**REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE
SALE OF LAND.**

In consequence of many urgent applications being made, for the purchase of land in particular localities, and of an erroneous impression which appears to be entertained by the public, that they can always be immediately attended to, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the re-publication, for general information, from the Regulations of 1st March, 1843, of the clause therein, which relates to such applications, namely:—

Applications may be made for land in particular localities.

7th. Persons desirous of obtaining lands in particular localities may make application to have such lands surveyed and brought forward for sale, and their wishes will be complied with as far as circumstances may permit; but much inconvenience to the Government, expense to the Surveyor-General's department, and disappointment to individuals, having been found to result from the Regulations under which parties were led to expect that lands in any part of the Colony within the established Counties, could be surveyed and brought to sale immediately on their applying for them, or within an interval of only a few months, it is to be understood, in future, that the Government does not bind itself to bring forward such lands for sale within any specified period. The applications, in such cases, must be made in the form (A) annexed, and are to be addressed in respect of lands situated in the Middle or Sydney District, to the Surveyor-General at Sydney; and in respect of such as are situated in the Southern or Port Phillip District, to the Senior Surveyor resident at Melbourne.

**RENEWAL OF LEASES OF LAND,

CERTIFICATES OF NATURALIZATION.

THE GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that in pursuance of the 10th section of the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council, 11 Victoria, No. 39, intituled, "An Act to amend the laws relating to Aliens within the Colony of New South Wales," a fee of one pound one shilling has been fixed by His Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council, to be paid by each person to whom a Certificate of Naturalization may be issued, under the provisions of the Act referred to.

2. His Excellency has further directed it to be notified, that any person desirous of obtaining a Certificate of Naturalization, should make application by memorial, in the form hereto annexed, stating in conformity with the

5th section of the Act above-mentioned, the age, profession, trade or other occupation of the memorialist; and the duration of his or her residence in New South Wales, and all other grounds on which he or she seeks to obtain any of the rights and capacities of a natural born British subject within the Colony.

3. Should the Certificate be granted, it will be necessary for the person obtaining it, to have it enrolled in the Supreme Court, as required by the 7th section of the Act; and within sixty days from the date thereof, to take and subscribe before a Judge of the Supreme Court, the oath prescribed in the 8th clause.

4. For more convenient reference, the clauses of the Act which relate to the proceedings to be taken for obtaining the Certificate, are subjoined to the form of memorial annexed to this notice.

5. Persons resident in the District of Port Phillip, should forward their memorials through his Honor the Superintendent.

6.—That your Memorialist therefore respectfully requests that your Excellency may be pleased to grant to your Memorialist a Certificate under the provisions of the said Act, conferring upon your Memorialist the privileges of a Native born British Subject, with such restrictions as to your Excellency may seem meet.

IV. And be it enacted, That upon obtaining the certificate and taking the oath hereinafter prescribed, every Alien now residing in, or who shall hereafter come to reside in, any part of the Colony of New South Wales, with intent to settle therein, shall enjoy all the rights and capacities within the said Colony, which a natural born subject of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland can enjoy or transmit, except that such Alien shall not be capable of becoming a Member of the Executive or Legislative Council of the said Colony, or of enjoying such other rights and capacities, if any, as shall be specially excepted in and by the certificate to be granted in manner hereinafter mentioned.

(Aliens desirous of being naturalized to present a memorial to the Governor.)

V. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for any such Alien as aforesaid to present to the Governor of the said Colony, for the time being, a memorial stating the age, profession, trade, or other occupation of the memorialist, and the duration of his or her residence in New South Wales, and all other grounds on which he or she seeks to obtain any of the rights and capacities of a natural born British subject, within the said Colony, and praying the said Governor to grant to the memorialist the certificate hereinafter mentioned.

(Memorial to be considered by Governor who may grant a certificate.)

VI. And be it enacted, That every such memorial shall be considered by the said Governor, who shall inquire into the circumstances of each case, and receive all such evidence as shall be offered by affidavit or otherwise, as he may deem necessary or proper for proving the truth of the allegations contained in such memorial; and that the said

Governor, if he shall so think fit, may issue a certificate reciting such of the contents of the memorial as he shall consider to be true and material, and granting to the memorialist (upon his or her taking the oath hereinafter prescribed) all the rights and capacities within the said Colony of New South Wales, of a natural born British subject, except the capacity of being a Member of either the Executive or the Legislative Council, and except the rights and capacities (if any) specially excepted in and by such certificate.

