VACCINATION.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has directed the re-publication of the Notice of 11th January, 1847, with a view of drawing the attention of Parents and Guardians to the importance of Vaccination.

VACCINATION.

HIS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a Vaccine Institution has been established in Sydney, and that Dr. Savage, the Health Officer, has been appointed to carry out the objects of the Institution.

His Excellency further directs it to be notified, that Dr. Savage will be in attendance at the Immigration Barracks, Bent-street, between the hours of 10 and 12 o'clock on every Tuesday and Saturday to Vaccinate, free of charge, such children as may be taken to him for the purpose. But as the operation itself, without any proof of its having taken effect, would be insufficient security to the public mind, His Excellency has been pleased to direct, that the sum of one shilling shall be deposited for every child Vaccinated, which sum will be returned on the presentation of the child on the next vaccination day.

His Excellency very strongly recommends Parents and Guardians to avail themselves of the means thus afforded to them of taking this necessary and proper precaution with respect to all children not already vaccinated.

In order that a constant supply may be kept up throughout the Colony, the Health Officer will furnish lymph to any Medical Practitioners in the Country Districts who may apply for the same.

All communications with that Officer on the subject of Vaccination, sent through the Post Office, must be enclosed under cover to the Colonial Secretary, with the word "Vaccination" on the lower left hand corner of the envelope.

REWARDS.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the night of the 31st ultimo, two prisoners, named William Davis, per "Mandarin," 1843, and Thomas Morrison, per "Countess Harcourt," 1827, whose personal descriptions are hereunder given, effected their escape from Her Majesty's Gaol at Darlinghurst; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that a reward of ten pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may within six months from the present date give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and lodging in safe custody of either of these prisoners, and that if the person giving such information be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to such Prisoner of the Crown of a Conditional Pardon.

William Davis, per "Mandarin," 1843, arrived free at Port Phillip; native place, Staffordshire; occupation, seaman; age, 19 years; height, 5 feet 1½ inches; make, slight and inclined to stoop; sharp features; complexion, fresh; hair, light brown; eyes, hazel.

The stoop is more in the neck than on the back of the head protrudes. Convicted at Melbourne, on assault, with intent, &c., on December 18th, 1847, and sentenced 3 years labour on roads.

Thomas Morrison, per "Countess Harcourt," 1827, bond; native place, Belfast; occupation, laborer; age, 35 years, but looks more; height, 5 feet 5½ inches; make, stout, square shoulders; complex-

ion, pale, from confinement; forehead, wrinkled; broad flat face, with heavy eyebrows; eyes, grey; hair, dark brown; no whiskers; speaks with a peculiar hollow voice. Sentence, transportation for life; commuted to 10 years labor on roads.

RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS, 1849.

NEW SOUTH WALES,
(TO WIT.)

The fourth day of April, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Our Lady the Queen, intituled, "An Act to regulate

the admission, in certain cases, of Barristers of the Supreme Court of New South Wales," after reciting that it was expedient to make provision, in certain cases, for the admission of properly qualified persons to practise as Barristers of the Supreme Court of New South Wales—

It is enacted, that the Judges of the Supreme Court at Sydney, the Attorney General for the time being, and two Barristers of the Supreme Court, to be annually elected in the month of December for the year then ensuing, by the practising Barristers of the said Court, should form a Board for the approval of properly qualified persons to be Barristers of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, and that the said Board should from time to time, as might appear to them to be expedient, make and promulgate rules for the examination of candidates in the ancient classics, both Greek and Latin, in Mathematics, in Law, and in such other branches of knowledge as they should deem meet; and that the said Board might, from time to time, depute the examination of such candidates to such persons as they should consider competent to examine such candidates, subject to the payment of such reasonable fees to the examiners respectively, as the said Board should order to be paid by such candidates.

We, the Judges, and Attorney General aforesaid, with William Foster, Esquire, and Edward Broadhurst, Esquire, being the Barristers elected according to the said Act, in the month of December last, do in pursuance of the said Act, make and promulgate the following Rules for the examination of Candidates applying to be admitted as Barristers of the Supreme Court of New South Wales during the present year.

1. The examinations in Law shall be conducted at present by the Board.

2. The examinations in Classics, Mathematics, and History, shall be conducted by two Examiners to be previously appointed by the Board for that purpose.

3. The Board shall meet on the first Saturday in every term to consider the applications, and proceed to the examination of Candidates; and such meeting shall be adjourned from time to time as may be found necessary.

4. The Examiners so appointed shall meet in Sydney, for the examination of Candidates on Thursday, in the second week of Term, at such place and hour as they shall determine; of which hour and place they shall give three clear days' notice to the Prothonotary, and they shall have power to adjourn from time to time if found necessary.

5. Every Candidate shall give written notice to the Board, (through the Attorney General,) ten clear days before the first day of Term, of his intention to apply to be admitted a Barrister:—and he shall cause a similar notice, with reference to two or more persons respecting his character, to be sent at the same time to the Master in Equity, and to the Prothonotary, respectively.

6. The Board shall meet on the third Wednesday in each Term, to determine as to the admission of the Candidates; and it shall then, or on some day of adjournment, consider the examination papers of such Candidates, and decide on their admission or rejection.

7. Every such admission shall be on the last day of the Term, in which the Candidates shall have been examined.

8. The examinations shall severally be by questions in writing, to be given to the Candidate, and answered by him, in the presence of the Board, or of not less than two of them; or of the Examiners appointed by the Board;—and not more than two hours shall be allowed to any Candidate for answering one Examination Paper.

9. The answers shall be in writing, and signed by the Candidate; and such as were before the said Examiners shall be reported upon by them, and then put under seal, and forwarded with the Examination Papers to the Chief Justice for consideration, with all the other Examination Papers, at the next meeting of the Board.

10. The several examinations shall be with reference to Books, to be from time to time specified by the Board; and such Books, for the present, and until further orders, shall be the following:—

(1.) In Law; Stephen's Commentaries, books 2 and 3, Phillips on Evidence, Stephen on Pleading, Archbold's Practice, book 4, and Selwyn's Nisi Prius, with the exception of the several titles, bills of exchange, bankrupt, rescous, tithes, fishery, insurance, game, quo warranto, mandamus, and common.

(2.) In the Classics; Cicero de Officiis, books 1 and 2, the three first books of the *Æneid*; and in Greek, the Gospel of St. John, and the first book of the *Iliad*.

(3.) In Mathematics, the first four books of Euclid, and Algebra as far as Quadratic Equations inclusive.

(4.) In History, Hallam's Constitutional History, and the concluding chapter of Stephen's commentaries.

11. Each of the Examiners appointed by the Board shall be paid, by each Candidate, a fee of Ten Guineas for his Examination, and the Report thereon;—such fees to be paid into the hand of the Prothonotary for the Examiners, on or before the first day of the Term in which such examination is to take place.
