PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

**A**LL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of public monies will pay over to the Colonial Treas-

suror, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each may be credited in the accounts of the year within which it was received.

The Heads of Departments and other Officers who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December to pay into the Colonial Treasury the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to the 31st proximo.

They will also as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith on the part of the Government officers concerned.

#### REWARD.—CONDITIONAL PARDON.

Eighty-nine acres, County of Cumberland, parish of Castlereagh, on the Nepean River; commencing at the south-east corner of Jacob Russell's 28 acres; and bounded on the west by that land northerly 40 chains 60 links to a Government road; on the north by that road bearing east 24 chains 32 links to W. N. Chapman's 1300 acres; on the east by W. N. Chapman's 1300 acres, southerly 31 chains 17 links to the Nepean River; and on the south by that river to the point of commencement.

*By deed dated 1st July, 1803, 50 acres of land were granted to Thomas Appledore, but the quantity appropriated is 100 acres. The deed is void for uncertainty in the description of the parcels, and for error in the area, provided it were originally intended to convey the whole 100 acres to Thomas Appledore, but Richard Appledore alleges that another deed of 50 acres for Appledore's children, ought also to have issued in 1803. If it can be proved that 50 acres out of the 100 acres were intended for Appledore's children, these claimants will be entitled to 39 acres only, out of the remaining 89 acres above described.*

Case No. 1291.—Jacob Russell, of the Nepean River.

Twenty-eight acres, County of Cumberland, parish of Castlereagh, on the Nepean River; commencing at the south-east corner of R. Westmore's 80 acres; and bounded on the west by that land northerly 42 chains 14 links to a Government road; on the north by that road bearing easterly 6 chains and 93 links to T. Appledore's 89 acres; on the east by the said T. Appledore's 89 acres, southerly 40 chains and 60 links to the Nepean River; and on the south by that river to the point of commencement.

*By deed dated 1st July, 1803, 50 acres of land were granted to Thomas Appledore, but the quantity appropriated is 100 acres. The deed is void for uncertainty in the description of the parcels and for error in the area, provided it were originally intended to convey the whole 100 acres to Thomas Appledore. On the 10th July,*

*1809, Thomas Appledore sold a portion of the land as above described, to Jacob Russell; a fresh deed being required by Appledore's representatives. See case No. 1290, A deed of this Russell's portion is likewise necessary.*




