#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ
Rov, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and
Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New
South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled," An Act to con-" solidate and amend the laws relating to Courts " of Requests, and to extend the jurisdiction of such " Courts, in the County of Cumberland," it was amongst other things enacted, That from and after the first day of January, 1843, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for such Counties and Districts, or other portions of this Colony and its Dependencies, and at such places respectively, as the Governor should by Proclamation for that purpose from time to time appoint: And whereas by another Act passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her said Majesty, intituled, "An Act to " amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests in " the City of Sydney, and County of Cumberland, "and in the Town of Melbourne, and County of "Bourke respectively," it was enacted, that all Courts of Requests established, or to be established within the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, and in the Town (now City) of Melbourne and County of Bourke, should respectively have power and authority to hear and determine, in a summary way, all actions whatsoever, for the recovery of any debt, demand, or damage, whether liquidated or unliquidated, to an amount not exceeding thirty pounds : Now, I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said first recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint that Courts of

Requests, in and for the City of Melbourne and County of Bourke, shall be holden, during the year 1851, at the City of Melbourne, at the times hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

The "Ordinary Sittings" of the Court of Requests, for the trial of all cases not exceeding ten pounds, for the City of Melbourne, and County of Bourke, shall be holden at the Court House, Melbourne, on the following days, and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day as may be found necessary, namely:—Monday, 3rd February; Thursday, 20th March; Monday, 21st April; Monday, 19th May; Thursday, 12th June; Monday, 21st July; Monday, 18th August; Monday, 22nd September; Monday, 13th October; Thursday, 20th November; Monday, 15th December.

The "New Sittings" of the Court of Requests for the City of Melbourne and County of Bourke, for the trial of all cases from ten to thirty pounds, shall commence and be holden at the Court House, Melbourne, on the following days, and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day, as may be found necessary viz.—Thursday, 6th February; Thursday, 24th April; Monday, 16th June; Thursday, 21st August; Thursday, 16th October; Thursday, 18th December.

ROADS AND BRIDGES BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

HE sum of One thousand five hundred pounds having been provided by the Legislative Council "for the formation of Roads and Bridges beyond the Settled Districts" of the Sydney or Middle District of the Colony, during the year 1851; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that applications for the formation of such roads and bridges, so far as provided for by the above amount, should, on or before the 1st February next, be submitted for the consideration of the Government, through the Magistrates of the District willing to superintend the execution of the work, with the assistance of other gentlemen in the neighbourhood.

THE Sum of Three thousand pounds having been provided by the Legislative Council "for "making and repairing Public Roads and Bridges," on which Tolls are not collected within the Settled "Districts in the Sydney District," during the year 1851; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that applications for the making or repair of Roads, &c., so far as provided for by the above amount, should, on or before the 1st February next, be submitted for the consideration of the Government, through the Wardens or Magistrates of the Districts willing to superintend the work, with the assistance of other gentlemen in the neighbourhood.

A LL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

2. The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of Public Monies will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each may be credited in the accounts of the year within which it was received.

3. The Heads of Departments and other Officers who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December to pay into the Colonial Treasury the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to the 30th proximo.

4. They will also, as soon as practicable after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

5. The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith on the part of the Government Officers concerned.
