SYDNEY STREETS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, having deemed it expedient to continue certain streets, and also to open other streets within the City of Sydney: Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 4th William IV., No. 11, intituled, "*An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the streets in the Towns thereof,*" a survey and tracing, shewing the intended line of the said streets, are now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General, and all persons interested therein, are requested to transmit in writing to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well grounded objection which may exist to the continuation and formation of the said streets, namely:—

- 1.—Elizabeth-street south from Campbell-street, to the City boundary.
- 2.—Albion-street from Elizabeth-street, to the west boundary of the Riley Estate, and from the west boundary of that estate to Riley-street.
- 3.—Cooper-street from Elizabeth-street, to Riley-street.
- 4.—Devonshire-street from Elizabeth-street, to Crown-street.

**TEN POUNDS REWARD, OR A CON-
DITIONAL PARDON.**

**TWENTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A
