or to be established, within the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, and in the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, should respectively have power and authority to hear and determine, in a summary way, all actions whatsoever, for the recovery of any debt, demand, or damage, whether liquidated or unliquidated, to an amount not exceeding thirty pounds: Now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said first recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint that Courts of Requests, in and for the Town of Melbourne, and County of Bourke, shall be holden during the year 1850, at the Town of Melbourne, at the times hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—
