By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hauoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS the Legislative Council of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the twelfth day of February next, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charies Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested, as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the twenty-sixth day of March now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this twenty-fourth day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and in the thirteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
