### LAND AND IMMIGRATION DEBENTURES.

SEALED Tenders will be received at this Office until noon of Monday, the 30th June next, from persons desirous of advancing the whole or any portion of the sum of twenty-five thousand pounds on the following security, and subject to the undermentioned terms and conditions, viz. —

- (1.) Each tender must be for an even sum of hundreds of pounds, and must be endorsed "Tender for Debentures."
- (2.) If the tender be accepted, Land and Immigration Debentures for £100 each, secured under the authority of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, conveyed to His Excellency the Governor in a Despatch, dated 30th August, 1847, No. 212; upon the Territorial Revenue of the Port Phillip District, will be issued for the sum advanced, and will bear interest at the rate of 3½d. per diem, or £4 18s. 10½d. per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly on the 1st of January and 1st of July.
- (3.) They will be receivable as cash at any time for the purchase of Crown Lands in the Port Phillip District, or for any other payment due on account of the Territorial Revenue within the same.

**CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.**

(RENEWAL OF PASTURAGE LICENSES.)

**H**IS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified, for general information, that the state of the Survey not yet admitting of the issue of Leases for Runs beyond the settled districts, all existing licenses for the occupation of Crown lands so situated, will be renewed for the ensuing year, commencing on the 1st July next, on the same terms as licenses have been granted for the now current year, subject of course to the adjustment of the license fee according to the quantity of stock returned by the Commissioner as pastured on every such run.

2. The licenses must be taken out on or before the 30th day of September next.

3. If within the year commencing the 1st July next, the Governor shall be in position to grant leases of runs under Her Majesty's Order in Council, any licensee under this notice who may obtain a lease will receive credit in the payment of his first year's rent, for so much of the amount paid for his license as may be proportionate to the unexpired part of the term for which the license was granted.

3. The present regulation does not extend to land which have been brought by the Order in Council within the settled class, and which cannot now be held otherwise than under the regulations of the 29th March, 1849.

**VACATED RUNS.**

**I**T is hereby notified, that application having been made for the purchase of the leases of the runs of Crown lands hereunder described, which after having been occupied, have become vacant, Tenders, in the prescribed printed form, will be received at the office of His Honor the Superintendent, Port Phillip, until noon of Monday, the 6th day of August next, from the applicants and from any other persons desirous to enter into competition with them, for the purchase of the lease of the said runs.

2. Every such tender must state the term of years (not exceeding fourteen,) for which it is proposed to take the run, and whether in addition to the minimum rent required by Her Majesty's Order in

Council, it is intended to offer any, and if any, what amount of yearly premium per thousand sheep, or equivalent number of cattle for the lease.

3. As the grazing capabilities of the run have not yet been determined, it will be necessary that each tender contain an estimate of the number of sheep or cattle that the run will carry.

4. Until the run has been regularly surveyed and its grazing capabilities determined, the future lessee will be required to pay rent according to his own estimate, as given in his tender; and in the event of the rent so paid, proving to have been less than that determined by valuation, he will be required to make up the difference previously to the execution of the lease.

5. It is also to be distinctly understood, that the Government reserves to itself the right of excluding from the lease of the run, any land which it may be deemed proper to reserve for any of the purposes referred to in the 9th section of Chapter II, of Her Majesty's Order in Council, dated 9th March, 1847.

6. Forms of tender can be obtained from the office of His Honor the Superintendent, Port Phillip, and also from the Crown Commissioners of the districts.

#### MURRAY DISTRICT.
