At the expiration of *one month* from this date, if no caveat be lodged or other cause of uncertainty appear, a Deed of Grant of each will be executed in favor of the Board of Commissioners for National Education, viz. :—

43. ORANGE, 1, One acre, county of Wellington, parish of Orange, allotments Nos. 2 and 3 of section 41; commencing at the south-west corner of allotment No. 1, and bounded on the north by a line of 5 chains at right angles to Anson-street; on the east by a line of 2 chains parallel to Anson-street; on the south by a line of 5 chains at right angles to Anson-street; and on the west by Anson-street, being a line of 2 chains at right angles to Byng-street.

Authorised as the site for a National School.

44. CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

(RENEWAL OF PASTURAGE LICENSES.)

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified for general information, that the state of the survey not yet admitting of the issue of Leases for Runs beyond the Settled Districts, all existing Licenses for the occupation of Crown Lands so situated, will be renewed on the 1st July next, on the same terms as Licenses have been granted for the now current year, subject of course to the adjustment of the License fee, according to the quantity of Stock returned by the Commissioner as pastured on every such Run.

2. The Licenses must be taken out on or before the 30th day of September next.

3. If within the year commencing on 1st July next, the Governor shall be in a position to grant Leases of Runs under Her Majesty's Order in Council, any Licensee under this Notice, who may obtain a Lease, will receive credit in the payment of his first year's Rent, for so much of the amount paid for his License, as may be proportionate to the unexpired part of the term for which the License was granted.

TEN POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

It is to be understood that the Mails are to be dispatched on the days and hours to be fixed by the Postmaster-General, either according to the present arrangement, or as he may afterwards determine for the public convenience.

It will be optional with parties to offer for one or more of the above lines of stages, and to propose the mode of conveyance; but on all roads where wheel vehicles can travel, a preference will be given to carriage conveyance, and the Contractors will be held strictly bound to use the conveyance they propose, and to travel at the rate agreed upon.

The rate of travelling is not to be less than six miles per hour, including all stoppages. The Contractors are to carry all bags letters and newspapers which may be delivered to them under authority of the Postmaster-General, or any of the Postmasters, and to provide secure lockers for the Mails in carriages and dry coverings for the bags on horseback.

Contractors will be bound to prevent the conveyance of any letter or packet, by any of their servants or passengers, or otherwise to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue, under penalty of £5 for each and every offence.

Contractors will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after the specified time of starting; and to a like penalty for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival, except for the first five or ten minutes respectively.

Contractors will be strictly bound not to assign any portion of their Contract without consent of the Postmaster-General.

A Mail Cart or Carriage, drawn only by one horse, must not carry more than one passenger; by two horses not more than three passengers, and by three or more horses, not more than six passengers, exclusive of the driver, under a penalty of £3 for each offence.

All vehicles and horses employed in the conveyance of Mails are to be at all times subject to the inspection and approval, or rejection of the Postmaster-General, or person appointed by him for that purpose.

The drivers and postmen are to be free men, and of certified good character.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement are to be deducted by the Postmaster-General, from the next quarterly instalment falling

due to the Contractor, and to be considered as over and above any penalties provided by any Act of Council.

Each party tendering or an agent for him must attend at this Office on the day appointed for opening the Tenders; and each Tender must bear the signature of two respectable and solvent persons, engaging to enter into a bond with the Contractor for the safety of the Mails, and the due performance of the Contract, and every stipulation therein.

The hours of starting from each Post Office or stage and other particulars, may be ascertained at the General Post Office, where parties proposing to Tender are invited to seek information.

COMMON LAW RULES.

Certain Rules repealed.

1. On and from the 9th day of September next, the 62nd, 63rd, and 74th, the 93rd, 94th, and 95th, and the 101st of the Rules commonly called the Standing Rules, shall be repealed, together with No. 3 and No. 4 of the Rules made on the 17th June, 1845; and the following Rules commence and take effect.

General Rule of Practice.

2. In all proceedings at law, where no other course of practice shall have been, or shall hereafter be prescribed, by any Rule or Rules in that behalf, the Practice and Forms of the Queen's Bench, (or, in Revenue matters, of the Court of Exchequer,) at Westminster, so far as the circumstances of the Colony shall require and admit, shall be followed in this Court.

Examination of Witness by Commission; or de bene esse. Prac. 188.

