FLOATING LIGHTS IN THE PRINCE'S CHANNEL.

*Trinity House,
London, 22nd August, 1848.*

NOTICE is hereby given, that in compliance with the request of numerous owners and masters of Vessels, and other persons using or interested in the navigation between the North Foreland and the

Nore, two floating light vessels are about to be placed in the Prince's Channel, the lights on board of which will be first exhibited on the evening of Sunday, the 1st day of October next, and thenceforth continued every night from sun-set to sun-rise.

Mariners are to observe, that one of these vessels will be moored in the eastern part of the said Channel near to the East Tongue Land, and will exhibit two lights, one at the mast-head which will be white, and one at a lower elevation which will be colored red.

The other vessel will be placed at the western end of the said channel, near to the Girdler Land, and will exhibit one bright revolving light.

Further particulars, in relation to the exact position of these respective vessels, will be published in due course.
