MERCHANT SEAMEN.

Is Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, having deemed it expedient to open and make Parish Roads, to be maintained at the expense of the Parishes through which they pass, from Newcastle and Maitland towards Brisbane Water, and as far as the crossing place at Dora Creek, as hereunder described, viz:—The Newcastle branch commencing at a gum tree marked on four sides; on the south side of the Newcastle and Maitland Road about 1 mile from Newcastle, and 19 chains 55 links from southwest corner of Furlong's (now Dangar's) 20 acre paddock, in a line bearing east 9 degrees, 30 minutes south, the road traverses for about 1 mile in a

south-west and north-west direction a heavy sandy flat, covered with low tea tree and honeysuckle scrub; it continues in a north-west direction over a low ridge, and leaves the Company's 2,000 acres about 60 chains from the south-west corner pin; the line there crosses for 1 mile a hard sound swamp, called "The Meadows," in a north-west west direction, when it bears almost due west for about 3 miles over some sound undulating ridges, crosses Dark Creek twice and enters J. Weller's 2,560 acres, 10 chains from the north-east corner pin, which it leaves to enter J. B. Weller's 320 acres, 11 chains 50 links west of the same pin, (which land it passes through over some low sandy ridges and leaves to enter G. Brooks' 300 acres, about 6 chains from north-west corner pin); the line there makes a circuit towards the south to avoid some bad swampy ground, and leaves G. Brooks'
14 chains north of his south-west pin to enter Mrs. Brooks' 1,280 acres, which it passes through in a south-west direction rising a steep ridge, and enters Mezier's 560 acres, about 10 chains east of his north-west pin, and leaves about 30 chains south of same pin; thence the line continues in a southwest direction along a high leading ridge for about 23 miles, when it drops to a main branch of Cockle Creek, which it crosses and takes a nearly westerly direction for about 2 miles over some good level country and hard undulating ridges, when it bears to the south-west (still traversing a good country) and joins the Maitland branch at Sandy Creek, which creek it crosses to enter Mr. Ranclaud's 2,560 acres, about 1 mile south of Bucknell's 2,560 acres, leaves Trialba House about 10 chains

to the westward, drops on to Diega Flat, and leaves Ranclaud's 45 chains east of his southwest corner pin; the line continues up Diega Flat for about $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile, when it bears to the south-west for about 8 miles to old station at Coorembong, passing over some steep ranges and a few small creeks (a very fair line of road) from Coorembong the line continues in a south-west direction for about 3 miles over an apple tree flat, crosses a few dry creeks, and enters Campbell's 1,500 acres, when it rises and continues along a good sound leading ridge till it drops to the crossing place at Dora Creek about 16 chains south of the northern boundary line of P. Simpson's 2,000 acres.

The Maitland branch commencing at a stringy bark marked on four sides, near crossing at Sandy Creek, and at the junction of Newcastle branch the road takes a northerly direction for about 13 miles over a good level country crossing Flagging Creek, it there rises and continues along a steep ridge in a north-east direction for about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles, when it drops to Minmi, entering Mr. S. W. Scott's 1,180 acres about half way between south-west and south-east corner pins, (the road over the steep ridge is very good;) at Minmi it leaves the usual track to avoid swamps, taking an old road over the ridges till it joins the usual track again about 1 mile forward which it continues along, and again leaves about 1 mile further on, winds along a leading ridge, enters Moorehouse's 100 acres, 4 chains south of his north west pin, and enters J. Sparke's 640 acres, about 8 chains east of same pin, crosses an arm of Hexham Swamp (5 chains), on to a good buch track, hugs the high ground, and leaves Sparke's to enter Malcomb's 640 acres, about 30 chains south of Sparke's northeast corner pin, on which land it unites again with the usual track, (by the detour the road crosses, but 5 chains instead of nearly 1 mile of bad swamp) and enters Bradridge's 500 acres, 12 chains east of Sparke's north-east pin and Walker's 1,280 acres, 28 chains north of the same pin, traversing Walker's land it enters the Village Reserve at Boardman's Flat about 32 chains west of Walker's north-east pin, passes through the reserve, and enters Cummin's 1,000 acres, 33 chains east of his south-west pin, where it joins the Newcastle and Maitland Road at Skinner's Waterhole, about 51 miles from Maitland, an apple tree marked on four sides on the south side of the main road, the entire line of road from swamp excellent; notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 4th William IV, No. 11, intituled, " An Act for making, altering, and im-" proving the Roads throughout the Colony of New "South Wales, and for opening and improving the " Streets in the Towns thereof," a survey or tracing, shewing the intended line of the said road, is now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General, and all persons interested therein, are requested to transmit in writing to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well grounded objection which may exist to the formation of the said road.
