GRANTS OF LAND FOR NATIONAL SCHOOLS.

THE descriptions of the following portions of Land, which have been granted as the sites for National Schools, are published for general information, in order that the parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

At the expiration of *one month* from this date, if no caveat be lodged or other cause of uncertainty appear, a Deed of Grant of each will be executed in favor of the Board of Commissioners for National Education, viz. :—

49. BENALLA, 1, One acre, county unnamed, parish of Benalla, Town of Benalla, allotments Nos.

4 and 5 of section K; commencing at the south-east corner of allotment No. 3, and bounded on the north by that allotment, bearing north 64 degrees, east 500 links; on the east by Arundel-street, bearing south 26 degrees, east 200 links; on the south by allotment No. 6, bearing south 40 degrees, west 500 links; and on the west by a line bearing north 26 degrees, west 200 links.

50. WARRNAMBOOL, 2r., Two roods, county of Villiers, parish of Warrnambool, Town of Warrnambool, allotment No. 11 of section 6; commencing at the north-west corner of the section, and bounded on the west by Banyan-street, bearing south 22 degrees, west 250 links; on the south by allotment No. 12, being a line bearing south 68 degrees, east 200 links; on the east by part of allotment No. 10, being a line bearing north 22 degrees, east 250 links; and on the north by Timor-street, bearing north 68 degrees, west 200 links.

ROADS.

ROAD.

WITH reference to the Government Notice of the 18th November, 1840, relative to the intention of the Government to open a parish road from Melbourne to Kalkallo; notice is hereby given, in conformity with the Act of Council 4th William IV., No. 11, intituled, "*An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof,*" that no objections to the proposed line of road having been made in pursuance of the said notice, and in conformity with the said Act, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to confirm the said Road, and it is therefore hereby declared expedient to open and make the road referred to, according to the map or plan thereof, to be seen at the Office of the Surveyor General in Sydney, and of the Surveyor in charge at Melbourne; and all persons intending to claim compensation in respect of the said line, are hereby reminded that notice must be served upon the Colonial Secretary, within forty days from the date hereof, in such manner and forms as are provided by the sixth and thirty-second sections of the Act above referred to, or they will for ever be foreclosed from such claim.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

2. The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of Public Monies will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each may be credited in the accounts of the year within which it was received.

3. The Heads of Departments and other Officers who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December to pay into the Colonial Treasury the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to the 31st proximo.

4. They will also, as soon as practicable after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

5. The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith on the part of the Government Officers concerned.
