Name of Run—Wallonal.  
Estimated Area—15,000 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—800 Cattle.

Bounded on the north by the River Mehi, (commencing at James Cox's Station, Moree,) 6 miles; thence on the west and south by Bowman's Creek, which forms a natural boundary on these two sides; and thence on the east by the marked tree line dividing this station from the said James Cox's to the starting point.

Four miles on the eastern and eight on the western side of the Moonin Creek, is bounded on the west by Mr. Single's and O'Neil's Stations; on the south-west by a track known as Sir Thomas Mitchell's road; on the south-east by Mr. Thomas Brown's Millee Run; and on the north and east by Mr. James B. Bettington's Stations.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,000 Cattle.

On the east by the western boundary of John Larnach's Station, commencing 4 miles below Carbucky Old Hut; on the south by the Macintyre River; on the west by a line running due north from a point on the said river opposite to a marked tree on its southern bank, immediately above R. Pringle's Old Stockyard at Tarraba; and on the north by a line parallel to and 5 miles distant from the said river.

F. Beattie; on the north and north-east by land in the occupation of H. Dangar and J. Clives; on the north-east and north-west by land in the occupation of A. Bell; on the west by land in the occupation of John Eales; on the south by the river and land in the occupation of John Hoskinson, J. E. Gilman, and James Mitchell or Robert B. Otley.

The extent is about 15 miles, bounded by the River Gwyder, and varying from 6 to 11 miles to the back range of hills already mentioned.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,500 Cattle.

Bounded on the west by a line commencing at a watercourse about 3 miles south of Terrilla Creek, passing thence north through a marked tree on Terrilla Creek, about  $\frac{1}{2}$  a mile below its junction with Wallon Creek, and thence due north to a point 5 miles distant from the said marked tree, from thence on the north by a line of about 11 miles easterly, parallel to and 5 miles distant from Terrilla Creek, from thence by a line due south passing through a marked tree on Terrilla Creek, about 11 miles above the marked tree first mentioned to Wallon Creek, from thence by that creek to a point of scrub about a  $\frac{1}{4}$  of a mile below the point where the Medgun road to Welbon crosses that creek, and from thence by a line westerly to the commencing point; on the west by land in the occupation of G. M. Pitt; on the north by unoccupied Crown Lands; on the east by land in the occupation of C. J. Jolliffe; on the south by land in the occupation of Richard King and Robert Fitzgerald.

On the east by a north and south line cutting the Boomi Creek, at a point about two and a half miles west of Hypana Hut, being Robert Pringle's western boundary; on the north by Gnoma Gnoma Creek; on the west by a north and south line passing through the junction of that creek with the Macintyre River; and on the south by a line parallel to and two and a half miles southward distant from the Boomi Creek.

Wiseman John, now Thomas Cullen.  
Name of Run—Whaland.  
Estimated Area—50 square miles.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,500 Cattle.  
Whaland in the Gwyder District on the Whaland Creek or ponds; bounded on the east by Mr. Dine's station; on the north-west by Whiteman's Boomi station south by large plains without water. Nearly the whole of this station was under water during the floods of January, 1848.

Bounded on the north by John Eales, commencing at the Rocky crossing place, and running east about 9 miles, keeping the south side of the Dry Creek, which is the boundary between me and John Eales; then running south 5 miles to Darbys' Island; then west to the top of the Big Waterhole, on the water-mark; on the west by the Hawkesbury Benevolent Society's Run.

Bounded on the west by the River Balonne, from the Station occupied by Mr. Harvest Baldwin, to the marked tree at the Curry Waterhole, being the marked boundary of the Station of H. Dangar, Esq.; on the north by the said Station, about 8 miles on the east by an unwatered back country; and on the south by the Station of the said Mr. H. Baldwin.

Bounded on the east by Bundulla Creek; on the west by Bone Creek; on the north by the Licensed Station of N. S. Lawson, called Bone; on the south by Liverpool Range.

Name of Run—Quiangarra. (Goangra?)  
Estimated Area—45,000 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—800 Cattle.  
Bounded on the east by the River Namoi; on the west by Crown Lands; on the north by the licensed Station of Daniel M'Farlane, called Ulumbie; and on the south by the Licensed Station of Richardson, called Bungulgulla.

Cavan Henry.  
Name of Run—Wittenbra.  
Estimated Area—16,000 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—400 Cattle.  
Bounded on the north by Mr. Walker's Station, Baradeen; on the east by Mr. Evans' Station, Dandree; on the south by Mr. Brown's Station, Yarogen; and on the west side by Fitzsimmons'. Wittenbra is watered by Baromale Creek, and extends about 5 miles on both the east and west sides of said Creek.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,500 Cattle.  
Bounded on the north by a line running east 5 miles commencing from a point or bend in the Balonne River, indicated by Sir Thomas Mitchell's, No. VIII Camp; on the east by a line southwardly parallel to and about 5 miles distant from the Balonne River; on the south by a line running west to the said river, and to fall upon that stream at 2 miles below, and to include a large reach or pool called Karee; and on the west by the said Balonne River.