3. In all cases where application shall be made to a Judge, under the 4 Vict., No. 22, s. 14, or to the Court or a Judge, under the 5 Vict., No. 9, s. 15, and the Statute 1 W. 4, c. 22, there referred to, the Rule or Order to show cause may be served, at any time before 5 o'clock of the day preceding that on which cause is to be shown; and no ground need be stated in such Rule or Order, otherwise than by reference, simply, to the affidavit or affidavits filed:—of which no copy need be served.

Costs of application. Prac. 187.

4. Where any such application shall be opposed, the costs of the application, and of such opposition, shall be in the discretion of the Court or Judge; but where the application shall be unopposed, or no Order shall be made as to costs, the costs of such application shall be borne by the party applying.

Right of Way. Prac. 168.

5. In every Plea alleging a Right of Way, the direction and course thereof shall be described, by reference to a Chart to be filed with such Plea.

Provision for Remanets.

6. Where any Cause shall remain untried at any Sittings, for want of Jurors or other cause, the same shall be transferred by the Prothonotary, without Fee, to the List of Causes for the First day of the then next Sittings, for Juries of Four or of Twelve, as the case may require; and no new Notice of Trial, or to produce Documents, shall be necessary.—And every such Cause shall then have precedence, notwithstanding that other Causes may already have been set down for those Sittings, unless one of the Judges shall, as to any particular Cause, see fit to order otherwise.

Forms under Absent Defendants' Act. Prac. 108.

7. Every Writ of Foreign Attachment, under the 4 Vict., No. 6, shall be in the Form, or to the effect of the Form, contained in the Schedule hereto; and every Notice of such Writ, to be published under the said Act, and every Bond to be entered into on the issue of such Writ, and every Notice to an absent Co-Partner, under the 15th Section of the said Act, shall be respectively in the Form, contained in the Book of Practice, pages 152 and 153.

Premises in Ejectment. Prac. 160.

8. The 134th Standing Rule shall be amended, by substituting the word "necessary" for the word "received" in the said Rule; and by omitting the words "in the Office of the Chief Clerk."

Entry of Judgment. Prac. 236.

9. Before taking out Execution on any Judgment, the Party shall carry in a Roll of such Judgment; at the foot of which shall be a memorandum, in the Form now used, of the time of signing Final Judgment, under the hand of the Prothonotary, or Clerk in that behalf acting for him.

Jury Motions. Prac. 200. App. 23.

10. Where either of the Parties in a Cause shall desire to have the same tried by a Jury of Twelve persons, he shall within eight days, (or, in Term time, within four days,) after Issue joined, give one clear day's notice of his intention to move, on the then next Motion Day, for such Jury; specifying the Class of Jurors, for which he intends to apply, and referring to the affidavit or affidavits intended to be used, and of which he shall serve a copy with his Notice, for the grounds of such motion.

Carriage of Orders.

11. In all cases, the Party moving the Court, or applying to a Judge in Chambers, shall have the carriage of the Rule or Order, whether in his favor or not. Provided that, where the same shall not have been procured and served, within two days next following, the carriage thereof shall be in his adversary.

General Issue by Statute. Prac. 166.

12. Where the General Issue is pleaded by virtue of any Statute or Act of Council, such Statute or Act, as well as all others, if any, meant to be relied on, shall be noted at the foot of the Plea, or no costs shall be allowed in respect thereof; and the Plaintiff, in case of surprise, shall, without payment of costs, be entitled to a New Trial.

Certain Rules repealed.

13. The Rule respecting the General Issue, made on the 31st August, 1843, and the Standing Rules respecting Foreign Attachment, being Nos. 107 to 112 inclusive, are hereby repealed.

SETTING DOWN AND TRIAL OF CAUSES.

Certain Rules repealed.

1. On and from the 9th day of September next, the 55th, 56th, 58th, 59th, and 66th of the Standing Rules, together with the General Rule of the 31st August, 1843, respecting the setting down of Causes, shall be repealed, and the seven following Rules substituted for the same: Provided, that all matters done or omitted to be done, contrary to any of the said Rules, before this Rule is appointed to take effect, shall be dealt with as if it had not been made.

Setting down Causes for assessment. Prac. 161.

2. After Interlocutory Judgment by default, the Plaintiff may set down his cause for Assessment of Damages, on any day allowed by the Rules for that purpose: Provided that it be set down, four clear days before that day.

Setting down Causes for trial. Prac. 170.

