CAVEATS AGAINST CLAIMS TO LEASES.

Superintendent's Office,
Melbourne, 4th April, 1849.

WITH reference to the several Notices in the "Government Gazette," publishing Claims to Leases of Runs beyond the Settled Districts it is hereby notified, for the information of all parties interested, that Caveats have been received against the claims specified in the accompanying list.

2. It is to be understood that no new Caveats, having reference to demands already advertised, will be received after the present date, except for special cause shewn.

3. Parties interested will be allowed personal access, if they so desire it, to the Caveats already lodged, on application at this office.

4. Any Caveat may be withdrawn by the party lodging it on a written application being made to that effect, the signature to such application being attested by a Justice of the Peace, or a Commissioner of the Supreme Court.

5. If within two months from the present date the Caveat in any case shall not be withdrawn, as above, the demand to which it relates will be referred for the investigation of a Commissioner, appointed under the Act of Council 11 Vic., No. 61, and the parties subjected to the expense of that proceeding.

Whereas by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies, and to make further provision for the management thereof," after reciting that it might be expedient that various Rules and Regulations should be made respecting the division of the said Colonies into Districts within which alone the Demises or Licenses mentioned in the said Act might be made to take effect; it was enacted, that it should be lawful for her Majesty, by any Order or Orders in Council to make and establish all such Rules and Regulations as aforesaid, as to her Majesty should seem meet; and any such Rules and Regulations again to repeal, renew, alter and amend; and that all such Orders in Council should have the force and effect of laws in the said Australian Colonies.

And whereas by an order in Council made in pursuance of the powers given by the said Act, it was ordered that the Lands in the Colony of New South Wales should, for the purpose of the said Order, be considered as divided into three classes, and be dealt with accordingly as they might be situated, in Districts to be denominated respectively as the Settled, the Intermediate, and the Unsettled Districts, and it was ordered that the Settled Districts should comprehend certain Lands therein mentioned.

And whereas it is expedient to include within the said Settled Districts, certain Lands not already included within the same.

It is therefore hereby ordered, by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice of her Privy Council, that from and after the proclamation of this Order in the said Colony, and the lapse of six months next, after this Order shall have been laid before Parliament, the said Settled Districts shall comprehend, in addition to the Lands already comprehended therein, the following Lands, viz:—

- 1st. The Lands which may be within the distance of 10 miles from a point to be specified by the Governor in the Town or Township of Belfast, in the District of Port Phillip.
