**OCCUPATION OF CROWN LANDS  
WITHIN THE SETTLED DIS-  
TRICTS.**

**H**IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication of the undermentioned descriptions of the boundaries of the area which, in the case of the City of Melbourne and the Town of Geelong, respectively, will under the Sixth clause, be excepted from the operation of the Regulations of the 29th March, 1848: And notice is hereby further given, that the timber situated thereon is reserved for public use, and, consequently, that it will not, in future, be permitted to any one, to cut either timber or firewood, on the portions of land as aforesaid, namely:—

*Five mile boundary around the City of Melbourne.*

A line drawn from a point on the shores of Port Phillip Bay, in the parish of Truganini, distant five miles from the south-west corner of the corporate limits of the City of Melbourne, running northwards until it meets the western boundary line of section No. 5, in the parish of Cut Paw Paw; thence northward, along the section line, to the north-east corner of section 19, in the same parish; thence by a line drawn at a distance of five miles from the north-west corner of the corporate limits of the said city, until it meets the north-west corner of Thomas Walker's 930 acres, in the parish of Will Will Rook, continuing thence eastward, along the section lines which

form the northern boundary of Thomas Walker's 930 acres, in the said parish, and Sylvester John Brown's 990 acres, in the parish of Keelbundora, and parallel with the northern limits of the said city; thence by a line in the south-east direction, at a distance of five miles from a point in the corporate limits of the City of Melbourne, being the south-east corner of Henry Ward Mason's 132 acres in the parish of Jika Jika, until it meets the prolongation southwards of the section line forming the eastern boundary of portion No. 1 in the parish Bulleen (being part of Unwin's special survey) thence running south along that section line, and distant five miles from the eastern boundary of the said City of Melbourne, crossing the Kooyong Koot Creek to the first section line north of Dendy's special survey; thence by a line in a south-west direction to the shores of Port Phillip Bay, at a distance of five miles from the south-east corner of the corporate limits of the said city; thence by the shore of Port Phillip Bay to the commencing point.

*Two mile boundary around the Township of Geelong.*

Bounded by a line, drawn from a point on the eastern shores of Corio Bay, near Point Henry, at a distance of 2 miles from the north-east corner of the Township of Geelong, as a centre, bearing southerly to a point bearing east from the said corner; thence by a line south, crossing a small portion of Corio Bay, parallel with, and at a distance of 2 miles from the eastern

boundary of said Township, to a point bearing east from the south-east corner of the said Township of Geelong; thence by a line drawn westerly at a distance of 2 miles from the southern boundary of the said Township, crossing the Barwon River, and Waurin Chain of Ponds to a point two miles west of the south-west corner of said Township; thence by a line bearing north parallel with, and at a distance of 2 miles from the western boundary of said Township of Geelong to a point bearing west from the north-west corner of said Township; thence by a line drawn at a distance of 2 miles from the north-west corner of said Township, as a centre to the western shore of Corio Bay, near Cowie's Creek.

- 1 dark brown mare, R near shoulder
- 1 dark bay horse, switch tail, JH conjoined near shoulder
- 1 dark brown pony mare, strap on her neck, GS both shoulders
- 1 black colt, no perceptible brand
- 1 bay horse, star in forehead, blaze on
