PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the thirteenth year of Her Majesty's [Reign, intituled, "*An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to the Distillation, Rectifying, and Compounding of Spirits, and to authorise and regulate the Warehousing under Bond, and the Exportation free of Duty, of Spirits distilled within the Colony of New South Wales, and to repeal certain Laws relating thereto,*" it was amongst other things enacted, that from and after the passing of the said Act it should not be lawful for any person, except as therein excepted, to carry on the business of a Distiller, or a Rectifier and Compounder of Spirits, or to have, keep, or make use of any still or other utensil for distilling, or for rectifying and compounding Spirits, except in such places as His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony should appoint or direct by Proclamation, to be published in the *New South Wales Government Gazette*, under a

penalty of not less than one hundred pounds, nor more than five hundred pounds: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, as such Governor as aforesaid, do by this my Proclamation hereby direct and appoint the premises known as the Glenmore Distillery, in the Police District of Sydney, to be a place at which the business of a Distiller may be carried on, under and subject to the provisions of the said recited Act.

**FERRY OVER THE RIVER HUNTER, AT
RAYMOND TERRACE.**

THE Dues arising from the Ferry on the River Hunter, at the Town of Raymond Terrace, will be put up to auction by the Clerk of Petty Sessions, at the Police Office, Raymond Terrace, on Wednesday, the 7th day of November next, at Twelve o'clock, for twelve months, commencing the 1st day of January, 1850.
