OCCUPATION OF CROWN LANDS WITHIN THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

**R**EFERRING to the 9th clause of the Regulations for the occupation of Crown Lands within the Settled Districts, dated 29th March, 1848, which declares that leases obtained under those Regulations will not be assignable, nor shall any portion of the lands held thereunder, be assigned or sub-let, under penalty of absolute forfeiture of the lease, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified, that Leases obtained under the 22nd clause of the same Regulations of Lands brought by Her Majesty's order in Council within the Settled Class, but which were previously occupied under Squatting Licenses for pastoral purposes, may be transferred

as heretofore with the approval of the Government, notwithstanding the general provision against the assignment of leases contained in the 9th section of the Regulations as above quoted.

2. It is however to be clearly understood, that the sub-letting or the transfer of portions only of the holdings to which this rule refers, will not be allowed, and that the rule is applicable only to the particular class of Lands above described.
