**CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED  
DISTRICTS.**

(RENEWAL OF PASTURAGE LICENSES.)

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified for general information, that the state of the survey not yet admitting of the issue of Leases for Runs beyond the Settled Districts, all existing Licenses for the occupation of Crown Lands so situated, will be renewed on the 1st July next, on the same terms as Licenses have been granted for the now current year, subject of course to the adjustment of the License fee, according to the quantity of Stock returned by the Commissioner as pastured on every such Run.

2. The Licenses must be taken out on or before the 30th day of September next.

3. If within the year commencing on 1st July next, the Governor shall be in a position to grant Leases of Runs under Her Majesty's Order in Council, any Licensee under this Notice, who may obtain a Lease, will receive credit in the payment of his first year's Rent, for so much of the amount paid for his License, as may be proportionate to the unexpired part of the term for which the License was granted.

**JETTY.—PORTLAND.**

**T**HE following Rules for the Regulation of the Jetty at Portland, Port Phillip, having been made by the Justices of the Peace, acting in and for Portland, and approved by His Excellency the Governor, in terms of the Act of Council 5 William IV, No. 13, are published for general information.

**RULES and REGULATIONS for the maintenance of good order on the Jetty at Portland, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 5th William IV, No. 13.**

- 1.—No Vessel of above twenty-five tons burden to be allowed to come alongside of the Jetty, nor vessels of that or less tonnage, unless for the purpose of taking in or discharging cargo.
- 2.—No Vessel to lay alongside of the Jetty between the hours of sunset and sunrise.
- 3.—Vessels first coming alongside of the Jetty, to have precedence in discharging or taking in cargo.
- 4.—No nuisance to be committed, or rubbish or filth landed on the Jetty.
- 5.—Boats are not to be stationed at the Jetty, but only to be there for temporary purposes.
- 6.—Goods or timber landed on the Jetty to be removed within twenty-four hours.
- 7.—One truck to be kept on each Tramway. Under no circumstances are both trucks to be used on the same Tramway.
- 8.—Three tons weight to be the maximum load for each truck.
- 9.—No person to be permitted to use the trucks or cranes unless for the purpose of loading or discharging Vessels.
- 10.—No ballast, timber, or other articles for, or from any Vessels in the harbour to be kept on the approach to the Jetty for a longer period than twenty-four hours.
- 11.—No carts to remain on the approach to the Jetty for a longer time than is absolutely necessary for loading or discharging.

Any person committing a violation of any of the above Regulations, shall forfeit for every such offence any sum not exceeding twenty shillings, at the discretion of the presiding Justice or Justices.

When required, 8oz. wheat bread may be substituted in lieu of vegetables, and 8oz. of oatmeal in lieu of meat.

One half of the above quantities to Children of Immigrants, under 14 years of age.

2. The Ration to Prisoners on Cockatoo Island, to Wardsmen in Gaol, to Prisoners detained as Witnesses or for want of bail, and to Others in the employment of Colonial Departments, when authorised to receive it:—

1 oz. sugar

this Ration is occasionally issued at Watchhouses to Prisoners of the Crown, when travelling from one station to another, and in other cases when sanctioned by a Magistrate.

6. For the use of the Establishment:— $1\frac{3}{4}$  pint oil,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  pint of vinegar.

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7. Milk and vegetables for the Children, best wheat bread, flour, tea, sugar, salt, pearl barley, rice, oatmeal, arrowroot, sago, yeast, lard, common oil, dipt candles, soap, port wine, vinegar, straw, and firewood, as required.

For children under 7 years of age.—Best wheat bread is to be substituted, if required, in the proportion of 8oz. of bread for 12oz. of flour.
