PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the second year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns respectively, and for removing and preventing nuisances and obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein,*" the provisions of the said Act were, by my Proclamation of the fifth day of November, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, extended to the Town of Wollongong, in the County of Camden; and whereas it was by the said Act amongst other things enacted, that, upon a description of the boundaries of such Town being published in the New South Wales *Government Gazette*, the same should be deemed to be the limits of the said Town: Now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, do hereby direct that the following shall be deemed to be the boundaries of the said Town of Wollongong, for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say:—Commencing at a point where the south side of Stewart-street meets the sea, and bounded on the south by the south

side of Stewart-street, bearing westerly to the west side of Church-street; on the west by the west side of Church-street, bearing northerly to its intersection with Crown-street; again on the south by the south side of Crown-street, bearing westerly to a point in a line with the west side of Keera-street; again on the west by a line across Crown-street to the west side of Keera-street; and thence by the west side of that street, bearing northerly to its intersection with the north side of Smith-street; on the north and thence by a line across Keera-street to the north side of Smith-street, bearing easterly to its intersection with Harbour-street; on the north-west by the north-west side of Harbour-street, bearing north-easterly to the sea; and again on the north and on the east by the sea to the point of commencement.

Given under my hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this tenth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

LAND AND IMMIGRATION DEPOSITS.

WITH reference to the Government notices of the 22nd December, 1848, and 20th March, 1850, headed "Land and Immigration Deposits," and to the 6th clause of the first-mentioned notice, which allows any time within two years for the nomination by Depositors, of Emigrants to be brought to the Colony; His Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it be notified, that, in future the nomination in the Colony of Emigrants to be brought out under the terms and conditions of the notices mentioned, must be made within six months from the date of the Deposit in the Colonial Treasury, of sums intended to be invested in the purchase of Crown Lands, and within twelve months from the date of the deposit if the nomination is to be made by an Agent in England, to the Land and Emigration Commissioners.

STEAM NAVIGATION OF THE RIVER MURRAY.
Extract Minute of the Proceedings of the Legislative Council, at its Session on the 6th June, 1850:—
Moved by Captain Bagot, seconded by the Colonial Secretary, and carried—

That His Excellency be requested to place the sum of £4000 upon the Estimates of 1851, for the purpose of granting a bonus of £2000 each, for the first and second Iron Steamer, of not less than forty-horse power, and not exceeding two feet draft of water when loaded, that shall successfully navigate the waters of the River Murray from the Goolwa to (at least) the junction of the Darling.

NOTICE.

THE Governor and Legislative Council of South Australia having offered a bonus of £4000, to be equally divided between the two first Iron Steamers of not less than forty-horse power, and not exceeding two feet draft of water when loaded, as shall successfully navigate the waters of the River Murray, from the Goolwa to (at least) the junction of the Darling, computed to be about 551 miles; and provision for the said sum of £4000 having been made in the Ordinance, No. 9, of 1850, entitled, "An Ordinance for the Further Appropriation of the Revenue for the year 1850, and for the General Appropriation of the Revenue for the year 1851":

Notice is hereby given, that the above awards will be, severally, claimable in respect of the Two First Vessels which shall, at any time, from and after the 1st day of October, 1851, successfully navigate the Murray under the prescribed conditions.

The following particulars, collected from various sources, respecting the waters of the Murray between the above-named points, are published for general information:—

The great surf that is constantly breaking on the Encounter Bay coast, at the spot where the River Murray discharges itself into the sea, renders the entrance into the river from the sea most dangerous, and indeed impracticable; hence, any steamer intended for the inland navigation must either be built, or put together, on the shores of the River or Lake.

Commencing from the Goolwa, the navigation is through a channel about fourteen miles long, and averaging a mile in width, with a depth of water varying from six to thirty-two feet.

The Goolwa Channel then opens out into Lake Victoria, a sheet of water thirty miles long by ten broad, the navigation across which is twenty-five miles in length, the depth of water varying from six to eighteen feet. Fresh water commences about the middle of this Lake.

The River Murray thence to Moorundee, 121 miles distant, is from 150 to 250 yards wide, and varies from ten feet in depth to fourteen fathoms; to this point there are no obstructions to navigation.

From Moorundee to the Darling, 391 miles distant, sand shoals exist in nearly every reach; but a channel is invariably to be found in which there is three feet of water at the lowest season, which is the month of July.

The annual floods increase the depth of water from eight to twelve feet.

The current varies in strength according to the season, and the distance from the sea, and its rate is from one and a-half to three miles per hour.

Abundance of wood for fuel is to be obtained along the banks of the river generally, throughout its whole length.

Wool, tallow, and hides would, probably, in the first instance form the chief articles of transport.

It is to be understood that the Mails are to be dispatched on the days and hours to be fixed by the Postmaster-General, either according to the present arrangement, or as he may afterwards determine for the public convenience.

It will be optional with parties to offer for one or more of the above lines of stages, and to propose the mode of conveyance; but on all roads where wheel vehicles can travel, a preference will be given to carriage conveyance, and the Contractors will be held strictly bound to use the conveyance they propose, and to travel at the rate agreed upon. The rate of travelling is not to be less than six miles per hour, including all stoppages. The Contractors are to carry all bags letters and newspapers which may be delivered to them under authority of the Postmaster-General, or any of the Postmasters, and to provide secure lockers for the Mails in carriages and dry coverings for the bags on horseback.

Contractors will be bound to prevent the conveyance of any letter or packet, by any of their servants or passengers, or otherwise to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue, under penalty of £5 for each and every offence.

Contractors will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after the specified time of starting; and to a like penalty for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival, except for the first five or ten minutes respectively.

Contractors will be strictly bound not to assign any portion of their Contract without consent of the Postmaster-General.

A Mail Cart or Carriage, drawn only by one horse, must not carry more than one passenger; by two horses not more than three passengers, and by three or more horses, not more than six passengers, exclusive of the driver, under a penalty of £3 for each offence.

All vehicles and horses employed in the conveyance of Mails are to be at all times subject to the inspection and approval, or rejection of the Postmaster-General, or person appointed by him for that purpose.

The drivers and postmen are to be free men, and of certified good character.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement are to be deducted by the Postmaster-General, from the next quarterly instalment falling due to the Contractor, and to be considered as over and above any penalties provided by any Act of Council.

Each party tendering or an agent for him must attend at this Office on the day appointed for opening the Tenders; and each Tender must bear the signature of two respectable and solvent persons, engaging to enter into a bond with the Contractor for the safety of the Mails, and the due performance of the Contract, and every stipulation therein.

The hours of starting from each Post Office or stage and other particulars, may be ascertained at the General Post Office, where parties proposing to Tender are invited to seek information.