(Certificate to be enrolled.)

VII. And be it enacted, That such certificate shall be enrolled for the safe custody as of record, in the Supreme Court of the said Colony, and may be inspected, and copies thereof taken, under such regulations as a Judge or Judges of the said Supreme Court shall direct.

(Oath to be taken.)

VIII. And be it enacted, That within sixty days from the day of the date of such certificate, every memorialist to whom rights and capacities shall be granted by such certificate, shall take and subscribe the following oath, (that is to say):—"I, A. B., do sincerely promise and swear, that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and will defend Her to the utmost of my power against all conspiracies and attempts whatever which may be made against Her Person, Crown, or Dignity: and I will do my utmost endeavour to disclose and make known to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, all treasons and traitorous conspiracies which may be formed against Her and Them; and I do faithfully promise to maintain, support, and defend to the utmost of my power the succession of the Crown, which succession by an Act, intituled, 'An Act for the further limitation of the Crown, and better securing the rights and liberties of the Subject,' is and stands limited to the Princess Sophia, Electress of Hanover, and the Heirs of Her Body, being Protestants, hereby utterly renouncing and abjuring any obedience or allegiance unto any other person claiming or pretending a right to the Crown of this realm.—So help me God!" Which oath shall be taken and subscribed by such memorialist, and shall be duly administered to him or her before any one of the Judges of the Supreme Court of New South Wales; and that the Judge before whom such oath may be administered, shall grant to the memorialist a certificate of his or her having taken and subscribed such oath accordingly; and such certificate shall be signed by the said Judge.

(Certificate.)

IX. And be it enacted, That the several proceedings hereby authorised to be taken for obtaining such certificate as aforesaid, shall be regulated in such manner as the Governor of the said Colony for the time being shall from time to time direct.

(Fees to be fixed by the Governor and Executive Council.)

X. And be it enacted, That the fees payable in respect of the several proceedings hereby authorised, shall be fixed, and regulated by the said Governor with the advice of the Executive Council.

CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

MEASUREMENT AND SUBDIVISION OF RUNS.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified that, in accordance with instructions to that effect received from the Right Honourable the Secretary of State, the expense of the surveys requisite in order to obtain descriptions of the boundaries of Runs for insertion in the Leases thereof, which will be granted by the Governor under the provisions of Her Majesty's Order in Council, of the 9th March, 1847, will be charged upon the applicants for the same.

2. The charge made for the surveys of the boundaries of Runs, will be at an uniform average rate of Two pounds for every mile of linear measurement.

3. A computation will be made of the expense of measuring the boundaries of each Run, according to the description furnished by the Applicant, and the party entitled to claim the lease will be informed of the amount, with a view to the same being paid into the Treasury, which must be done before any order can be given for the Survey. If the payment be delayed for more than three months after notice has been given of the amount, the party will be required to pay any additional expense to which the Government may, in consequence, be subjected.

4. Persons, whose claims to leases under the 11th section of chapter II. of the Order in Council, have been admitted, will be allowed, previously to the issue of the Leases, to subdivide their runs into portions of not less extent than will be sufficient for the maintenance of four thousand sheep, or their equivalent in cattle, and to obtain separate leases for the same, subject to the following conditions:—

(1.) The measurement of the boundary lines shall be made under the direction of the Officers of the Survey Department.

(2.) The Government will reserve to itself the right, in every case, of modifying the boundaries proposed for the subdivision of the Runs, so far as may be necessary to render them conformable to the under-stated rules; and the persons employed in the survey and measurement thereof, will be instructed to adjust and describe the boundaries accordingly.

(3.) Subject to such deviations as the general features of the country—the adoption of natural boundaries, and the share of the Run to be divided may require, every subdivision of a Run must be in a compact block of rectangular form, in which the external lines shall run east and west and north and south.

(4.) The subdivisions must be so made as to secure to each of the reduced Runs a fair and adequate share of the water requisite for the beneficial use of the pasturage.

5. Any person desirous of availing himself of this regulation, must make application to his Honor the Superintendent, at Melbourne; or the Chief Commissioner of Crown Lands in Sydney, describing, in general terms, the manner in which he wishes his Run to be subdivided. On receiving such application, a computation will be made of the probable expense of measuring the boundaries of the several Runs, for which separate leases are desired, and the applicant will be required to pay the amount into the Colonial Treasury before the survey is ordered.
