PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of Her Majesty's Reign, initialed, "An "Act for regulating the sale of Waste Land belong-"my to the Crown in the Australian Colonies;" I do heroby notify and proclaim, that at Eleven o'clock of Thursday, the 5th day of September next, the following Portions of Land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, at the Auction Room of Messrs.