3. After Issue joined, the Plaintiff shall set his Cause down for and proceed to trial, at the then next Sittings for Causes, or, where the Venue is laid at a Circuit Town, at the next Assizes to be there holden, unless Issue shall have been joined within fourteen days, (or, if a Country Cause, within twenty days,) next preceding the first day of such Sittings or Assizes—in either of which cases, the Plaintiff need not bring the cause on to trial, before the Sittings or Assizes next by one ensuing

4. Every Town Cause shall be set down in the Clerk's book eight days, and every Country Cause twelve days, or, if to be tried at an Assize Town, eighteen days before the day of Trial.—And, for all purposes, every Cause shall be deemed a Country Cause, unless the Defendant resided in Sydney at the commencement of the Action, or within forty miles thereof.

Second Trials.

5. After a New Trial ordered, the Plaintiff shall set his Cause down for and proceed to trial, if practicable, at the then next Sittings or Assizes, as the case may require; unless the Court or a Judge, on such terms as may be thought reasonable, shall allow further time in that behalf.

Notice of Trial. Prac. 173.

6. The Defendant in a Town Cause shall have in all cases eight clear days, and in a Country Cause twelve clear days, or, where he resides two hundred miles or upwards from Sydney, twenty clear days' Notice of Trial:—And Short Notice of Trial, where no other meaning is expressed, shall be taken to mean the one-half of that number of days, respectively.

Countermand. Prac. 173.

7. A Countermand of Notice shall not be less, in any case, than would be sufficient for a Short Notice of Trial.

Judgment as in case of nonsuit. Prac. 204.

8. Where the Plaintiff shall fail to set his Cause down for trial, or to bring the same on to trial, as required by these Rules, or pursuant to any Notice given by him, or at the time allowed him in that behalf, if any, by the Court or a Judge, the Court may give Judgment for the Defendant, as in case of Nonsuit.

CRIMINAL JURISDICTION.

(Drawing Special Cases.)

1. Whenever a Special Case shall be reserved, under the Act 13 Vict., No. 8, the presiding Judge or Chairman shall prepare the same, or cause it to be prepared, within eight days after the trial, (or, if at any Circuit Town, within eighteen days after the trial;) and shall cause the same, fairly written, brief wise, and having the hand of such Judge or Chairman thereto subscribed, to be thereupon filed with the Prothonotary.

(Setting down for Hearing.)

2. The Party at whose instance such Special Case was granted shall, within four days then next following, cause the Special Case to be set down for argument, on the first open day; and shall serve a copy thereof, three clear days before the day of Hearing, on Her Majesty's Attorney General, together with notice of such day of Hearing.

No. 100, 23RD AUGUST, 1850.—5.

3. On that day, or such day of adjournment therefrom as the Judges shall appoint, the Case shall be heard in the Court House, in King-street; and the Party at whose instance the Special Case was granted shall begin, but have no right of reply.

Cases reserved Mero Motu.

4. Where a Special case shall have been reserved, without any application in that behalf, the duty of setting down the same for argument, and serving the copy thereof and notice, mentioned respectively in the 2nd Rule, shall devolve on the Judges' Clerks; or, with respect to Cases reserved from any Court of Quarter Sessions, on the Prothonotary.

Special Case Book.

5. The Prothonotary shall supply the Judges' Clerks with a Book, to be kept by them, in which the Chamber Clerk of the week shall enter every Special Case, heard during his week; with the Decision of the Judges thereon, and the Order thereupon finally made.

Criminal Informations.

6. Every Criminal Information granted by the Court, under the 9 Geo. IV., c. 83, s. 6, or otherwise, shall be in the name of the Attorney General; and shall have the following words at the foot thereof,—“By leave of the Supreme Court”—which shall be signed by the Prosecutor's Counsel or Attorney.—And there shall be indorsed on every such Information, the words “On the Prosecution of”—(adding the Prosecutor's name;) which shall be signed by the Prosecutor's Attorney.

Process thereon.

7. The Process on every such Information, in the first instance, after security for costs duly given, shall be a Summons; returnable as a Summons is in an Action:—And, on failure to appear, after personal service thereof, (to be proved by Affidavit,) a Capias; as in the Court of Queen's Bench.

Proceedings thereon.

8. After appearance, the Defendant shall plead or demur within four days; and the like Proceedings shall thereupon be had, up to the Trial, as nearly as may be, as in an Action.—Provided that the Trial shall take place, at the Session of Gaol Delivery at Darlinghurst, on the last day of the Sittings; or at such other time and place as the Court, or one of the Judges, shall appoint.

Costs for not proceeding to Trial.

9. If the Prosecutor shall fail to give due Notice of Trial, or to bring on the case pursuant to such Notice, or at the first available Criminal Session, unless the Court, or a Judge, shall have allowed further time, the Court may on Motion for that purpose, award the Defendant Costs.

