## EXPLORATORY EXPEDITION UNDER THE LATE MR. KENNEDY.

T is with the utmost regret, that the Govern-L menthas to announce an official confirmation of the melancholy accounts which have been received of the result of the expedition undertaken by the late Mr. Assistant Surveyor Edmund B. Kennedy, for the exploration of the country lying between Rockingham Bay and Cape York, in which the lives of the able and gallant leader and nine of his party were unfortunately sacrificed. It is hoped that from the documents which have been preserved a narrative of the expedition may be compiled, for publication at a future date; but the Government desires to record, without delay, the high sense which it entertains of the untiring zeal and inflexible courage manifested by Mr. Kennedy, under the circumstances of great difficulty and peril by which he appears to have been surrounded, especially during the latter part of his journey. The indefatigable exertions he made, faithfully and zealously to carry out the objects of the expedition, no less than the great personal risk to which he exposed himself, in endeavouring to procure relief for the unfortunate individuals of his party, whom he found it necessary, from their helpless and exhausted condition. to leave at Weymouth Bay and Shelbourne Bay, would have entitled him, had he survived, to the warmest thanks of the Government; as it is, his noble exertions have called forth its highest admiration, and it is not doubted that the deep sympathy which is felt for his sudden and premature death, at a time too when he was on the very eve of overcoming the greatest difficulties of his position, is warmly participated in bythe whole of this community. By this calamitous and distressing event the Public Service has been deprived of one of its most zealous and efficient officers.

The Government has also to regret the loss of Mr. Wall, who was employed as naturalist to the expedition, and of the other individuals who unfortunately lost their lives while assisting to carry out its objects.

It would not be proper to conclude this notice without adverting to the zealous assistance rendered to the expedition by one of the survivors, Mr. W. Caron who was employed as Botanist, and the enduring patience which he evinced under circumstances of great trial when left in charge of the party at Weymouth Bay. Nor would it be just that the faithful services rendered to his late unfortunate master, by the Aboriginal native Jacky Jacky, should be passed over without an expression of admiration of the great courage he displayed in defending him to the utmost of his power, when attacked by the ferocious tribe of savages who murdered him, and the devoted attachment which he manifested towards him in his dying moments. His simple and affecting narrative of these melancholy events, which has recently been published, shows him to be possessed, in a high degree, of some of the best qualities of our common nature.