Name of Run—Mille or Coolga, (Warrien.)  
Estimated Area—22,400 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—1,000 Cattle.  
This Run is situated on the northern bank of the River "Namoi;" bounded on the east by the boundary line separating it from Mr. White's Run known as "Dreldool;" on the west by the boundary line dividing it from Messrs. Browne and Selwyn's Station known as Bucklebone; on the north by Waterless Plains; and on the south by the Namoi River. The country is of a level open flooded description, fitted only for depasturing horned cattle or horse stock; the eastern and western boundaries extend 5 miles, and the northern and southern boundaries 7 miles.

## No. 176.

Druitt George Executors of, (per George J. Druitt.)  
Name of Run—Gunnnoo or Brewareena West, (Goonoo.)  
Estimated Area—32,000 Acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—900 Cattle.  
This Run is situated on the western bank of the River Darling or Barwin, extending 10 miles long by 5 miles wide; bounded on the north by the boundary line separating it from Mr. Henry Cox's Station called Quantam Bone; on the south by the boundary line dividing it from the Run of Mr. William Lawson, senr., known as Moanha; on the west by large plains; and on the east by the Barwin or Darling River. The country is of open level, and flooded description, suited only for the depasturing of horned cattle or horse stock. Northern and southern boundaries extend 5 miles, eastern and western boundaries 10 miles.

Eather Thomas.  
Name of Run—Henryandie, (Ithuriniandie.)  
Estimated Area—5 miles by 3.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—68 Horses, 950 Cattle.  
Bounded on the south by Dr. Adam; north by Lady Jamieson; other sides by vacant ground.

Gordon W. F.  
Name of Run—Merrywymbone.  
Estimated Area—40,000 acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—800 Cattle.  
A flat country and badly watered, there is no back water; bounded on the east by Pokataroo, Reid's Station; west by Oreel, (Dangar's); north by Greenaway's Station; south by Pearce's Station.

## No. 179.

Lawson William, Senr.  
Name of Run—Cumbaderryderry.  
Estimated Area—40,000 acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—900 Cattle.  
Bounded on the south by the Barwan River, commencing at a known marked tree about 13 miles westerly; on the west by Ulah, a Station belonging to John Brown, Esq., being a line northerly about 5 miles; on the north by unlocated Government land, being a line bearing easterly 13 miles; on the east by a line running southerly to the commencing point.

Lawson William, Senior.  
Name of Run—Brewan.  
Estimated Area—32,000 acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—500 Cattle.  
Bounded on the north by the Barwan River, a distance of 10 miles; on the east by the western boundary of Mr. Nelson Lawson's Station, called Moorabie; on the west by a line 5 miles long, running south from a marked tree on the River, about  $\frac{1}{2}$  a mile above Mr. Parnell's hut, called "Wyaberie;" and on the south by a line 10 miles long, running parallel with, and 5 miles distant from the Barwan River.

Macdougall Thomas Ronald.  
Name of Run—Pialloway, or Mungie.  
Estimated Area—16,000 acres.  
Estimated Grazing Capabilities—300 Cattle.  
On the south-east, divided from Mr. George Curtis' Station, by a line 5 miles in extent, running north-east from a gap in the Backbay ranges, following the course of a small creek or gully to Pialloway Creek, which it cuts, and thence extending towards a hill in the Diver range, now called the Round Hill; thence on the north-east by a line 5 miles in extent, running along certain ranges in a north-west direction parallel with, and 3 miles distant from Pialloway Creek; thence on the north-west by a line 5 miles in extent, cutting Pialloway Creek, and running south-west to the Bald ridges; thence on the south-west by a line 5 miles in extent, running south-east parallel with, and 2 miles from Pialloway Creek to the gap in the Backbay ranges first mentioned.

Estimated Grazing Capabilities—2,720 Cattle.  
Wallala East.—Bounded on the south by the Hawkesbury Benevolent Society's run, by a line bearing west about nine miles through a point of the spring ridge; on the west by Windham's run, by a line bearing north of about eight miles to Lang's south-west corner; on the north by Lang's run by a line bearing east of about nine miles to the Mooki River; and on the east by about eight miles of the Mooki River. Wallala west.—Bounded on the

south by the Benevolent Society of Windsor now used as John Allen's Run by a line bearing east of about eight miles from the Mooki River to Weary's Mountain; on the east by Messrs. Bounded on the east by a line of trees marked GS; on the west by Mr. Edrop's station called Bungle; on the north by Mr. Fitzsimmon's station called Tharambone; and on the south by Mr. Chessborough's station Neabca; Wee Taliba is situated on a creek of that name, running into the Castlereagh River. The Run commencing at the Bungle waterhole, and extending five miles along the creek to the east.

Name of Run—Galaragamboomo.

Estimated Area—20,000 acres.