Execution for Fines, &c.

10. Every Writ of Execution for the Queen, on any estreated Recognizance, or to levy any Fine, shall be against the person, in the first instance, on the Sheriff's failure to find sufficient property, as well as the against party's lands, moneys, and goods.

Former Rules repealed.

11. After this date, the 113th of the Standing Rules, to the 119th of the same Rules, inclusively, respecting Criminal Informations, are repealed.

Orders and Petitions to be signed.

1. Every Rule or Order, issued by the Master, or Prothonotary respectively, shall be under the Office Seal, and be signed by him. And every Petition shall be dated, and signed by the Petitioner, or his Counsel or Attorney.

Pleadings, &c., how written.

2. All Pleadings, and Matters in writing between Parties, filed or delivered by any Attorney, in any Cause or Proceeding pending in this Court, shall be written in a clear and distinctly legible hand, on foolscap paper, having a reasonably wide margin; and no Pleading or Paper shall be filed, or received by any Officer of the Court, unless so written. Provided that Bills and Answers, in Equity, and Writs and Records, shall be on parchment as at present.

The word Attorney.

3. Whenever, in any Rule of this Court, the word Attorney is used, the same shall be taken to mean equally a Solicitor or Proctor; unless there be something in the context opposed to that construction.—And in like manner, the word Solicitor shall be taken equally to mean a Proctor, or an Attorney.

The term "clear days."

4. Whenever, in any Rule of this Court, the words "clear days" are used, or a certain number of days is specified, with the words "at the least" added, the days shall be reckoned exclusively of Sunday, and of Christmas Day, or Good Friday, when intervening; and exclusively both of the day of Notice, (or Demand, or Summons, as the case may be,) and of the day on which the thing or matter is to be done, or to come on to be heard, (or moved, as the case may be,) but not exclusively of any other days or day.

What days inclusive.

5. In all other cases, a Specified number of days shall be reckoned inclusively of the day of Notice, Demand, or Summons, and exclusively only of the day of performance, hearing, or motion.

Form of Affidavits.

6. Every Affidavit made in this Colony, to be used in any cause or proceeding in the Court, at Law or in Equity, or in its Ecclesiastical or Insolvency jurisdiction, shall commence in the following, or some equivalent form. "On this

"twelfth day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty, James Williams, of (add the place, and degree, calling, or description,) being duly sworn, maketh oath and saith as follows":—after which, the Deponent's statement shall be throughout in the first person.—And the word last, or instant, if occurring in the Affidavit, may be taken in connexion with the date so given.

Form of Jurat.

7. The Jurat of every such Affidavit shall be as follows:—"Sworn by the Deponent," (or, where more than one, by the two Deponents, or by the several Deponents,) "on the day first above mentioned, at (place,) before me, Thomas Grey," adding the words "A Commissioner for Affidavits," where the Affidavit is sworn before any such Commissioner.

Certain Affidavits excepted.

8. Provided that nothing in the two preceding Rules shall alter or affect the Form of Affidavit, attached to the General Rules of the 27th day of June last; or the Oath directed to be made by Parties surrendering their Estates as insolvent.

Proviso for receiving Affidavits.

9. Provided also, that it shall be lawful for the Court, or any Judge, or for the Master in Equity, in proceedings before him, to receive any Affidavit not made in accordance with the said two Rules, where justice shall appear so to require; on such terms, as to costs and otherwise, as to such Court or Judge, or Master, shall seem meet.

Deponent unable to write.

10. In all cases where any deponent shall be unable to write, the Commissioner or Officer administering the oath shall add to the Jurat as follows.—"The Deponent (or A. B. one of the Deponents) having heard the contents read, and appearing to me to understand the same."

Party or Attorney.

11. In every Case where a matter or thing is, by any Rule of this Court, directed or allowed to be done by, or any notice is to be or may be given to, the Party in a Cause or Proceeding, the same may be done by or given to his Attorney, Solicitor, or Proctor; unless there be something in the context, or in the nature of the case, to shew that the party was himself alone intended.

Subjoining or indorsing.

12. Every Memorandum, or Notice, required by any Rule of this Court, in any of its jurisdictions, to be subjoined to any Form, may be indorsed thereon; and, where required to be indorsed, the same may be subjoined.

Certain Rules repealed.

13. The 26th and 27th, and the 31st and 32nd, of the Rules commonly called the Standing Rules, are hereby repealed.
