HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, has intimated in his Despatches under dates respectively the 20th and 27th November last, Nos. 193 and 205, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to approve and confirm the undermentioned Acts passed by the Governor and Legislative Council, in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's reign, viz. :—

11TH VICTORIA.

- No. 3.—“An Act for the Regulation of Steam Navigation, and for requiring sea-going vessels to carry boats.” (24th July, 1847.)
