By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Order of the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, dated the fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty, Port Melbourne, in the District of Port Phillip, was, from and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty, declared to be a free Warehousing Port: And whereas it is expedient to establish a Port of Entry and Clearance at Port Albert, within the limits of the Port of Melbourne, as defined by the 56th section of the Act of Council, 9th Victoria, No. 15: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, in virtue of the authority in me vested in that behalf, do hereby order and direct that Port Albert, in the said District of Port Phillip, shall be, and the same is hereby declared and established as a Port of Entry and Clearance, within the limits of the said Port of Melbourne.

Given under my hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this nineteenth day of October, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

GRANT OF LAND FOR A NATIONAL SCHOOL.

THE description of the following portion of Land, which has been granted as the site for a National School, is published for general information, in order that the parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

At the expiration of *one month* from this date, if no caveat be lodged or other cause of uncertainty appear, a Deed of Grant thereof, will be executed in favor of the Board of Commissioners for National Education, viz. :—

48. MOONEE PONDS, 1, One acre, county of Bourke, parish of Dousta Galla, part of section 14, commencing at a point bearing south 35 degrees 15 minutes, east 8 chains 80 links, from the centre of the bridge over the Five Mile Creek; and bounded on the north by a line bearing east 5 chains; on the east by a line bearing south 2 chains; on the south by a line bearing west 5 chains; and on the west by a line bearing north 2 chains.

THE GREAT NORTH ROAD.**
