeing to be responsible for the due performance of the Contract, in the event of the Tender being accepted, and undertaking in that event, that they will severally execute and deliver, within two months from the usual notification of acceptance, a Bond to Her Majesty in the penal Sum of One hundred pounds, for securing such performance, otherwise such Tender will not be taken into consideration.

17. The Tenders to contain the names of the Tenderers and their Sureties, and places of residence, at length.

18. Each Tender must be in the form referred to in paragraph 16, and is to be enclosed in a separate envelope, and marked "*Tender for provisions, &c, for Police Districts beyond the Settled Districts.*"

19. Further particulars and information may be obtained on application to this Office, or to the Auditor General.

20. The party Tendering, or an Agent authorised, in writing, to act for him, is requested to attend at this Office at the time appointed for receiving the Tenders, to afford such explanation or information as may be required.
